

## ***Gospel***

***Luke 6:27-38***

Jesus said to his disciples: “To you who hear I say, love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who mistreat you. To the person who strikes you on one cheek, offer the other one as well, and from the person who takes your cloak, do not withhold even your tunic. Give to everyone who asks of you, and from the one who takes what is yours do not demand it back. Do to others as you would have them do to you. For if you love those who love you, what credit is that to you? Even sinners love those who love them. And if you do good to those who do good to you, what credit is that to you? Even sinners do the same. If you lend money to those from whom you expect repayment, what credit is that to you? Even sinners lend to sinners, and get back the same amount. But rather, love your enemies and do good to them, and lend expecting nothing back; then your reward will be great and you will be children of the Most High, for he himself is kind to the ungrateful and the wicked. Be merciful, just as your Father is merciful.

“Stop judging and you will not be judged. Stop condemning and you will not be condemned. Forgive and you will be forgiven. Give, and gifts will be given to you; a good measure, packed together, shaken down, and overflowing, will be poured into your lap. For the measure with which you measure will in return be measured out to you.”

### ***Lent is coming!***

***Ash Wednesday is Tuesday, March 2, 2022***

Lent is a 40 day season of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving that begins on Ash Wednesday and ends at sundown on Holy Thursday. It's a period of preparation to celebrate the Lord's Resurrection at Easter. During Lent, we seek the Lord in prayer by reading Sacred Scripture; we serve by [giving alms](#); and we practice self-control through [fasting](#). We are called not only to abstain from luxuries during Lent, but to a true inner conversion of heart as we seek to follow Christ's will more faithfully. We recall the waters of baptism in which we were also baptized into Christ's death, died to sin and evil, and began new life in Christ.

## Letter from our Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

At Mass we worship God with a special hymn. The whole Church sings: “*Glory to God in the highest and peace on earth to people of good will.*” The *Gloria* is a very ancient hymn composed probably in the fourth century. Still, it did not become a common part of Sunday Mass in the West until the eighth century.

The *Gloria* develops the hymn that the Angels sang in Bethlehem. The *Gloria* contains an introduction (the angelic hymn), two main sections, the first one praises God the Father, and the second one glorifies God the Son, and a conclusion that mentions the Three Persons of the Blessed Trinity. As we can see, our hymn is focused on God the Father and Christ. A scholar writes: “God and Christ are the pillars of the Christian order of the universe: God, the beginning and the end of all things, towards whom all religious seeking is bent and all prayer eventually is turned; but in the Christian order, also Christ the way, the road on which all our God-seeking must be directed.” (J. Jungmann S.J., *The Mass of the Roman Rite* Vol I, pages 350-351).

The angels glorified God and regarded men of good will, and so does the *Gloria*: to God, glory; to men, peace. God is praised; and also that Man in whom the peace of heaven was brought to earth. It seems that in a short future we will be able to sing the hymn again, which should be more appropriate. However, either we recite or sing it, let us keep in mind that with the angels we worship God the Father and the Man of Good Will, Jesus Christ.

We worship God and we sing our faith!

### ***Did You Know?*** **St. Bartholomew**



The Bible and a flaying knife are signs for [Saint Bartholomew](#). He had firm faith in the word of God, which he preached freely. He met his martyrdom by being [flayed alive](#).

[Saint Bartholomew Quick Fact](#): also known as Nathaniel, converted Polymius to the King of Armenia.

He is regarded as the founder and martyr of the Armenian Church. However, tradition says that he preached in India, and his death seems to have taken place there. He died as a martyr for his Lord. He was [flayed alive with knives](#).
