

## **Eucharistic Adoration**

Wednesday, September 3<sup>rd</sup> Eucharistic Adoration will begin at St. Anthony in Mooreton. Eucharistic Adoration begins immediately at the end of daily Mass, roughly around 9:00a.m. with exposition and conclude with the Divine Mercy Chaplet and reposition of the Blessed Sacrament at 3:00p.m. A sign up sheet will be available at the end of Mass throughout the month of September. Signing up helps assure that we have minimum 1-2 adorers an hour but it is not required to sign up. What is Eucharistic Adoration and why is it important?

The importance of Eucharistic Adoration is shown in the fact that the Church has a ritual that regulates it: the Order of Eucharistic Exposition and Benediction. This is an extension of the adoration of the Blessed Sacrament which occurs in every Mass: "Behold the Lamb of God, behold him who takes away the sins of the world. Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb." Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament flows from the sacrifice of the Mass and serves to deepen our hunger for communion with Christ and the rest of the Church. The Rite concludes with the ordained minister blessing the faithful with the Blessed Sacrament.







## St. Paul's Corner

My child, conduct your affairs with humility. All of the readings this weekend emphasize the virtue of humility and the importance of humbling oneself as a Christian. Why do Christians need to grow in the virtue of humility and humble themselves? Because Jesus Christ embodies the virtue of humility and humbled himself becoming human like us in every way except sin.

Jesus went to dine at the home of one of the leading pharisees, and the people were observing him carefully. Why would Jesus dine with an individual who is part of a group that is seeking to find reason to condemn and kill him? Everything he does is always with salvation in mind for every person he encounters even the Pharisees. Aware that those he was dining with were observing him carefully he addresses this parable to them because they were more focused were choosing places of honor and inviting and associating with those who they were comfortable with at a meal.

Jesus corrects the pharisees reminding them that everyone who exalts themselves will be humbled, but the one who humbles himself will be exalted. Speaking to the host Jesus reminds him who to invite and not invite; and where to even sit. Those who humble themselves will be repaid at the resurrection of the righteous. The pharisees were often living from a posture of arrogance and a self-righteous attitude thinking themselves better than other people. What is humility?

St. Thomas Aquinas teaches that humility is a virtue. The virtue of humility allows us to know who we and whose we are in relationship to God. It allows us to recognize that which is Gods and that which is mans. Humility is the virtue that counteracts the sin of pride. Many people, Christians and non-Christians, leaders or followers, can struggle with the pride of arrogance and self-righteousness. The seek to bolster their own image in the eyes of the public or people while ignoring and neglecting the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind. St. Paul reminds us in the letter to the Philippians 2:3, "In humility, let each esteem others better than themselves."

Many of the greatest saints who longed to follow Jesus Christ knew of the importance of humility. The quickest and surest path to holiness is humility, humility, humility because it roots out pride. St. Mary of Bethlehem once said, "In Heaven there are many faults but there can be no pride; in Hell there are many virtues but there can be no humility." Let us seek to conduct our daily affairs from a posture of humility.
