“Symbolic elements of the shield, explained”

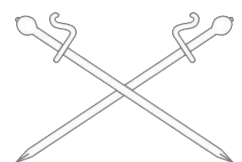
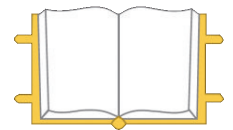
The arrangement of the shield and the principal colors of its design are borrowed from the [coat of arms](#) of the Washington family, from which President George Washington was descended. The two bars have been retained while the colors red and white have been inverted, to emphasize the parishes' connection to Washington County.

The three symbols (in heraldic language, "charges") that adorn the top of the shield are [cockle shells](#). These shells were the emblem of pilgrims who made the journey across Europe to the Cathedral of Saint James. In the symbolic vocabulary of the Church, they also signify Baptism — conferred in the name of the Blessed Trinity: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

The [open book](#) that lies in the center of the shield refers to the work of Saint Katharine Drexel, who dedicated her life to the education of the poor and marginalized. An open book also symbolizes the Sacred Scriptures.

At the base of the shield is a symbol of the [Eucharistic Host](#), enclosed in a sunburst. This, too, is a reference to Saint Katharine, who founded the Sisters of the Blessed Sacrament. In the arrangement of the shield, placing the Eucharist at the base reminds us that the Eucharist is the source and origin of the Church; everything we do rises from the Sacrifice of Christ's Body and Blood and our Communion in it.

The final symbolic element is connected to Saint James: [two crossed pilgrim's staffs](#). These implements of travel remind us that the Church on earth is on a pilgrim's journey towards its destiny with the Church Triumphant. Laid upon the open book, it both stresses the unity of Saint James and Saint Katharine Drexel Parishes and reminds us that the basis for our hope is revealed to us through Sacred Scripture and the teaching of the Church.

Living Lent More Intently

Being forgiven brings such peace and there are many opportunities during Holy Week to experience that peace. Please make note of these times of Confession throughout St. James Parish, Saint Katharine Drexel Parish, and in our neighboring parishes:

Veiling of Crosses

In accord with the practice of the Church, the cross and images of the saints will be covered with violet cloth from the Fifth Sunday of Lent. The cross will remain covered until the end of the celebration of the Lord's Passion in Good Friday, but images of the saints remain covered until the beginning of the Easter Vigil.

From the 12th chapter of the Gospel of Saint John, we hear: "Some Greeks" say, "we would like to see Jesus." On the 5th Sunday of Lent, some of you may very well be saying, "We would like to see Jesus, or my favorite statue." In the Dioceses of the United States, the practice of covering crosses and images may be observed beginning with the 5th Sunday of Lent. Crosses, with the exception of processional crosses, remain covered until the end of the Liturgy of the Lord's Passion on Good Friday, but images can remain covered until the beginning of the Easter Vigil. Why? What does this ancient practice mean? Why the 5th Sunday of Lent and what does this have to do with the Theology of the Body? All good questions, so let us look at the answers and learn something about our faith and Our Lord.

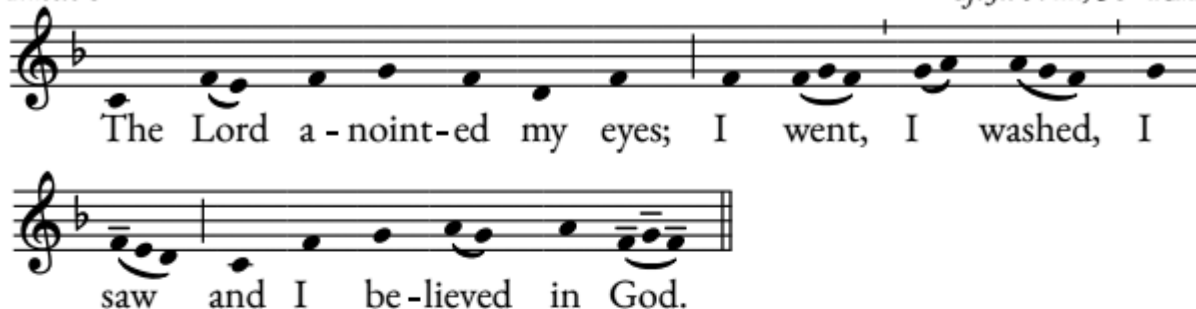
In a world that is losing its sense of meaning and purpose, these liturgical actions do have a rich mystical and spiritual meaning and purpose pointing to a reality in Jesus Christ - His hiddenness. This practice goes back to at least to the 17th century. In the old liturgical calendar beginning with the 5th Sunday of Lent was called the Passiontide due to the fact that the Passion account of our Lord was read on this Sunday, Palm Sunday and Monday to Wednesday of Holy Week. Also, as Father Edward McNamara notes, "it probably derives from a custom, noted in Germany from the 9th century, of extending a large cloth before the altar from the beginning of Lent. The cloth called the 'Hungertuch' (hunger cloth), hid the altar entirely from the faithful during Lent and was not removed until the reading of the Passion on Wednesday of Holy Week at the words 'the veil of the temple was rent in two.'"

As we have done in the past with the readings, we are including music in the Bulletin this Lenten Season.
