

# What's Pastor Thinking

I hope that your summer so far has been blessed with many special moments and that you

have been able to switch gear a little. It's hard to believe it's August already! I really enjoyed my vacation this year and was delighted to get a break from the routine. However on returning you hardly get from the car to the front door when all the benefits of vacation days drain away. So its back to routine and responsibilities.

Today's gospel has a lot to do with leisure, with living, and with getting a fresh perspective on things. It's a story about this person whose land produces a bumper crop. No problems so far. If there is a problem its a good problem - he's blessed with abundance. So Jesus tells us the man demolishes his existing buildings in order to make room for the surplus crop. Still no problems with his actions. He's worked hard and we're delighted for his success.

But then Jesus lets us overhear this person as he begins to talk to himself; a sort of brain to wallet to soul meeting. 'You've made it! You've really made it! Now is the time to really start living—eat drink, and be merry!'

However another voice breaks into this person's thought. 'Fool,' says God. 'Tonight your soul will be required. So then who'll get your things?'

Seems to be a straightforward story about greed. But there is something more here. Something much larger than greed. Something to do with the way we view life and death. The fool apparently believed what so many people believe today, that you only go around once in life—and that the only life we have is the here and now. 'Not so sure about Heaven, don't care much about eternity. Make a killing and enjoy it now, because we sure won't be able to enjoy it after we're dead.'

You and I could hold that attitude, but the Gospel reminds us that though we live in the world like everyone else, life does not consist of things, but in our relationship with God. As Catholics we have pledged ourselves to another, Jesus —by our baptism and participation in His Church. We are truly free to make our living, rise in our careers, raise children, bury our dead - all within the larger awareness that God has more riding on us than just this life.

Eat, drink, and be merry! That's what summers and families are about. But when it comes to how we view this world, well — eat, drink, and be wise — for tomorrow you live!

#### LITURGY CORNER



Here are the couplets and meditations for each station from My Sunday Missal. I hope they bring back memories for many, and provide spiritual meditation for all as you follow the Stations of the Cross.

## Jesus is condemned to die. "God, through sin I crucify"

Mary, sorrowing, hears the death sentence: "Crucify Him, His Blood be on us." O! Mary, hear my prayer: "Blood of Jesus, be my redemption."

Jesus bears the bitter cross "Bear me up in grief and loss."

Mary, uncomplaining, sees the Precious Blood flow from the wound in His Shoulder. O! Mary, help me to shoulder my cross patiently, in union with Jesus.

## Jesus falls in blood and woe, "Sins of mine have struck Him low."

Mary, sore-distressed, sees the parched earth quickly drink up His Red Life. O! Mary, when my soul is parched by earthly desires, recall to me the words of Christ, "He who believes in Me shall never thirst."

#### Son and Mother meet in pain, "Must they grieve for me in vain?"

Mary, broken-hearted, sees Jesus in agony. Jesus sees her in anguish. O! Mary, inspire me with contrition and penance for causing such sorrow.

## Simon helps to bear the load "Lead me, too, along Thy road."

Mary, bewildered, sees all refusing to help Jesus. O! Mary, even as I ask Jesus to help me, may He ever find me ready in Catholic Action for home and foreign missions.

### On a cloth He prints His face "In my soul Thine image trace."

Mary, calm in grief, sees Veronica brave the fury of "the crowd". O! Mary, by the grace of Confirmation may I never fear what the "crowd" may say or think.

## Struck to earth by me "Help me rise to follow Thee."

Mary, in pain untold, sees the cross crush Jesus, yet He rises. O! Mary, obtain for me the strength to rise and follow Christ as my Leader.

### Weep for sin, He tells them here "Jesus make my grief sincere."

Mary, suffering, sees Jesus suffer from desertion by His own, yet even now He comforts others. O! Mary, fill me with zeal for the spiritual works of mercy.

## Thrice He falls by lashes torn "In Thy Blood I rise reborn."

Mary, crushed in spirit, sees Jesus prostrate in the dust. O! Mary, lest I fail again, help me to prepare worthily and make proper Thanksgiving at Confession and Communion.

## Stripping Christ they tear His skin "Help me tear my flesh from sin."

Mary, torn from Christ, sees Him torn from the robe she made for Him. O! Mary, strip me from all that stains my baptismal robe.

#### In His hands they drive the nail "In Thy hands I cannot fail."

Mary, pierced anew, sees wells of His Redeeming Blood dug in His Hands and Feet. O! Mary, in His Wounds help me renew my baptismal vows and with those nails bind me to Jesus forever.

