St. Paul's Corner

Be imitators of Jesus Christ! What does it mean to imitate Jesus Christ? I suppose there could be a multitude of different answers to this question so let us consider two means of imitation.

Imitating Jesus Christ means that we seek to live out the Two Great Commandments: You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the first and great commandment. And a second is like it, You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' In our daily living how have we love God? How have we loved our neighbor? How have we loved our self? All in an orderly way of loving.

Remember the ***First Great Commandment of Loving God*** summarizes the first three of the Ten Commandments: (1) I am the Lord your God you shall have no strange gods before me. (2) You shall not take the name of the Lord your God in vain. (3) Remember the Sabbath day, to keep it holy. The ***Second Great Commandment of Loving our neighbor as our self***, summarizes the last seven: (4) Honor your father and mother. (5) You shall not kill. (6) You shall not commit adultery. (7) You shall not steal. (8) You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor. (9) You shall not covet your neighbor's wife. (10) You shall not covet your neighbor's goods. Imitating Jesus Christ means that we are striving to Love God, neighbor, and self in an orderly way. Imitating Jesus also means that we are striving for holiness.

What is holiness? Holiness is progression in the spiritual life of growing more deeply in God's love. We are reminded in the Catechism that "All Christians in any state or walk of life are called to the fulness of Christian life and to the perfection of charity." All are called to holiness: "Be perfect, as your heavenly Father is perfect." In order to reach this perfection the faithful should use the strength delt out to them by Christ's gift, so that...doing the will of the Father in everything, they may wholeheartedly devote themselves to the glory of God and to the service of their neighbor. Thus the holiness of the People of God will grow in fruitful abundance, as is clearly shown in the history of the Church through the lives of the saints." (CCC 2013)

Many Christians, oddly enough, can be put off by the word holiness. Yet, holiness is something we are meant to embrace. Holiness permeates the ordinariness of our daily activities and engagements with different people whether we are aware of it or not because God is holy himself. Growing in holiness is to grow more deeply into God's love. It is a reminder to be faithful to our daily duties and the people we serve in a multitude of different ways. Remember God's name is holy and should not be taken in vain.
