


in God because of all the problems and evil in the world, from sin and its effects to natural disasters. How can an all-good God, an all loving God, an all-powerful, and all-knowing God allow a world like this to exist? Couldn't he make a better one? If we are honest, the thought is also there - I can imagine that there has to be something better - a world where people get along better, where we know what is right, wrong, truth, lie, and where fires, accidents, floods and disasters don't kill people. Why can't the world be more like that - if a movie producer can show a better world, why can't God make one for real? As Creator, doesn't God have a responsibility to take care of the problems in this world of His? If God is all-powerful and all-knowing, why doesn't He stop the evil, suffering, and death? It doesn't look like God cares, much less that he is the source of Love.

There are reasons/explanations intellectually to understand the big Why questions but they do not prove there is not other option, these 'answers' don't force us to believe or accept them. Similarly, there are also practical explanations that we can identify with from our experiences in life. I don't have time to address them here this weekend, so I want to share one aspect of our response to love as human beings, Christians, and as Catholics... As you see in the box to the right, our Christmas weekend schedule is very different this year. We will celebrate one Mass each day. As human beings, we sicken and die without love - spiritually, emotionally, and even some physical connections. As *Christians* we have God's command to love God (above all else) and neighbor (parable of the Good Samaritan). This love cannot be words alone but also lived, acting to/for our neighbor and God himself. As Catholics, we have an obligation given by God through His Church to practice the spiritual and corporal works of mercy (love of neighbor) and to gather and worship God (keep Holy the (Sabbath) now the "Lord's Day" and a few other major feasts). So strengthen your faith and love for God and your neighbor and join us at 2 or all 3 of these Masses to celebrate God's love and presence among us in the Feast


