St. Paul's Corner

Jesus began to preach and say, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand." The Kingdom of Heaven is hidden amid the ordinary activities and relationships of day-to-day life. We are invited to remain united with Christ, by remaining in a state of grace, and following him. He desires for us to remain united with him.

Criticism and discouragement can separate us from him. When we criticize Christ and his Church, his priests, fellow Christians sitting next to us in the pews at Mass we criticize Christ himself. Speaking critically or ill ruptures our relationship with God and others. Being critical can often stem from discouragement. When we are discouraged, we can be living in hopelessness or despair. Jesus invites each of us to build one another up in a spirit of encouragement by spending time in prayer and remaining united with him.

Know your Faith

Archbishop Fulton Sheen once said, "There are not one hundred people in the United States who hate The Catholic Church, but there are millions who hate what they wrongly perceive the Catholic Church to be."

Father, Is the Catholic Church a man made institution? Many individuals will falsely claim the Catholic Church is a man-made institution. Although they are mostly incorrect there is a partial truth to their claim.

Christians, even Catholic Christians, often forget or are simply ignorant that because of the Incarnation Jesus Christ is both divine and human. He is the God-man. The Gospel of Matthew chapter 16 says, "And I tell you, you are Peter, and on this rock, I will build my church, and the powers of death (hades hell) shall not prevail against it." The true Church of Jesus Christ remains present to this day battered by the storms and trials of history, because of His divine protection.

Because Jesus Christ establishes the church, which is One, Holy, Catholic, and Apostolic it is of divine and human origin. On a mystical level the Church is the perfectly the spotless Bride of Christ the Bridegroom. On a human level the Church is made up of imperfect human beings tempted by sin. Hence, the central proclamation of Jesus Christ throughout the Gospel remains the same yesterday, today, and tomorrow: Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand.
