**Gospel**  
**John 20:1-9**

On the evening of that first day of the week, when the doors were locked, where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood in their midst and said to them, “Peace be with you.” When he had said this, he showed them his hands and his side.

The disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord.

Jesus said to them again, “Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you.”

And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, “Receive the Holy Spirit.

Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained.”

Thomas, called Didymus, one of the Twelve, was not with them when Jesus came.

So the other disciples said to him, “We have seen the Lord.”

But he said to them, “Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands and put my finger into the nailmarks and put my hand into his side, I will not believe.”

Now a week later his disciples were again inside and Thomas was with them.

Jesus came, although the doors were locked, and stood in their midst and said, “Peace be with you.”

Then he said to Thomas, “Put your finger here and see my hands, and bring your hand and put it into my side, and do not be unbelieving, but believe.”

Thomas answered and said to him, “My Lord and my God!”

Jesus said to him, “Have you come to believe because you have seen me?

Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed.”

Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples that are not written in this book. But these are written that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that through this belief you may have life in his name.

**The Church Celebrates the Family**



On March 19, 2021, the Church celebrates the fifth anniversary of the publication of Pope Francis’s apostolic exhortation *Amoris Laetitia*, on the beauty and joy of love in the family. On this same day, Pope Francis will launch the year “Amoris Laetitia Family,” which will conclude on June 26, 2022, during the X Meeting of Families in Rome with the Holy Father.

Pope Francis announced the year of “Amoris Laetitia Family during his Angelus Message on the Feast of the Holy Family on December 27, 2020. He ended his address invoking the Blessed Mother, “May the Virgin Mary grant that families

throughout the world be increasingly fascinated by the evangelical ideal of the Holy Family, so as to become a leaven of [a] new humanity and of a genuine and universal solidarity.”

## *A Letter from Fr. Pablo Bonello*

Dear Parishioners,

Having celebrated the Holy Triduum of the Death and Resurrection of Christ, we resume our reading of the Encyclical *Ecclesia De Eucharistia*, chapter 4. The Pope explains that the Eucharist realizes a double union in us: union with God, and union with our neighbor. Now, our chapter declares that two dimensions exist in this union with God: invisible and visible. St. John Paul II: *The sacrament is an expression of this bond of communion both in its **invisible dimension**, which in Christ and through the working of the Holy Spirit unites us to the Father and among ourselves, and in its **visible** which entails communion in the teachings of the Apostles, in the sacraments, and in the Church's hierarchical order.* (*Ecclesia De Eucharistia*, 35)

Our Encyclical explains that the invisible dimension of our union with God is the result of two gifts: sanctifying grace and theological virtues. Grace make us partakers of the divine nature and infused virtues make us partakers in the life of God. Sanctifying grace consecrates the deepest region of our soul, where all powers are rooted (called “substance of the soul” by the Scholars); theological virtues sanctify the spiritual powers of our soul: faith sanctifies our intelligence; hope and charity, our will.

In the words of St. John Paul II: *Invisible communion, though by its nature always growing, presupposes the life of **grace**, by which we become “partakers of the divine nature” (2 Pet 1:4), and the practice of the **virtues** of faith, hope and love. Only in this way do we have true communion with the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit.* (Paragraph 36)

The appropriate nourishment of this supernatural life is precisely the Eucharist.

Thus, union with God is deepened at Mass –especially at the moment of Holy Communion. The celebrant presents the consecrated Host: “The Body of Christ”, he says; and we respond “Amen”. We mean: “I believe in Christ”; “I hope in Christ”; “I love Christ”. It is the living act of faith, inspired by grace, charity and hope.

And we can exercise our faith, hope and charity in this way, because we are spiritually **alive**; because we are in state of grace. Because we enjoy a participation in God's nature and in His life; life of knowledge, of power, and of love: supernatural light, strength, and fire. And we are grateful to Him.
