Know your Faith

Archbishop Fulton Sheen once said, “There are not one hundred people in the United States who hate The Catholic Church, but there are millions who hate what they wrongly perceive the Catholic Church to be.”

Father, what are Two Great Commandments? What are the Ten Commandments? Why did God give the Israelites the Ten Commandments?

As a priest of Jesus Christ, I am in awe and, not necessarily in a good sense, of how many Christians are unable to answer these questions. Over the last several years I’ve noticed more children and adults who are unable to answer such basic questions of the faith and not just answer but even seek to honor and live them out. Why is this?

There are Christians, certainly not all, who roll their eyes in an almost smug or arrogant manner as if Christ’s Commandments are no longer relevant. Some out of ignorance, some out of arrogance. Christians can resist God’s commandments for any number of reasons, but that resistance can often be traced back to the sin of pride.

Have we ever had thoughts, e.g. ‘I will never be told what to do’ or ‘I will never let anyone tell me how to live my life’ or ‘I can do or say whatever I want.’ Perhaps questions or thoughts such as, ‘Who is the Church to tell me what to do or how to live my life?’ or ‘The church should stay out of my bedroom or home’ or ‘I don’t need to listen to God or His Church. Do we tell God what he should or should not be doing or saying? Do we tell God where He can or cannot be? Many of these thoughts or questions arise from the sin of pride-Pride of arrogance, disobedience, idolatry, lawlessness, or rebelliousness.

God firmly establishes the Ten Commandments with Moses and the Israelites to curb their prideful rebelliousness. Their story of salvation is our story of salvation. We grow tired, fatigued, weary. We begin to think and accuse God as if He has forgotten us, doesn’t care or hear us. We begin to complain and grumble against Him. Then in our humanity and selfishness we become rebellious, lawless, disobedient each going our own way. Yet God still seeks each of us out gently and patiently drawing each of us back to Himself. He gives us the Ten Commandments; the Two Great Commandments yes, in one sense as rules but, also boundaries for a healthy relationship with God, His Church, and our neighbor.

God gives us the Commandments. As we seek to honor and uphold them, we humble our self in a spirit of repentance through prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. We seek to die to our selfishness or self-centered tendencies that we might grow in Love of God, neighbor, and our self.
