## *Gospel*

*Mark 14:12-16, 22-26*

On the first day of the Feast of Unleavened Bread, when they sacrificed the Passover lamb, Jesus' disciples said to him, "Where do you want us to go and prepare for you to eat the Passover?"

He sent two of his disciples and said to them, "Go into the city and a man will meet you, carrying a jar of water. Follow him. Wherever he enters, say to the master of the house, 'The Teacher says, "Where is my guest room where I may eat the Passover with my disciples?"' Then he will show you a large upper room furnished and ready. Make the preparations for us there."

The disciples then went off, entered the city, and found it just as he had told them; and they prepared the Passover. While they were eating, he took bread, said the blessing, broke it, gave it to them, and said, "Take it; this is my body." Then he took a cup, gave thanks, and gave it to them, and they all drank from it. He said to them, "This is my blood of the covenant, which will be shed for many. Amen, I say to you, I shall not drink again the fruit of the vine until the day when I drink it new in the kingdom of God."

Then, after singing a hymn, they went out to the Mount of Olives.

## ***Joint Statement of Bishops of the Province of Baltimore and the Archdiocese of Washington Lifts General Mass Dispensation***

WASHINGTON, D.C. – On June 2, Washington Cardinal Wilton Gregory and the Bishops of the Province of Baltimore issued a [joint statement](#) lifting the general dispensation from the obligation of Catholics to attend Mass on Sunday and Holy Days, beginning the weekend of June 26 and 27.

The statement is signed by Cardinal Gregory of the Archdiocese of Washington; Archbishop William E. Lori of the Archdiocese of Baltimore; Bishop Michael F. Burbidge of the Diocese of Arlington; Bishop Barry C. Knestout of the Diocese of Richmond; Bishop Mark E. Brennan of the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston; and Bishop William Francis Malooly, Apostolic Administrator of the Diocese of Wilmington.

The statement notes that, due to the decline in the number of new cases of COVID-19 and the return to some sense of normalcy in the region, the dispensation of the Sunday and Holy Days Mass obligation is lifted, and the Catholic faithful are invited and encouraged to return to full, in-person participation in the Sacrament of the Eucharist.

“This obligation does not apply to those who are ill; those who have reason to believe that they were recently exposed to the coronavirus, another serious or contagious illness; those who are confined to their home, a hospital, or nursing facility; or those with serious underlying health conditions,” the signees note.

“Let us continue to be united in prayer for one another and for an end to the global pandemic,” the letter concludes. Read the full letter [here](#). ([En Español](#)).

## *A Letter from Fr. Pablo Bonello*

Dear Parishioners,

We celebrate the feast of the Eucharist by contemplating Mary Most Holy, who is the best Model of Eucharistic devotion.

First of all, because the Son of God took a human body from Her, the human Body that would be given to the Church, hidden, in the Sacrament.

Secondly, because we will not know the Eucharist unless we believe, and Mary is Model of Faith. She was asked for faith, when the Angel came to Her; and She responded to God with an act of faith to the words of St. Gabriel: *I am the Servant of the Lord, let it be done according to your word*: according to the word that came from St. Gabriel, words that Mary heard and believed, because faith comes from hearing, St. Paul says.

Something similar takes place with the sacrament of the Eucharist. At the Incarnation the Son of God came to us **hidden** in the human nature; in the Eucharist, Jesus comes to us, **hidden** in the consecrated Bread and Wine. Just as the Blessed Virgin **believed** the coming of the Son in the humility of our flesh, now She also **believes** at His sacramental coming in the veils of bread and wine. And we are also invited **to believe** –with Her, and in Her.

On the day of the Annunciation St. Gabriel invited Mary to make an act of faith before **the mystery of the Incarnation**; at Mass the minister invites us to make an act of faith before **the mystery of the Eucharist**. Mary said, *let it be done*: it is Her act of faith. At Holy Communion we say “*Amen*”: it is our act of faith.

In the words of St. John Paul II:

*“there is a profound analogy between the **Fiat** [i.e., “let it be done”], which Mary said in reply to the angel, and the **Amen** which every believer says when receiving the body of the Lord. Mary was asked to believe that the One whom she conceived “through the Holy Spirit” was “the Son of God” (Lk 1:30-35). In continuity with the Virgin's faith, in the Eucharistic mystery we are asked to believe that the same Jesus Christ, Son of God and Son of Mary, becomes present in his full humanity and divinity under the signs of bread and wine.” (Ecclesia de Eucharistia, 55)*

We do it every Sunday, and whenever we receive Holy Communion. With Mary and in Her spirit, we also believe!

Happy *Corpus Christi* Day!!
