

John 20:1-9


On the first day of the week, Mary of Magdala came to the tomb early in the morning, while it was still dark, and saw the stone removed from the tomb. So she ran and went to Simon Peter and to the other disciple whom Jesus loved, and told them, “They have taken the Lord from the tomb, and we don’t know where they put him.”

So Peter and the other disciple went out and came to the tomb. They both ran, but the other disciple ran faster than Peter and arrived at the tomb first; he bent down and saw the burial cloths there, but did not go in. When Simon Peter arrived after him, he went into the tomb and saw the burial cloths there, and the cloth that had covered his head, not with the burial cloths but rolled up in a separate place. Then the other disciple also went in, the one who had arrived at the tomb first, and he saw and believed. For they did not yet understand the Scripture that he had to rise from the dead.

A Letter from Fr. Pablo Bonello

Dear Parishioners!

Happy Easter!! We are grateful to God, for the gift of Redemption, for His Cross, and for His Resurrection.

We were captives and Jesus set us free; we are not slaves anymore, because we were given the grace of taking part in His Death and Resurrection: we also died and rose: we died to sin, and we rose to grace. His Cross delivered us from sin and death; His Resurrection infused in us a new life, the life of grace. From now on, the light of faith guides us, the power of hope delivers from fear, and the fire of love inspires our lives.

Our Liturgy sings, *Dux vitae mortuus (est), regnat vivus*; we could translate as follows: The King of Life was dead, but now, He reigns full of life. His kingdom did not disappear at His death, because His Body was not separated from His Divinity –it was only from His Soul. Now, thanks to His Resurrection His Body is also full of life of glory, and this life will be given to our bodies on the day of the Final Resurrection. That’s why St. Paul tells us that Jesus rose as the First One. Others are coming, and we are there, unless we return to our former ways.

Let us rejoice today! The Feast is prolonged during this week; and then we will contemplate this new life during the Easter Time, to crown it with the Feast of Pentecost.

May God bless you all!

Let us thank God that we were able to celebrate the mysteries with an open Church!
