Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

We find ourselves now commemorating the Third Sunday of Lent. The past few weekends we have heard about the covenants represented by Noah and the rainbow, with Abraham and Isaac, and now we hear about the ratified covenant of the Ten Commandments with Moses. This covenant is so solemn and serious that the Israelites kept the tablets of the Decalogue in a specially made container called the "Ark". Eventually under Solomon they would build a grandiose temple that enshrined this Ark and the Covenant made by Moses between God and His chosen people, Israel. In today's world the Ark is no more – and no more is the grandiose temple of Solomon in Jerusalem. But as God's chosen people today, we are called to follow the Ten Commandments even though they may seem burdensome and challenging. Sometimes we can weaken the Decalogue to simplistic commands of "don't do this..." when instead Jesus teaches a differing interpretation – for example: regarding the 1st Commandment – most of us don't worship false Baals (gods of our own fashioning); but we do at times put things before God that are not eternally important – maybe community events, our children's sports, gatherings with friends... We can also fall into a selfish narcissism of thinking we are more important than God – putting our own desires and choices before worshipping God on Sunday.

Everybody wants a lived faith that is easy. The Jews wanted signs so they would not have to change their bad habits of faith. Many people today travel throughout the world looking for miracles so that they might "see and believe". The Gentiles & the Greek philosophers of Apostolic times wanted easily understood theories on who God is and why Jesus came to us. Many people today get caught up in rationalizing their way out of faith and morality. "We," St. Paul says to the Corinthians this weekend, "offer something that is not based on rationalization nor on wonders. We preach Christ crucified." The crucifix both reminds us of Christ's sacrifice and calls us to join our Savior in sacrificing ourselves for Him and for His Father's kingdom. Not easy, but this is the way of the Lord! The Ten Commandments call us to a way of life that is out of tune with our modern society and what social media teach - and, to some degree, society is "out of tune" with the ways of God. Honesty, respect for parents, faithfulness to a spouse, respect for property, putting God before all personal matters, giving Jesus one day a week - are all ways that we are distinct from others. To be distinct, to be separate for the Lord, is what we mean when we say, "We are called to be holy." I want to leave with you the words of the sinner turned convert St. Augustine: "Our Lord's driving out of the temple people who were seeking their own ends, who came to the temple to buy and sell, is symbolic. For if that temple was a symbol it obviously follows that the Body of Christ, the true temple of which the other was an image, has within it some who are buyers and sellers, or in other words, people who are seeking their own interests and not those of Jesus Christ. But the temple was not destroyed by the people who wanted to turn the house of God into a den of thieves, and neither will those who choose evil lives in the Catholic Church and do all they can to convert God's house into a robber's den succeed in destroying the temple. The time will come when they will be driven out by a whip made of their own sins." May this third week of Lent be an opportunity for us to pray for those fallen away, and for those who are far from living the Commandments of God.


