## Scripture & Prayer



## St. Paul's Corner

Pay attention when reading the Gospels. What does Jesus look for in humanity? **Faith.** Is it any surprise that he asks the question, "When the Son of Man come will he find faith on earth?" Time and again Jesus commends the saving power of faith, acknowledges the weakness of faith, or reproves the lack of faith. He wants to strengthen our faith. What is Faith?

The Catechism of the Catholic Church (153) reminds us Faith is Grace: When St. Peter confessed that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of the living God, Jesus declared to him that this revelation did not come "from flesh and blood", but from "my Father who is in heaven".<sup>24</sup> Faith is a gift of God, a supernatural virtue infused by him. "Before this faith can be exercised, man must have the grace of God to move and assist him; he must have the interior helps of the Holy Spirit, who moves the heart and converts it to God, who opens the eyes of the mind and 'makes it easy for all to accept and believe the truth.'"<sup>25</sup>

In the opening prayer at Mass this weekend we pray asking God to help us always conform our will to his and to serve his majesty in sincerity of heart. We all need help, especially to ask for God's help daily. In asking for His help, we must be willing to surrender our will, what we think we need help with over to God, and let Him help us as He sees fit. Very often in asking God for his help we place conditions or expectations on God thinking that He should help us as according to our ways. God is always infinitely patient with us although when we are stubborn or obstinate we can impede His grace.

Moses and Joshua work together with their faith in God. They are willing to listen to God and even support one another through the help of Aaron and Hur. Again, in the Psalm we proclaim our help is from the Lord, who made Heaven and earth. We acknowledge God as Creator of all that is and our dependence upon God by asking his help. St. Paul encourages us to "remain faithful to what you have learned and believed." We need help to remain faithful. We can be tempted to become unfaithful seeking to change, promote, or teach contrary to the teachings of Jesus Christ's Church. Keep in mind because God created the Catholic Church it is always His first never ours. We even need God's help to be good stewards of the Christian mysteries of faith.

Even in the Gospel God reflects his care and love for the widow. He uses the parable of the dishonest judge who "neither feared God nor respected any human being." Yet, because of the widow's holy perseverance and persistence in asking for the judges help by rendering a decision, her request is granted. Let us call out to God day and night. Let us find our security in God. As we seek to conform our will to God's will, pray for a deeper faith and trust, that He both hears our prayers and answers them according to His will.
