John 6:1-15

Jesus went across the Sea of Galilee. A large crowd followed him, because they saw the signs he was performing on the sick.

Jesus went up on the mountain, and there he sat down with his disciples.

The Jewish feast of Passover was near.

When Jesus raised his eyes and saw that a large crowd was coming to him, he said to Philip, “Where can we buy enough food for them to eat?”

He said this to test him, because he himself knew what he was going to do.

Philip answered him, “Two hundred days’ wages worth of food would not be enough for each of them to have a little.”

One of his disciples, Andrew, the brother of Simon Peter, said to him, “There is a boy here who has five barley loaves and two fish; but what good are these for so many?”

Jesus said, “Have the people recline.”

Now there was a great deal of grass in that place. So the men reclined, about five thousand in number.

Then Jesus took the loaves, gave thanks, and distributed them to those who were reclining, and also as much of the fish as they wanted. When they had had their fill, he said to his disciples, “Gather the fragments left over, so that nothing will be wasted.” So they collected them, and filled twelve wicker baskets with fragments from the five barley loaves that had been more than they could eat.

When the people saw the sign he had done, they said, “This is truly the Prophet, the one who is to come into the world.”

Since Jesus knew that they were going to come and carry him off to make him king, he withdrew again to the mountain alone.

World Day For Grandparents and Elderly



Pope Francis has established throughout the Church the [celebration of the World Day for Grandparents and Elderly](#) beginning in 2021 on the fourth Sunday of July, near the liturgical memorial of Saints Joachim and Anne, the grandparents of Jesus.

The announcement of this celebration coincides with the celebration of the Year of Amoris Laetitia Family, which began on the Solemnity of Saint Joseph the husband of Mary, on March 19, 2021, and will conclude at the World Meeting of Families in Rome in June of 2022.

“It is important for grandparents to meet their grandchildren and for grandchildren to meet their grandparents, because — as the prophet Joel says — grandparents, before their grandchildren, will dream, and have illusions [great desires], and young people, taking strength from their grandparents, will go forward and prophesy.” — Pope Francis, January 31, 2021

A Letter from Fr. Pablo Bonello

Dear Parishioners,

The Eucharistic memorial makes present everything that is essential to the sacrifice of the Cross: the oblation of Christ, His charity, our Redemption, and also His Mother.

At every Mass she continues to welcome us as her children; at every Mass we welcome her as our Mother:

- Mary welcomes us with everything that exists in our hearts: our sorrows and joys, our dreams and resolutions, our conversion and good works.
- And we welcome Mary with everything that existed in her Heart at the moment of the Cross: her sorrows, her faith, her hope, her charity, her humility, her fortitude, and all her virtues.

Why? Because at Mass we experience the memorial of Christ's death:

Experiencing the memorial of Christ's death in the Eucharist also means continually receiving this gift. It means accepting – like John – the one who is given to us anew as our Mother. It also means taking on a commitment to be conformed to Christ, putting ourselves at the school of his Mother and allowing her to accompany us. (Ecclesia de Eucharistia, 57)

At Mass we **receive** Mary, we **accept** her as our Mother, we **conform ourselves** to Jesus by putting ourselves **at the school of Mary**, and allowing her to **accompany** us.

And we do this because:

*Mary **is present**, with the Church and as the **Mother** of the Church, at each of our celebrations of the Eucharist. If the Church and the Eucharist are inseparably united, the same ought to be said of Mary and the Eucharist. (Ibidem)*
