

From the beginning, sharing the Good News of Jesus' triumph over sin & death has been a collaborative effort be-


tween men AND women.

Synod Update.

Weds, Apr 12, synod teams from the U.S. and Canada released the North American Final Document for the Continental



Stage. A print copy is available in each of our parishes for you to look at, only 22pp.

It is the fruit of 931 delegates mtg 12 times over Zoom. Then an 18-person team of bishops, priests and lay people identified certain recommendations. For instance:

- 1. Forming local Churches in continued synodal consultation and the spirituality of discernment. [We need to learn how to act 'synodally'; our people need to learn how to listen to the Spirit at work in themselves and others.]
- 2. Welcoming those who feel excluded from participation in the life of the Church in a manner that is authentic and faithful to the Gospel and the Catholic faith. [People need to know that the Catholic Church is open to all.]
- 3. Co-responsibility for mission. [This means shared authority, bringing clericalism to an end, opening possibilities for lay women and men to participate in the Church's decision making.]

If we are going to be people of dialogue, we have to first have a dialogue with God...

Lots of good news here! The Synod is something we learn by doing. The Bishops Conferences in the U.S. and Canada are learning. They're listening to smaller discernment groups and seeking feedback. The bishops acknowledge that they "can and must do better in consulting those who are poor, migrant communities, Indigenous peoples, and racial minorities in our communities, and the many others who are wounded in the Church and in society." They admitted to being as uncertain as many lay people about where this synodal process may be taking us, needing as much formation as any other Catholics in the spirituality and skills of synodality, and resolving to trust in the Holy Spirit. "We need to do more with our people - listen to them more to aid our discernment; sit down with them and discuss the religious life in the diocese. We cannot just sit in the office and make important decisions by ourselves."

Second, the People of God desire more synod. Wounds of violated trust and exclusion at the hands of the Church itself are deep and can be healed through intentional encounters of loving affirmation and inclusion in the tent of God's holy people. Our baptism gives us equal stake in the responsibility for the Church's mission in a world that needs it more

than ever. Our young people are "the now" of the Church and want to be in the mix, including at global gatherings of bishops in Rome. And while it is women who keep the church "alive and healthy," they remain a marginalized group within it, a reality that can be remedied by acknowledging the "baptismal dignity" of women and continuing "the examination of a variety of aspects of Church life, including decision making roles, leadership, and ordination."

These recommendations are permission slips to keep walking the synodal path with confidence and courage!
