

St. Paul's Corner

Viva Cristo Rey! Long Live Christ the King became the chant of the Mexican Martyrs. In the 1920's Christians faced intense persecution from the government. Many men, women, and children were killed for their faith. Among thousands of martyrs one particular individual stands out: Blessed Miguel Austin Pro.

Miguel was a Jesuit Priest. Miguel, from an early age, desired to be a priest. He also desired to be martyred for the faith if God would permit that to happen. He had a great love for theater arts, theatrics, playing cards, spending time with people and offering the sacraments. As a young Jesuit priest, he would tell his classmates, friends, and family that if God permitted him to be martyred, they should begin asking his intercession in their prayers as he would be dealing out favors like a deck of cards.

As the Cristero War ensued (1926-1929) violent conflict between the oppressive government and Catholics spread. Miguel, among many clergy, went underground. The government rounded up Catholics leading them before firing squads, hangings, and other forms of torture. The battle cry rang out louder, VIVA CRISTO REY, long live Christ the King. Miguel decided to put his talents to use. Rather than hiding and going under ground he began using his Theatrical skills and passion for theater arts to use. Wearing disguises Miguel would openly, although secretly, go out in public bringing the faithful the sacraments--the Eucharist, hearing confessions, anointing them.

As the Mexican government learned of the Catholics openly rebelling against them, they set their sights on one man: Miguel Austin Pro. The government knew if they could silence and put Miguel to death, they could quash the rebellion. On the day the government captured Miguel, they led him before a firing squad. Kneeling before the executioners with his head raised towards Heaven, his arms stretched out in the form of a cross, he publicly declared one last time: VIVA CRISTO REY.

Worldly powers who attempt to quash or change the Catholic church very rarely succeed. As the faithful learned of Miguel's death thousands upon thousands flocked out of hiding into the streets. They processed Miguel's body down the streets. Soon afterwards the governments conceded their anti-clerical, anti-religious sentiments as a deal was brokered by the United States. Christ was the King of Miguel's life. How have we enthroned Christ as the King of our soul, home, families, relationships? Miguel exemplified courage and honesty to bear witness to Jesus Christ. Do we exemplify courage and honesty witnessing to Jesus Christ. Do we live out the faith in timidity and dishonesty, afraid of offending people?

Being Christian in today's culture calls us to courageously and honestly bear witness to Jesus Christ and the faith even though people will at times will be offended and displeased. The worldly will maliciously mock, sneer, or jeer at Christians. Sometimes Christians will even do this to other Christians. Let us live courageously bearing patiently with the faults of other people even when they may act maliciously, whether in manner or speech, towards us personally or to the Catholic faith in general.