#### Jesus dies His all to give "By Thy death teach me to live."

Mary, overwhelmed, sees Jesus die, His Bleeding Wounds pleading for me. O! Mary, place one drop of that Redeeming Blood on my sinful soul.

### Mary, as you take your Son "Take me too when life is done,"

Mary, mourning, receives her dead Jesus from the altar of the cross. O Mary, help me to receive the living Christ from the altar of the Mass with something of your reverence and love.

#### Buried Christ Who died for me "May I rest at last in Thee."

Mary, now desolate, buries in death the Son to Whom she once gave birth. O! Mary, renew thy motherhood over me now and at the hour of my death, Amen.

#### Luke 12:13-21



Today's readings aren't simply about swollen bank accounts, the futility of life, or a literal understanding of the old spiritual value of despising the things of earth. They are about perspective, proportion, true riches, gospel values, and the challenge of being Christian all the way down to our toes.2

Jesus is asked to arbitrate a fraternal dispute over an inheritance. Jewish law was very clear in these matters but Jesus perceived the covetousness that lay at the bottom of this man's request and he responded with a parable on the danger of riches.12

Greed or avarice, which is an inordinate seeking for riches, is one of the capital sins. These sins are not always designated as mortal sins. Their preeminence in evil is not based on their gravity but rather on their power of attraction. They are like magnets for other sins because they make self the center and goal of everything else. Avarice, the excessive desire for money or any kind of wealth, is also a very frequent cause of many other sins, because wealth provides every kind of evil opportunity. 15 The Tenth Commandment forbids greed or avarice arising from a passion for riches and their attendant power. 5 (CCC 2552) The antidote is to love the time we have, the gifts we have, the people in our lives, and to spend all we have in the service of God and neighbor. 2

Life is a gift of God and no amount of possessions, however abundant, can make it greater or give it security.14 Note that "I" is used six times in this parable and "my" is used three times. These are self-ish words. In other words, he will indulge in earthly pleasures and comforts. The foolish man hoards his resources, makes them the basis for his security and then adds laziness to his greed. Death will expose his folly by stripping him of all that he owns.12 This is a harsh rebuke for someone unconcerned with God or his Law.12

St. Athanasius commented on this passage: "A person who lives as if he were to die every day—given that our life is uncertain by definition—will not sin, for good fear extinguishes most of the disorder of our appetites; whereas, he who thinks he has a long life ahead of him will easily let himself be dominated by pleasures." Pope Paul VI wrote: BOTH FOR NATIONS AND FOR INDIVIDUALS, AVARICE IS THE MOST EVIDENT FORM OF MORAL UNDERDEVELOPMENT."13 When earthly riches are possessed or pursued covetously, they lessen faith, tend to harden the heart, incline to overindulgence, make us heedless to the claims and needs of others, and link us in many ways to the perishable. The way to grow rich in what matters to God is to lay up spiritual treasures like faith, hope, charity, love of others, purity of body and soul, honesty, patience, resignation to our lot and to God's will, and the like. These riches we do not give up at death, but carry with us into the next world.

## Increasing Global Hostility & Restrictions on Religion Part 1

A recent Pew Research report said 52 governments, including Russia & China, impose high levels of restrictions on religion, up from 40 governments in 2007. This includes violence, harassment, and pressure to convert.

The U.S. State Department hosted a 3-day meeting, attended by hundreds of government officials and religious leaders from over 100 countries from all regions of the world, in response to this crisis. They referenced the most recent atrocities that are ongoing and that 83% of the world continues to live in places where religious freedom is under threat or alto-

gether absent. The most persecuted group by numbers are 250 million Christians worldwide.


Anglican Bishop Philip Mounstephen, acknowledging this shocking figure, said, "I don't for one minute want to ignore the way that members of other faith groups are persecuted...But ...the Christian faith today is the one global faith, and this is a global phenomenon that we're facing." He blamed political correctness, saying, "I think there's a failure to recognize that the Christian faith is predominantly a global faith... and that we've turned a blind eye when we really shouldn't have, and we've failed to live up to our moral responsibilities in this whole area."

"Almost every faith that's a majority somewhere is a minority somewhere else and often gets persecuted," said Sam Brownback, U.S. Ambassador for International Religious Freedom. "This (meeting) is not an exercise in trying to achieve a universal theology. We want everyone to come together around the concept that religious freedom at all times is everyone's right."

The speakers described the suffering of faith communities worldwide, while they also embraced the universal, welcoming solidarity and support from other faith communities & countries.

The name is derived from John 2:1-12, the wedding feast at Cana in Galilee, where Jesus performed the miracle of turning water into wine. Pre-Cana is led by a priest or deacon with support from married Catholic couples.






