Sacrament of Baptism

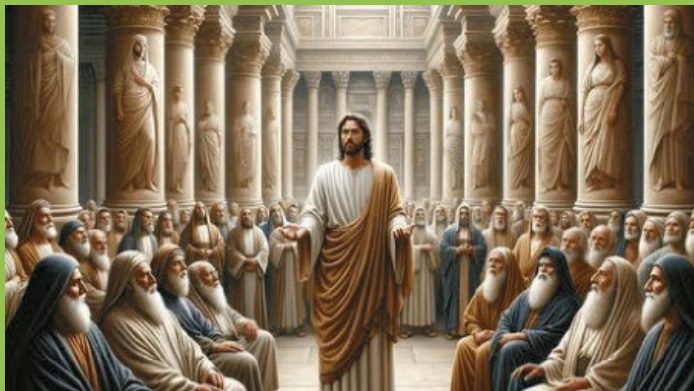
