## My brothers and sisters in Christ,

As we look to start another academic year within our cluster, there are a couple of needs for which we need to pray. First, we need to pray with and for all our families of young people within our parishes. It is easily forgotten that the first means of education, the primary education of each of us, from children to parents to priests,

is the weekly Sunday Mass. Let us beg God that all of us may allow God to form us by obeying His command to attend Mass every week and on Holy Days (if not more). All other forms of education and spiritual connection depend on this one. Christ rose from the dead on Sunday; if we are really people of the resurrection to eternal life (and not to eternal death), may we express our fidelity to God on Sundays so God may be faithful to us in all His promises.

Second, we need to pray for and support our teachers, DRE, staff, and all who work for education in the faith for our community. The most important knowledge, more important than math, English, history, or any other subject, is knowledge of God and His family the Church. Without knowledge of God, what does anything else gain us? May God fill us with knowledge of Himself. May God find us willing to make sacrifices to make room for God. And may God bless our teachers and staff who dedicate themselves, in big and small ways, to completing this task. Good teachers are like angels blowing trumpets before the God of Heaven, making everyone aware that God and His love really is here. Pray for our education personnel.

Third, let us pray to God that our parish may be a parish of prayer. This is the divinely ordained three-fold education plan of God: weekly Mass, parish education, and family prayer. May all our families be families of prayer where God isn't only mentioned on Sundays or in times of trouble, but daily in every time and place. May our parents be holy parents; may our grandparents be holy grandparents; and may our children have a hunger, openness, recognition, and fire for God in all things. Holy children effect their parents; holy parents effect their children. May God bring this holiness about profoundly and overwhelmingly in every soul.

Finally, if you have time after all of the above, please pray for your poor pastor. He's quite something; but I can tell you he hungers for your spiritual success more than for his own. You are his joy and crown. Please, if you have an extra 3 seconds, raise a prayer up for him.

May God bless you, each and all, as we enter this harvest season, so that God's harvest of love, peace, joy, and beautiful souls may be over-flowing and super abundant. Amen.

# INTERESTED IN BECOMING CATHOLIC?

#### Guided by the Holy Spirit, the OCIA is for:

- Those never baptized who wish to become Catholic.
- Christians baptized in another tradition who seek full communion with the Catholic Church.
- Uncatechized Catholics who were baptized but never received First Communion and/or Confirmation.
- Children age 7+ who have never been baptized.

#### This journey includes:

- Liturgical Celebrating meaningful rites that mark your steps along the way.
- Catechetical Learning and embracing the truths of the Catholic faith.
- Pastoral Walking alongside a faith-filled community and a personal sponsor.

Whether you're curious about the Catholic Church, returning after time away, or ready to take the next step toward the Sacraments, the OCIA invites you to say "yes" to God's call. Your journey of faith starts here.

We will begin the OCIA on September 28, 2025, at Holy Family Parish in the Gathering Space, New Hampton.

The Archdiocese of Dubuque is holding 34 regional informational sessions for parishioners to learn more about the Journey in Faith process. These sessions will further explain information about what will be released at <a href="dbqjourneyinfaith.org">dbqjourneyinfaith.org</a> in early September. What will be the focus of these meetings? Participants will learn more about:

- Rationale, process, and timeline for Journey in Faith
- Importance of prayer and synodal listening in this process
- Proposed pastorate models as possible new groupings of parishes for the future
- Ways to listen, learn, ask questions and provide insights throughout the process include engaging in your parish's October and November local meetings and providing written feedback via the Journey in Faith website.

#### Why should I attend?

Attending these meetings will give you the background about the challenges we face and the opportunities we have to be honest, courageous, faithful, and hopeful. Your ideas about how we can have vibrant and sustainable parishes focused on evangelization for the next 25+ years are very important as future plans are developed. While these September meetings are information focused, they set the stage for parishioners to provide thoughtful verbal feedback at local parish input sessions in October and November and written feedback via the Journey in Faith website.

Parishioners should attend a meeting held in their Regional Planning Area (RPA).
