### Cardinal Gregory issues decree to implement Pope Francis' Traditionis Custodes Norms take effect September 21, 2022

WASHINGTON, D.C. – Cardinal Wilton Gregory today released a decree with the Liturgical Norms for the implementation in The Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Washington of <u>Traditionis Custodes</u>, an apostolic letter issued moto proprio ("on his own impulse") by Pope Francis in July 2021. Traditionis Custodes, which means "Guardians of the Tradition," contains a set of norms for the celebration of what is popularly known as the Traditional Latin Mass.

The decree from Cardinal Gregory states that, effective September 21, 2022, three non-parochial churches are designated as locations where the Mass according to the 1962 Roman Missal may be celebrated on Sundays.

#### They are:

- The Chapel at St. John the Evangelist Parish in Forest Glen, Maryland
- The Franciscan Monastery of the Holy Land in Washington, D.C.
- The Mission Church of St. Dominic in Aquasco, Maryland.

In his letter, Cardinal Gregory explains that "...as my predecessors in the Archdiocese of Washington have followed the intentions of the Holy Father in regards to the celebration of the Mass according to the 1962 Roman Missal, I, too, desire to follow the path most recently traced out for us by Pope Francis. In reflecting on Traditionis Custodes and the letter the Holy Father wrote accompanying this motu proprio, and on his recent apostolic letter, Desiderio Desideravi, on the liturgical formation of the People of God, it is clear that the Holy Father's sincere intention is to bring about greater unity in the Church through the celebration of the Mass and sacraments according to the 1970 Roman Missal of Pope Paul VI, which was the fruit of the renewal in the liturgy that the Second Vatican Council called for. However, it is also my desire, following the intention of Pope Francis, to ensure that those who celebrate the Mass according to the 1962 Missal continue to be provided for in our archdiocese, a plea that was expressed in our Synod listening sessions."

#### Letter from our Pastor

#### Dear Parishioners,

The Introduction to the Missal highlights one aspect of the Profession of Faith, that we cannot neglect. The Church connects her faith with the Paschal Mystery of Christ, and with its sacrament, which is the Eucharist. Faith in the blessed Trinity, in the mysteries of the Incarnation, Passion and Glory of Christ, and in His Church are proclaimed in advance, before they are made present in the Sacrament.

All the mysteries we believe in, are fulfilled in Jesus crucified: He glorifies the <u>Father</u>, He is sanctified by the <u>Spirit</u>; He assumed a <u>human nature</u> to offer it in <u>sacrifice</u> under Pontius Pilate, suffering indescribable torments. At the same time Jesus crucified looks to the <u>future</u>: His Paradise, His Second Coming, when all flesh shall see the salvation of God. On Mount Calvary, Jesus also looks at the <u>present</u> time: His Church, with the members of His Mystical Body, that is, the Blessed Virgin Mary, St. John, the pious women.

Thus, we may say that the Profession of faith is contained in Jesus Crucified. Since the Eucharist is the Sacred Sign, that is, the Sacrament of the Cross, it follows that our whole faith is also contained in the Sacrament, which not in vain is called: "The Mystery of Faith".

The Introduction to the Sacramentary explains:

The purpose of the Symbolum or Profession of Faith, is that the whole gathered people... may call to mind and confess the great mysteries of the faith by reciting the rule of faith in a formula approved for liturgical use, before these mysteries are celebrated in the Eucharist (paragraph 67)

On Sundays and special feasts, we confess our faith, and we linked it to the Sacrament. It is a triad: Mystery-Faith-Eucharist.
