



□ *Gospel*
Luke 20:27-38

Some Sadducees, those who deny that there is a resurrection, came forward and put this question to Jesus, saying, "Teacher, Moses wrote for us, *If someone's brother dies leaving a wife but no child, his brother must take the wife and raise up descendants for his brother.* Now there were seven brothers; the first married a woman but died childless. Then the second and the third married her, and likewise all the seven died childless. Finally the woman also died. Now at the resurrection whose wife will that woman be? For all seven had been married to her."

Jesus said to them, "The children of this age marry and remarry; but those who are deemed worthy to attain to the coming age and to the resurrection of the dead neither marry nor are given in marriage. They can no longer die, for they are like angels; and they are the children of God because they are the ones who will rise. That the dead will rise even Moses made known in the passage about the bush, when he called out 'Lord,' the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob; and he is not God of the dead, but of the living, for to him all are alive."



Now in his 60th year as a priest, Msgr. Joaquin Bazan remembers a lesson he learned from the pastor at his first parish assignment in 1962. "One thing he emphasized and did himself, was visiting all the families," said Msgr. Bazan, who is now 85. He added, "I've done that ever since to know the people. That's what we're all about. Each place I was at, I visited all the homes," He noted that was a way to get to know people personally and understand their lives and the challenges they were facing. Sometimes he would bless their homes. "I didn't have an agenda," he said.

Summarizing his priestly ministry to the people he served over the years, Msgr. Bazan said, "I just wanted to be kind to them... I haven't done anything spectacular. All I've done is be there (for them)."

Letter from our Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

The Eucharistic Prayer begins with the Preface and concludes with the “Amen”, which is usually sung. The heart of this prayer are the words of consecration that the priest pronounces in the person of Christ.

The Eucharistic Prayer begins with the Preface. We know the solemn invitation to prayer: it is a dialogue between the minister and the assembly. After the initial greeting, the faithful are invited to lift up their hearts, so that their thoughts might be focused on God, and not on earth. At this point we are not on earth but we connect with heaven. Now, the priest can say: “Let us give thanks to the Lord”, and we respond, “It is right and just”. “This formula existed in the Roman Empire. The people responded with this formula to the decisions made by the senate: “*dignum et iustum est*”. The Church recognizes that gratitude to God is “right” and “just”. It is “right”, because gratitude towards God is supposed to be our attitude before God. Thanksgiving is also “just”, because it is an act of the virtue of “justice”. We give to God what is due to Him: our gratitude for His gifts.

With this dialogue, the Church is prepared for the “Eucharist”, a Greek word that precisely means “thanksgiving”.

I will offer to thee the sacrifice of thanksgiving, and will call upon the name of the LORD (Ps 116: 17). This is the sacrifice of thanksgiving: Jesus Crucified. His Thanksgiving reconciled us with God, His thanksgiving raises up, strengthens, makes us grow in love, because love is its origin, and love is its last end.
