

From the Desk of Reverend Edward L. Yuhas Pastan

Dear Friends in Christ:

Each year on the Second Sunday of Lent, the Gospel provides us the familiar story of the Transfiguration of Jesus as he led his closest disciples, Peter, James and John up the mountain where they prayed together and Jesus was transfigured before them. God the Father's voice came upon them with the message: "This is my beloved Son, listen to him."

Jesus was faithful to prayer making it the very heart of his commitment with God the Father. Before Jesus chose the Apostles, during the times of his Reverend Edward L. Yuhas teaching, before many of the miracles and healings, and as he suffered in the passion – Jesus entered into prayer.



Because we are members of God's family, the Church, we, too, are called to be people of prayer. This season of Lent calls us to examine where our prayer life has brought us and where we need to grow. To deepen our relationship with the Lord, and get to know his ability to transform our hearts, we need to carve regular opportunities into our daily lives for prayer.

We are invited to climb the mountain with Christ and together in prayer, charity, and fasting allow ourselves to be transformed by God as we open our minds and hearts more fully to God's will for us.

My Dear Sisters and Brothers,

As we celebrate the holy season of Lent, I pray that the Church's yearly remembrance of Our Lord's passion, death and resurrection will strengthen and renew your faith. Please know of my prayers for you today and throughout the entire forty days of Lent.

It is hard to believe that five years have passed since we formally initiated our planning effort, On Mission for The Church Alive!, with the hope of bringing together parishes to align human and financial resources, create greater vibrancy, and strengthen our efforts in hospitality and welcome. Through the hard work and dedication not only of our clergy, but all the lay leaders and parishioners, and with only two Groupings left to merge, we will complete this process within the next year.

With our structure well established, we must now "double down" in the exciting work of evangelization and mission so that all people may come to learn, love and live Jesus.

At the core of EVANGELIZATION, regardless of particular circumstances, the one constant factor is this: Evangelization is fostering relationship with Jesus Christ in and through the community of Jesus, the Church. For those of us who practice and live our Catholic faith, evangelization is a call to ongoing growth and renewed conversion. For those who have stopped practicing their faith, it is a call to reconciliation. For children, it is a call to be formed into disciples through the family's faith life and faith formation. For those who have no faith, it is a call to conversion to know Christ Jesus and thus experience a change to new life with Christ and his Church.

Fostering a relationship with Jesus is the very reason why I have rekindled our partnership with Catholic Leadership Institute (CLI) and why every parish will be participating in the Disciple Maker Index from February 22–March 31, 2023. This 75-question survey is a tool that invites you to reflect on where you are on your journey of discipleship. It also enables parish leadership to make data-driven decisions in pastoral planning that will help parishioners grow in faith.

To this end, I urge every parishioner (18 years and older) to participate in the DMI by taking the survey. Directions for access to the survey can be found in your bulletins and on your websites.

Once every parish has the opportunity to review and understand the DMI results, the parishes will be ready to begin creating a Pastoral Plan. The Pastoral Plan will shift in focus from "maintenance-driven" to "mission-driven" action. More information about Pastoral Planning will be included in next week's bulletin.

In closing, I remind you that the work of evangelization is all of ours. To that end, I pray that together we unify our efforts of bringing people to personal conversion and helping others to become and make disciples for Jesus. Now is the time for us to renew our parishes to promote spiritual maturity, to embrace our baptismal call to holiness and to embrace a missionary impulse that sends us forth to proclaim the Good News of Jesus Christ.

Grateful for our continued efforts together in being On Mission for The Church Alive!, and for our belief that "Nothing is Impossible with God," I am

Next Generation Parish - Catholic Leadership Institute

As announced since Ash Wednesday, our parish and Saint Katharine Drexel Parish are embracing a three year parish renewal spearheaded by the national organization Catholic Leadership Institute at **NO cost** to the parish. The Diocese of Pittsburgh has received a sizeable **grant from the Lilly Foundation to cover all costs** for this initiative.

Every active Catholic is asked to complete an online survey between now and March 31, 2023. For those unable to complete the survey online, we will have hard copy surveys located at the MAIN entrance of each of our churches. Everyone is asked to take this survey seriously as it will inform us of what pastoral priorities you deem most important.

Our parish and Saint Katharine Drexel Parish have been selected by Bishop Zubik to participate in a three-year process of renewal, mission, and evangelization. The survey noted above will initiate this process as we get information from you about your hopes and dreams for the parish. Next weekend: March 11-12-13, 2023, Saint James Parish will welcome Ms. Lucille Smith from the Catholic Leadership Institute who will attend many of the weekend Masses, meet with members of the parish pastoral staff, members from the finance and pastoral councils, volunteers and parishioners. She will be helping us develop a pastoral plan and strategy to continue our revitalization journey. We will be seeing much more of Lucille over the next three years as she is assigned to aid us as a coach through this process of parish renewal.






