

## Dear Padre April 27, 2025

How do we maintain our faith in a world that shames religion and creates doubt in our beliefs?

I would respond to your question with one of my own: "When has it ever been different?" In what place has there been universal praise and acceptance of the practices of faith and belief? When has there been a time when there is no doubt? This is a good question for this Sunday, when we hear about St. Thomas, the doubting disciple.

Many years ago, unanimity might have been understood as the norm in a tight-knit neighborhood community of people with the same experience and belief. However, in the wide world today that is so connected and disconnected at the same time, sameness and uniformity cannot be assumed. It may cause unease, or even fear, to learn that someone disagrees with you, perhaps even someone you love, but it should no longer be a surprise or considered out of the ordinary.

Doubt can help a person grow in faith and belief. Even though doubt is challenging, it is often a necessary experience in order to be strengthened and to persevere. Doubt is not something that should cause us to quiver in fear, but rather to rejoice in hope, in the confidence that what we believe is worth living and has something to teach us. •

#### 2025-2026 Holy Family Pastoral Council Elections

The Pastoral Council for Holy Family Parish in New Hampton is responsible for **assisting the pastor and staff** in planning for the future. Each person has a term of three (3) years and is eligible to run for two (2) consecutive terms. If you have served two (2) consecutive terms, you are able to run again after 1 year off. Some members will also serve on the Cluster Pastoral Council. *Pastoral Council meetings are held an estimated four (4) times per year. Meeting dates may fluctuate with schedules*.

**Those eligible to be elected**: 1) All confirmed Catholics in good standing with the Catholic Church, 2) Are members of the parish you are wishing to serve on, 3) 18 years or older, and 4) Staff members and spouses cannot be elected members.

Holy Family Parish is looking at reorganizing the role of our Pastoral Council members. As it stands, when you are elected to the Pastoral Council, you are also given additional tasks that you are responsible for completing while you are serving on the Council. Some of these tasks are attending additional meetings, some tasks have a short-term obligation and some of the tasks have a more time-consuming obligation. With the reorganization, your role as a Pastoral Council member will be to simply work together with the pastor to provide long-range planning which will guide the parish toward its future. The revised role of the Council is as follows:

- To listen to and represent the wisdom of parishioners and parish staff as part of the planning process.
- To determine priorities and develop a plan for both implementing and evaluating them.
- To develop goals and objectives which further the mission of the parish.
- To evaluate regularly the goals and objectives of the council and of its subgroups.
- To recommend policies which are supportive of the mission of the parish.
- To identify and contact individuals and groups/committees in the parish to carry out its mission.

It is not intended for you to assume other responsibilities. However, you are welcome to volunteer for some of these tasks that are being removed from the role of the Council member.

With this goal of reorganization, there will be additional volunteer opportunities for others within the Parish. We hope parishioners will take advantage of additional opportunities to give back to your parish. More to come in the near future regarding these opportunities.

Holy Family Parish is seeking to fill three (3) Pastoral Council vacancies. Because we have a short timeframe to complete the election, we are bypassing the nomination process this year. If you are an interested parishioner in serving on the Pastoral Council, please complete the biographical questionnaire on the reverse side and return to the Pastoral Office by Friday, May 16, 2025. Elections will be held on the weekend of May 31 / June 1, 2025.

At this point in history, we are a nation filled with much anger. Given all that is taking place, one might conclude that it comes from a fear of losing control—fears due to the waves of immigrants seeking asylum, to a changing economy, to political alliances, to artificial intelligence, resulting in our inability to sort truth from untruth. Fears also due to strained relationships with non-Western nations, to urban violence and the abundance of guns, to the conflict between pro-life and pro-choice allegiances, and, for some, to what is perceived as conflicted thinking within the Catholic Church. There is no shortage of what may be fueling our anger. How can faith help us respond in a life-giving way?

Saint John writes that "whoever is begotten by God conquers the world. And the victory that conquers the world is our faith" (1 John 5:4). This is not to say that we can easily make the world respond in ways we want, but rather that the world has no power over the person who places all trust in God's presence among us. It was the risen Lord who once brought peace to the disciples behind doors locked out of fear. Might not our faith help us who have locked ourselves behind doors of mistrust and anger? If only we allow ourselves to trust God. Yet, we should not simply shrug off all cares or involvement in life; on the contrary, with faith and trust, we recognize we are not the only players in shaping the events of the world. lacksquare
