Rather, it is a blessing you accept gratefully, thankfully, and with a profound knowledge and respect for the mercy of God at work in your life. To confess your sins again and again does nothing except make you feel more guilty. It is a way of punishing yourself; a futile attempt to try to earn what has been freely given. A better use of your time and energy would be to discover a way to remind yourself, not of guilt or imperfection, but of the love God has for you. It is indeed awesome and amazing, as the song so accurately celebrates: "Amazing grace, how sweet the sound, that saved a wretch like me."



Recently, through the Catholic Leadership Institute's survey, many of you shared your thoughts on Important areas like: Involvement in parish decisions, Financial transparency, Opportunities to serve, Communication and follow-up, Confidence in our parish leadership and staff.

Your feedback helps us see where we are strong and where we can grow. Most parishioners expressed confidence in recommending our pastor, staff, and parish to others, which is a blessing. At the same time, your insights challenge us to continue improving the ways we invite you into service and decision-making.

Thank you for trusting us with your voice. In the coming months, we'll share more updates on how your input is shaping the future of our parish community. Together, we are building a parish that reflects the heart of Christ: welcoming, transparent, and rooted in mission.

During the month of May we will be releasing information around the **Four Factors of a Thriving Parish**. These four factors include: Leadership Indicators, Sunday Experience, Spiritual Practices, Missionary Impulse. This week's review expands on results from our **Leadership Indicators**.

Let us continue to pray for each other and for our leaders as we move forward together!

HOLY FAMILY, NEW HAPTON

Involvement in Parish Decisions: 58% of parishioners (12% strongly agree and 46% agree) feel involved in parish decision-making. **31%** are neutral, **11%** (10% disagree and 1% strongly disagree) feel they are not involved.

Financial Transparency: 80% (25% strongly agree and 55% agree) believe that the parish is financially transparent. **16%** are neutral, and **4%** (1% disagree and 3% strongly disagree) express concern about transparency.

Follow-up on Involvement: 69% (27% strongly agree and 42% agree) feel there is good follow-up after they get involved in parish life. **29%** are neutral, and **2%** (1% disagree and 1% strongly disagree) see room for significant improvement.

Opportunities to Serve: 85% (28% strongly agree and 57% agree) feel that there are plenty of opportunities to serve at the parish. **13%** are neutral, and **2%** (2% disagree and 0% strongly disagree) feel opportunities are lacking.

ST. BOMIFACE, IONIA

Involvement in Parish Decisions: 82% of parishioners (32% strongly agree and 50% agree) feel involved in parish decision-making. **18%** are neutral, **0%** (0% disagree and 0% strongly disagree) feel they are not involved.

Financial Transparency: 86% (25% strongly agree and 61% agree) believe that the parish is financially transparent. **14%** are neutral, and **0%** (0% disagree and 0% strongly disagree) express concern about transparency.

Follow-up on Involvement: 74% (33% strongly agree and 41% agree) feel there is good follow-up after they get involved in parish life. **26%** are neutral, and **0%** (0% disagree and 0% strongly disagree) see room for significant improvement.

Opportunities to Serve: 82% (36% strongly agree and 46% agree) feel that there are plenty of opportunities to serve at the parish. 18% are neutral, and 0% (0% disagree and 0% strongly disagree) feel opportunities are lacking.

IMMACULATE CONCEPTION, NORTH WASHINGTON

Involvement in Parish Decisions: 57% of parishioners (19% strongly agree and 38% agree) feel involved in parish decision-making. **38%** are neutral, **5%** disagree feel they are not involved.

Financial Transparency: 81% (14% strongly agree and 67% agree) believe that the parish is financially transparent. **14%** are neutral, and **5%** disagree express concern about transparency.

Follow-up on Involvement: 67% (19% strongly agree and 48% agree) feel there is good follow-up after they get involved in parish life. **33%** are neutral, and **0%** (0% disagree and 0% strongly disagree) see room for significant improvement.

Opportunities to Serve: 76% (19% strongly agree and 57% agree) feel that there are plenty of opportunities to serve at the parish. 24% are neutral, and 0% (0% disagree and 0% strongly disagree) feel opportunities are lacking.

2025-2026 Holy Family Pastoral Council Elections

The Pastoral Council for Holy Family Parish in New Hampton is responsible for **assisting the pastor and staff** in planning for the future. Each person has a term of three (3) years and is eligible to run for two (2) consecutive terms. If you have served two (2) consecutive terms, you are able to run again after 1 year off. Some members will also serve on the Cluster Pastoral Council. *Pastoral Council meetings are held an estimated four (4) times per year. Meeting dates may fluctuate with schedules*.

Those eligible to be elected: 1) All confirmed Catholics in good standing with the Catholic Church, 2) Are members of the parish you are wishing to serve on, 3) 18 years or older, and 4) Staff members and spouses cannot be elected members.

Holy Family Parish is looking at reorganizing the role of our Pastoral Council members. As it stands, when you are elected to the Pastoral Council, you are also given additional tasks that you are responsible for completing while you are serving on the Council. Some of these tasks are attending additional meetings, some tasks have a short-term obligation and some of the tasks have a more time-consuming obligation. With the reorganization, your role as a Pastoral Council member will be to simply work together with the pastor to provide long-range planning which will guide the parish toward its future. The revised role of the Council is as follows:

- To listen to and represent the wisdom of parishioners and parish staff as part of the planning process.
- To determine priorities and develop a plan for both implementing and evaluating them.
- To develop goals and objectives which further the mission of the parish.
- To evaluate regularly the goals and objectives of the council and of its subgroups.
- To recommend policies which are supportive of the mission of the parish.
- To identify and contact individuals and groups/committees in the parish to carry out its mission.

It is not intended for you to assume other responsibilities. However, you are welcome to volunteer for some of these tasks that are being removed from the role of the Council member.

With this goal of reorganization, there will be additional volunteer opportunities for others within the Parish. We hope parishioners will take advantage of additional opportunities to give back to your parish. More to come in the near future regarding these opportunities.

Holy Family Parish is seeking to fill three (3) Pastoral Council vacancies. Because we have a short timeframe to complete the election, we are bypassing the nomination process this year. If you are an interested parishioner in serving on the Pastoral Council, please complete the biographical questionnaire on the reverse side and return to the Pastoral Office by Friday, May 16, 2025. Elections will be held on the weekend of May 31 / June 1, 2025.
