GIVING OF ONESELF

On Sunday evening after mass, my mother made a comment to Fr. Michael how she missed my twin sister and me, being an 'empty nester' and all. He was quick to chime in how it was him that was really missing us, voicing his latest concerns about how the parish needed to recruit both children and adults for all kinds of ministry work now that we were settled in at our universities and were no longer altar serving there. As I sit here in my dorm room just 20 miles to the U.S. / Canadian border in upstate New York, I have been contemplating what I can do here to possibly inspire, maybe appeal to others to make this incredible, rewarding decision to serve Him, to serve others.

Like some stories in life, our story did not always go smoothly. We were your typical family trying to cram the impossible with utilizing our entire day of overflowing weekly struggles to get endless hours of school, sports, extra curricular activities and part time jobs all accomplished in an impossible 24 hour day. It was demanding, relentless and down right exhausting, but we were all focused on the end result - the best outcome for college someday. One morning, everything came to an abrupt STOP. My mother explained that we needed to return back to the church after what she had thought at the time, a much needed break. After a few choice words from us, we knew we had lost the war but still gave her heck about her final decision. Momma was definitely not backing down on this, especially after Nana had expressed how important it was to have God back in our busy lives. She had finally realized what we were trying to complete was just not worth doing: none of it. It was time for us to regroup as a family once again and refocus on what was truly important in life.

For quite a few months, the household was not a delightful place to be as we were trying to acclimate. We could not believe we were placing another two new things on our overflowing, hectic plates to attend both CCD classes and weekly masses on top of our ever demanding schedules, along with trying to get the best grades and highest recognitions in sports/activities. Afterall, how else were we going to afford college? Fast forward ~ so one afternoon, Fr. Carlos approached my older sister to recruit her to altar serve. As she got into the car, she informed my mother how she was going to pursue this calling and needless to say, my mother was first in total disbelief and then BEYOND ecstatic! Seeing her proud teary-eyed face was so touching. Shortly thereafter, my oldest sibling approached my twin sister and I for us to come and get involved. I was full of trepidation of the unknown, but believed God would guide me through it. When I saw my mother looking at the three of us walking down the aisle together, I thought she was going to lose it completely!

After joining, I finally got it. It was never about all that other nonsense stuff - just one important thing: about serving our Almighty Lord. Now I look at things differently. We are here for a very short period of time, so what will we do with it? What can I do? Unfortunately, some day we are all going to leave here and be gone a lot longer than we were ever alive. How can I be a better Christian? What is the most rewarding, selfless, Christian thing you ever did for Him? What small acts of kindness can I possibly do to make a difference? What are we going to do with our limited time here on God's green earth? What mark will we leave behind? What Christian work will we have accomplished today, tomorrow, next week, next year? What small act/s of kindness can I possibly do to make a difference for Him? The answer is simple: the giving of oneself. That very precious valuable and quality time we always try to make more of. Doing small acts of kindness is truly one of the greatest little gifts in life. For me, it has always been about serving others and doing ministry or community service work. It has been a remarkable of endless, blessed moments that I am so extremely proud and elated we did as three sisters and more importantly, made us closer as a family. Sadly, those precious years went by in a blink. We are truly grateful for having those experiences where we were able to share dozens of masses together we now treasure. To me, ministry work is such an unbelievably fulfilling and gratifying inner feeling.


Our parish follows the guidelines of the national charter for the protection of children and young people

Our diocesan policy requires that all those whose work brings them in contact with children receive Safe Environment Training. This applies to all volunteers, Catechists, Aides, Eucharistic Ministers, Greeters, and For those who have not already Lectors. attended a session, the training is available online. To register for the Online Course, email dbronchuk@ourladylake.org. You will then be contacted by Cathaleen Peloquin from the Office of Healing and Prevention who will send you the link for the online training. Once you have completed the training you must send the certificate to Debbie Bronchuk. If you are interested in a LIVE course or if you have any questions please contact Debbie at the Religious Ed.Office, email or dbronchuk@ourladylake.org. Our Parish requires that you fill out a CORI form every three years (with attached copy of your driver's license) and the new Code of Ministerial Conduct. 
