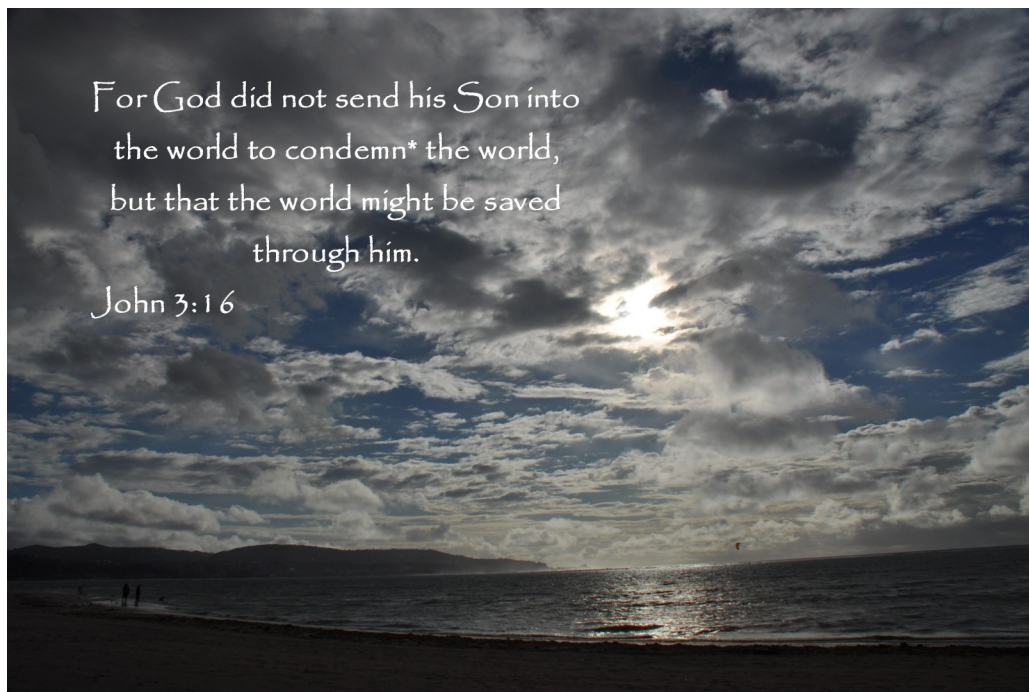

Suspicious Emails and IT Reminder - Still a problem.

We have received calls and emails about fraudulent emails being received by people from a spam account using Archbishop Gregory's or other priests' names. Please note that the archbishop will not communicate a need for assistance in this way. At this point we are unable to stop these emails as these fraudulent email accounts are outside of the ADW domain. Please be diligent in not responding to suspicious emails. Pastors and parish staff are asked to communicate this as well to parishioners.

Additionally, please keep IT Security in your minds. Pay special attention to suspicious emails. The Archdiocese is seeing an increase in spam and scams. The US Attorney General is warning us about these coronavirus scams: Individuals and businesses selling fake cures for COVID-19 online and engaging in other forms of fraud; Phishing emails from entities posing as the World Health Organization, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, and other health organizations; Malicious websites and apps that appear to share Coronavirus-related information to gain and lock access to your devices until payment is received; Seeking donations fraudulently for illegitimate or non-existent charitable organizations; Medical providers obtaining patient information for COVID-19 testing and then using that information to fraudulently bill for other tests and procedures.

A Letter from Fr. Pablo Bonello

Dear Parishioners,

All human lives matter, whether black, white, yellow... This obvious fact is so often neglected, attacked, despised and unprotected. In many ways. Think about abortion, euthanasia, addictions to alcohol, drugs, pornography, iPhone, tablets, and so on.

Still, black people have borne a weight for centuries. It is particularly painful when their lives seem to not matter, and even insulting. And the reactions we have seen these days, even though it is not correct, at least we understand that it's possible. Especially when we see such a humiliating death.

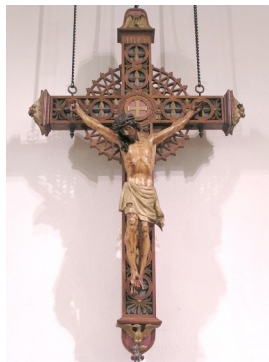
Sorry, I don't have more words to share. Silence, respect, perplexity...
