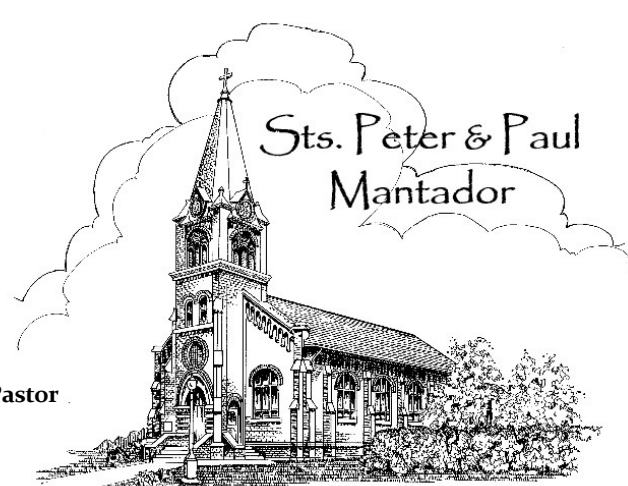

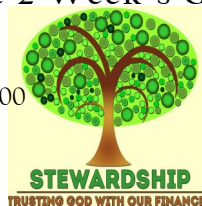

**TRANSITION.** Fr. Paul Kuhn, beloved associate at St. John's, Wahpeton, will be coming to be the new pastor on June 25. Bishop Folda has given me permission to minister in the Diocese of Lexington, Kentucky for 3 yrs on an experimental basis. If at the end of that time and things are going well, the move will become permanent. If it's not so smooth, Bishop said he'd welcome me back with open arms. That was good to hear.

I came to the Diocese of Fargo after 6 years of discerning a vocation to a religious order. I responded to Bishop Sullivan's call from a missionary Spark within me. After 30 yrs of being associated with the Diocese of Fargo, this same Spark is urging me to ministry in Appalachia. Of course, it is a big plus to be only a few hrs away from family (Mom is 84, Dad is 88), as well as siblings and extended family.

Pope Francis quoted St Therese the Little Flower in his encyclical on the Sacred Heart of Jesus: *"I wanted to give my Beloved to drink and I felt myself consumed with a thirst for souls." That is your mission as well. Each of us must carry it out in his or her own way; you will come to see how you can be a missionary. Jesus deserves no less. If you accept the challenge, he will enlighten you, accompany you and strengthen you, and you will have an enriching experience that will bring you much happiness.* Francis assures us—Jesus is faithful to his promise: **"I am with you always, to the end of the age."** Mt 28:20

Some of us are called to send down deep roots and be 'home' for a certain group of people, while others are given that missionary impulse to share far and wide the flames of Jesus' Heart. Whatever our call, Jesus is at our side.

I will not be serving as a parish priest in Kentucky, although I will be helping with Mass and Confessions at the Cathedral of Christ the King. The bishop of Lexington has asked me to create a Lay Ministry Formation program for the entire diocese. This will mean lots of travel getting to know the pastors and people of the various regions, reading Church documents, and building something practical so that people can discover their gifts and put them to work for others.

As the Church becomes more synodal—journeying together, being Church in a way that includes everyone—we need to be formed on how to be attentive listeners, close to the people, especially those who suffer. Our new pope, Leo XIV, envisions a Church open to all, creating a welcoming and inclusive environment where everyone feels valued and included. He wants us to join him in building bridges where there is division. Bridge building is tough work.

It's a big challenge. Please pray for me. I pray for you and thank you for all the love you've shown me in our three years together. I pray we've been fuel for one another's hearts in Christ. One more bulletin left for farewells....
