




God is Doing New Things (Even with Old Things)


The Holy Spirit is always making old things new - especially weary old souls under the burden of sin, transformed to be like Jesus, washed new in baptism and the grace of repentance and conversion. The Holy Spirit is ever ancient and ever new. The One, Holy, Catholic and Apostolic Church is ancient (~2000 years) and new in every age and nation. Our Faith is built on the Apostles and constantly growing and being renewed through the centuries. On this feast of Pentecost, I give thanks for the Holy Spirit living in me. Invite the Holy Spirit to renew you. I'm hosting Firepits again this month with drinks, snacks,

and Q&A. Join us this month. Bring a topic for discussion. The "kindling" question this week is related to Trinity Sunday, "How can we really know God? How can we trust what anyone, including the Church, tells us about God? How can we be sure? What do you know of God? What has God revealed?"

At the Diocesan level, there are two new concurrent events beginning this month. See the box below for an explanation. Synods and Revivals haven't been present in our Diocese in recent decades, yet the Diocese of Bismarck just held a synod a few years ago. They happen regularly throughout the country and the world. The Charismatic Movement in the Church brought about a Revival a few decades ago throughout the world and Eucharistic preaching has always been encouraged in the life of the Church. But the two events coinciding in our Diocese for these next two years is an opportunity to truly grow with God and in the practice, that is living out, the fullness of the Catholic faith. Make it a regular topic for reading, study, and prayer. We the clergy will also preach on Jesus in the Eucharist more frequently these next two years.

If you have questions or even doubt Jesus Real Presence, I invite you to pray from Scripture, "[Lord] I believe, help my unbelief." (Mark 9:24) Many people struggle to see God in our broken world and yet the Eucharist brings many who seek God into an encounter with Him in the quiet and stillness of Adoration as well as in a beautiful and prayerful celebration of the Sunday (or daily) Eucharist. Read the Scriptures or join a Bible study to see how God prepared the world for the gift of the Eucharist through the Manna, Passover, Multiplication of the Loaves and The Bread of Life... Visit a website that displays dozens of Eucharistic miracles. Discover two each month at miracolieucaistici.org

Diocesan Synod & Eucharistic Revival

What is a Diocesan Synod?

A diocesan synod is a group of selected priests and other

members of the Christian faithful of a particular church who offer assistance to the diocesan bishop for the good of the whole diocesan community, according to the norms of canon law. (460)

What is the Process and Purpose of a Diocesan Synod?

During the synodal process, after prayer and listening to the faithful, the bishop, consulting with his priests, proposes questions to chosen representatives, who are the members of the Synod. The members are to freely discuss those questions at the sessions. The members of the synod provide consultation. The diocesan bishop is the only authority competent to make policies and laws as a result of the discussions. Learn more at

I ask you to pray for me to be a holy disciple and shepherd all the days of my life. St Anthony of Padua and Sts Peter & Paul pray for us.

Thu, 23rd 6-8:30 pm @ Mantador Fire Hall - stop in for a visit, light social.


Some details of these events may change. They will be sent out via email and text to everyone in our parish database.
