Sunday of Divine Mercy

From the Desk of Reverend Edward L. Yuhas Pastor

Dear Friends in Christ:

Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia!
Jesus Christ is Risen!

It was our late and beloved Holy Father, Pope Saint John Paul II who, in the jubilee year 2000, established that the second Sunday of Easter is to be known as "Divine Mercy Sunday."

This observance is attributed to Saint Faustina Kowalska who, in a vision from the Lord in the year 1931, was told to make the world more aware of Jesus as the one who is for us the Divine Mercy of God. In the vision to Faustina, the Lord appeared in a white robe, one of his hands was raised in a gesture of blessing and the other hand was touching his heart. From beneath the Lord's garment, there were two rays, one red and the other a pale white. Jesus spoke to Faustina and told her that one ray represented his Precious Blood and the other water, which for us in the Church reminds us of the Passion account of Good Friday when the soldier pierced the side of Jesus and the Scriptures tell us that from the side of our Lord's body, there came flowing blood and water, a reminder to us of the Sacraments of Baptism and the Most Holy Eucharist.

At every celebration of the Mass, when the priest or deacon stands at the altar, he commemorates that moment when blood and water flowed from the pierced side of Jesus when the priest mixes a little water with the wine in the chalice. The priest or deacon, when mixing the water with the wine prays these words quietly to himself, saying: *"By the mystery of this water and wine, may we come to share in the divinity of Christ who humbled himself in our humanity."*

The meaning of the liturgy as we celebrate it today calls each of us to bear the Easter message of the Gospel that in every age Jesus needs us to continue to care for the needs of each other. Caring as Christ does means living a life that offers hope that the Lord's Divine Mercy is open to all people, especially those who are most in need of healing. May we strive to mirror the Divine Mercy of Christ in our daily lives of faith.

As we continue the celebration of the glorious season of Easter through the liturgy for the next six weeks, this second Sunday of Easter is a powerful reminder of the Divine Mercy God has shown us in the gift of Jesus his Son.

*"For there are three ways of performing an act of mercy:
the merciful word, by forgiving and by comforting;
secondly, if you can offer no word, then pray - that too is mercy;
and thirdly, deeds of mercy."*

Easter Duty

During the Easter season – every Catholic is encouraged to make a thorough examination of conscience followed by a good confession in the Sacrament of Penance. This is known as the fulfillment of one's Easter Duty and is rooted in the consistent teaching of the Church as first recorded in the Council of Trent and is reaffirmed in the *Catechism of the Catholic Church*: "According to the Church's command, 'after having attained the age of discretion, each of the faithful is bound by an obligation faithfully to confess serious sins at least once a year.' Anyone who is aware of having committed a mortal sin must not receive Holy Communion, even if he experiences deep contrition, without having first received sacramental absolution" (CCC, paragraph 1457). The Sacrament of Penance is available at a variety of days and times at both our parishes. Consult the bulletin for details.

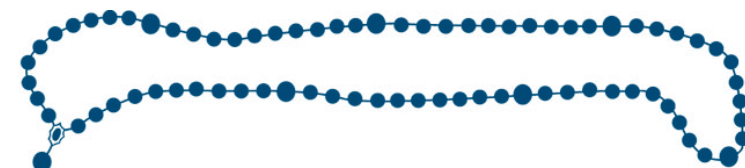

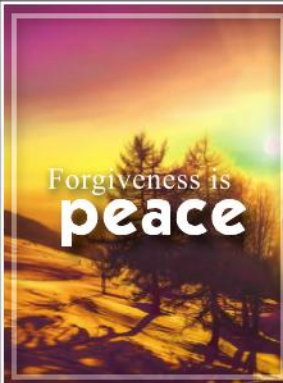

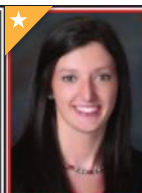
