St. Paul's Corner

On Divine Mercy Sunday Jesus challenges Thomas and, each of us, when he says, "Have you come to believe because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed." The goal of faith is the eternal salvation of your soul.

How often the world we live in people struggle to trust and be honest with God, self, and neighbor. We can become obstinate and stubborn, like Thomas, refusing to believe unless... God longs to forgive sin. Yet, we distrust God, at times even becoming suspicious of Him. We wound Him by our sins of distrust, our lack of faith when we reject his forgiveness. Jesus invites each disciple, every Christian to seek forgiveness and mercy. Do we approach the Sacrament of Reconciliation with faith in Christ's ability to forgive sins or do we avoid Him?

Jesus breathes on the Apostles and says, "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained." Many Catholics fall into the lie that they don't need to go to the sacrament of Reconciliation because they can go directly to God. Sacred Scriptures indeed does remind us that we can directly go to God in a spirit of repentance in our time of prayer. True as this may be, it is easy to fall into self-deception. Keep in mind that when we bring our sins to confession its not just the priest we bring them to but Jesus Christ himself.

Do we believe that Jesus Christ works in and through his priests to absolve us of sin? It is always more humbling to admit our sins, faults, and shortcomings. Yes, in one sense we confess to another human being with the priest, whether face-to-face or behind the screen but always Christ first and foremost. It takes courage to be honest with God, self and neighbor. Yet, we discover hope and healing from the graces of the sacrament.

In the sacrament of reconciliation, we learn to be honest with God, self and neighbor. On the day that we stand before Christ the merciful and just judge we will be faced with an honest review of our life: our thoughts, words and actions—what we have done and failed to do. Let us reaffirm our faith in the forgiveness of sins poured out to each Christian who approaches with Confidence His Mercy in the Sacrament of Reconciliation.
