Dear friends of OLM and MQP:
 I hope you gave some time to read my previous bulletin reflection where I recounted the story of how the title of Our Lady of Mercy or Ransom came to be known in the Church. Our Parish is blessed to have her as our Patroness and honor her on September 24th. A patron Saint is our intercessor in heaven and our friend, it was the tradition in the Church to name a person after the saint when she or he was born, unfortunately this tradition is not followed very much now days, however at the time of receiving Confirmation many Catholics still follow this tradition. It has been a custom to have a Festival during our Parish Feast where the whole community gathers to pray and have fun; once again we will have it as it was before. Let me mention as before, that on September 24th, the Feast of Our Lady of Mercy and therefore our Patroness, the Church grants a plenary indulgence for those who are disposed. Here is an explanation what an indulgence is from the Catechism of the Catholic Church: The doctrine and practice of indulgences in the Church are closely linked to the effects of the sacrament of Penance. What is an indulgence? An indulgence is a remission before God of the temporal punishment due to sins whose guilt has already been forgiven, which the faithful Christian who is duly disposed gains under certain prescribed conditions through the action of the Church which, as the minister of redemption, dispenses and applies with authority the treasury of the satisfactions of Christ and the saints. An indulgence is partial or plenary according as it removes either part or all of the temporal punishment due to sin. The faithful can gain indulgences for themselves or apply them to the dead. # 1471 Who can obtain an indulgence? A person seeking an indulgence must be baptized, not excommunicated, and in the state of grace when performing the work of the indulgence. A person also needs to have the sincere intention of gaining the indulgence before doing the particular work associated with it. Gaining a plenary (full) indulgence on behalf of a deceased person is a great act of mercy because it makes atonement for the punishment they are experiencing in purgatory; the person's soul is then able to proceed to heaven. Remember, this is only possible because of the merits Christ won for us on the Cross; we are asking that those merits be applied to a loved one in need of them. If the indulgence is for yourself, you are working toward the remission of the temporal punishment for sins that, if left unremitted in this life, you will have to work toward in purgatory. To receive a plenary indulgence for yourself or a departed loved one, the following conditions must be fulfilled: 1. Make a sacramental Confession. 2. Receive Holy Communion. 3. Pray for the intentions of the Holy Father and say the Creed and Our Father. 4. Have complete detachment from all sin, even venial sin. In other words, a complete rejection of the desire to commit any sin. I Wish you a very blessed and Happy Feast of Our Lady of Mercy. God bless you. Fr. Cervantes.


