 ◆ terrible plague called the Black Death; nearly half of Europe's population perished.

◆ So, the French dressed up on All Souls, not Halloween; and the Irish, who had Halloween, did not dress up.
 ◆ How did the two come together?

◆ Probably in the British colonies of North America
 ◆ during the 1700s. Irish and French Catholics began to intermarry. The Irish fascination with ghosts mingled with the French tradition of masquerades.

"Trick or treat" arose in the American tradition by

way of English Catholics and celebrations of Guy Fawkes Day (story for another day).

This mix of immigrant traditions became *Hallow'een* in the U.S. by the early 1800s. They say it's unknown in Europe, but when I lived in Rome Halloween stuff was for sale in the big grocery stores. Thanks to commercialism, their own traditions have come back *to haunt them*.

ALL HALLOWS EVE. The origins of Halloween are very Christian, and also rather American. Halloween falls on October 31 because an 8th century pope, Gregory III, created a feast for All the Saints on Nov 1. **See Mass times above!**

Two centuries after the beginning of the All Saints Feast, a French monastery began celebrating All Souls. The custom spread. In Ireland, on the vigil of All Saints (All Hallows' Eve), believers took to clanging pots and pans to scare away evil spirits, a carry-over from times of the Druids; people wore masks and lit bonfires. The custom of dressing in costumes for All Souls

I also proposed a simple charter of the Holy Family Society for their review. Synod in Rome, part I concludes this Sun, Oct 29. The outcome of this Synod will be provisional, contained in a synthesis report that's being drafted and amended as I write. Most agree, the biggest win is not the 'product' but the 'process'.

One interesting observation is the truth and the symbol of the round table. Each round table sits 12 disciples. Everyone has equal time to speak. At the end of each of the three modules of the synod, the documents reflect as much of the voice of layperson "X" as it does of bishop "Y." this means that Bishop "Y" has, perhaps for the first time in his life, been made to listen without immediately responding and without the expectation that he will have the final say. Layperson "X" is not looking for bishop "Y's" approval or decision. Around these tables in the synod hall, all voices have the same authority and equal value. They decide together.

It's already being said, and by the Pope himself, that this is a model for the whole Church, down to every parish.

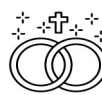
