


Holy Hour for Life with Bishop Folda Sunday, October 5th after noon Mass at St. Mary's Cathedral.



SAPPs Religious Education Sticking with Jesus into Eternity

- Religious Education nights are comprised of three movements:
 - **Piety or Prayer:** Central to the life of any Christian is our relationship with God—Father, Son and Holy Spirit; The Blessed Virgin Mary, angels and all the saints. Prayer is about our search for God but also understanding God always takes the first initiative in seeking each out after each of us awaiting our response back to Him. How have we encountered God's love this past week or month? Have we loved God in return? How have we lived out the first great commandment You shall Love the Lord your God with all your heart, mind, soul and strength?
 - **Study:** Knowing and Loving God go hand-in-hand. We need to study the faith, praying for understanding, knowledge, wisdom, and counsel. It's ok to not know and understand everything that the Church teaches but that we are seeking those answers and truth with humility.
 - **Action:** The second great commandant—You shall love your neighbor as yourself. How have we served out neighbor in the past week or month? Ask our students about the coin war we held on Wednesday, October 1st.

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St. Paul's Corner

Faith comes through what is heard and what is heard comes through the preaching of Jesus Christ!

Why do the Apostles begin by asking Jesus for an increase of faith? In order to answer this question we need to look at the first four verses of the Gospel that we did not hear proclaimed:

“And he said to his disciples, “Temptations to sin are sure to come! It would be better for him if a millstone were hung round his neck and he were cast into the sea, than that he should cause one of these little ones to sin. Take heed to yourselves; if your brother sins, rebuke him, and if he repents, forgive him; and if he sins against you seven times in the day, and turns to you seven times, and says ‘I repent,’ you must forgive him.” Jesus’ analogy of tying a millstone around one’s neck would have struck their attention, as it was a large circular stone, used for crushing wheat and nearly impossible to literally tie around one’s neck.

The Apostles acknowledge that facing temptations to sin, repentance, and forgiveness are not easy. The Apostles need faith, as each of us do. Faith allows us to believe the God’s grace is sufficient for each of us the more we surrender ourselves over to Him. Faith strengthens us to overcome temptations. Faith strengthens us to believe that we can repent and amend our life. Faith is the key that unlocks forgiveness where as unforgiveness locks us into unbelief. God shows us that with faith in Him all things truly are possible.

What does it mean to be a servant? Jesus teaches us that true and genuine servants, serve with out counting the cost. The master is wrapped up in his own ego, selfishness, entitlement. He can be demanding and lacks gratitude. Jesus calls his disciples and apostles to remain little, humble, and hidden. At times acknowledging their own unworthiness and, out of obedience, doing what was asked of them.

Obedience is a preeminent virtue in the life of any Christian. Jesus himself was obedient even to the point of death, death on a cross. What is obedience? The root word in Latin ‘obed’ means, to hear. Jesus emphasizes the importance of both hearing and doing (Faith and Works). There are those who hear the Word of God, but do not act on it. Obedience and faith are intricately connected. The Blessed Virgin Mary shows us by her obedience and faith she brought forth the Incarnate Word of God, Jesus Christ, into this world. At the same time, we know that being obedient and having faith is not always easy.

God is always listening to us. The greater question is are we listening to Him? When our prayers are not answered we can become disappointed, rash, impatient, accusing and blaming God as if He is not listening. On the contrary, very often it is us not listening to Him because of our disobedience, hard heartedness, and unbelief. Which is why praying for obedience and faith daily is necessary in the Christian life.
