CATHEDRAL FACTS & HISTORY

The following is taken from page 54 of Celebrating a Centennial, St. Mary's Cathedral Parish, 1880-1980.

Sacred Heart Academy has always maintained a very high scholastic standard. When, in compliance with the wishes of the Most Reverend Aloisius J. Muench, the Presentation Sisters applied to the State Department at Bismarck for the accrediting of their school, they experienced no delay in obtaining a Class A rating, because of the record of their school.

Nor are extra-curricular activities neglected at Sacred Heart Academy. Much opportunity is afforded the students for progress in music, art, and dramatics. Their social life is taken care of by various organizations. The members of the Senior Class publish the school paper, SHACK, and the Annual, REMINISCOR. The physical wellbeing of the students is taken care of by the physical education program. The boys' teams have made a creditable record in

basketball, football and hockey.

Until 1920, the Sacred Heart Academy, maintained solely by the Sisters of the Presentation, was the only Catholic school in Fargo, and was both a grade and high
