HAPPY MOTHER'S DAY

Dear Padre

May 11, 2025

When is it OK to medicate for pain? If my relative is in hospice, should I permit the use of drugs that hasten his or her death?

When someone we love is dying, we do not want him or her to be in pain. It is only natural to want to ease or end all suffering. The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* offers these guidelines: "The use of painkillers to alleviate the sufferings of the dying, even at the risk of shortening their days, can be morally in conformity with human dignity if death is not willed as either an end or a means, but only foreseen and tolerated as inevitable" (CCC 2279). In other words, it is permissible to medicate for pain, but you must not use narcotics as an end or means to hasten someone's death—only to alleviate pain and minimize a person's suffering. To give medication to cause death rather than merely to relieve pain is not allowed.

It is important to have a discussion about the types of treatment a person would want when they are dying. It is also important to have a discussion with your pastor or another priest or chaplain—someone who can help you discern whether the action, the intention, and the circumstances are consistent with Church teaching. Many times, one is forced to make very difficult decisions about medical care, and it is always good to have someone we trust who can help us make the best choice. ●

Thank you to everyone who participated in the recent CLI survey about the Sunday experience in our parishes—Holy Family (New Hampton), Immaculate Conception (North Washington), and St. Boniface (Ionia). Your responses are a vital part of helping us grow together in faith, community, and worship.

Feeling Welcomed

We are grateful to hear that many of you feel welcomed in our parish communities:

- At Holy Family, 203 respondents (nearly 90%) agreed or strongly agreed that they feel welcomed and accepted.
- Immaculate Conception saw similar positivity with 17 out of 22 respondents (77%) feeling welcomed.
- St. Boniface had an overwhelming 100% positive response among those who answered!

This tells us that hospitality is truly a strength in our cluster, and we thank everyone who helps create a warm environment each Sunday.

The Power of the Mass

Your feedback also highlights the value of our Sunday liturgies:

- At Holy Family, 197 out of 206 respondents (96%) agreed or strongly agreed that Mass helps them grow spiritually.
- Immaculate Conception and St. Boniface also reflected strong responses with 18 and 25 participants respectively, affirming the spiritual richness of our celebrations.

Music and Preaching Matter

Music continues to play a key role in drawing us deeper into worship:

- Holy Family: 182 (89%) found the music engaging.
- Immaculate Conception and St. Boniface both received favorable responses, with over 75% of respondents feeling spiritually enriched by the music.

In terms of preaching, we are especially heartened:

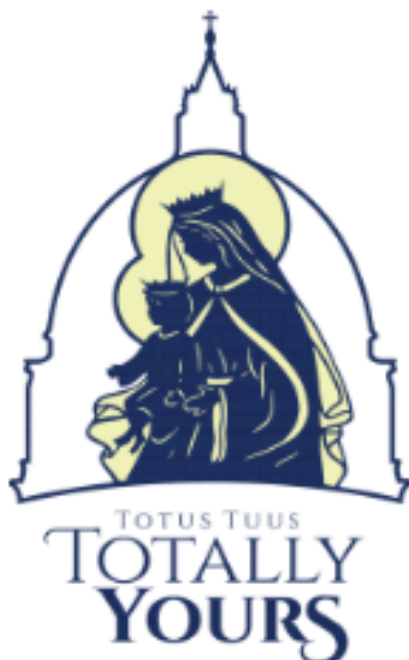
- Holy Family: 203 out of 218 respondents (93%) found homilies help connect faith with everyday life.
- St. Boniface had unanimous agreement (100%) among respondents.
- Immaculate Conception also showed strong appreciation with 18 out of 20 expressing a connection to the preaching.

Just as we may hear the voice of our mother echoing in our head long after she has passed away, in much the same way do we who gather week after week as people of faith begin to hear the words and wisdom of the Lord Jesus. It is how he shepherds us, and how we follow him—by hearing and then living his word.

There are some who say they are not religious, but they are spiritual. Ultimately, to be spiritual is to have a core set of values by which one lives. One's core values can take many shapes. For us, who call ourselves disciples of Jesus, to be spiritual is to take on the values and wisdom of Jesus—to allow his way to take root in the core of who we are. It means living by the wisdom of his word. Being spiritual includes *honesty, gentleness, patience, joy, civility, simple living, mercy, compassion, peace, reverence and awe, obedience, justice, courage, balance in life, humility, chastity, kindness, generosity, lightheartedness, care for the common good, prayerfulness, and respect for all of creation as holy*.

Spirituality is about absorbing the lifestyle of Jesus, about his word echoing in our lives, something that takes a lifetime. Religion, specifically our Catholic faith, is the practice of that spirituality in the company of others who are also trying to put those values into practice. Such practice, including weekly Mass and participation in the sacramental life of the Church, is necessary for the faithful followers of Jesus. ●
