THE CHURCH OF ST. AIDAN IS OPEN

Daily 6:00 AM to 6:00 PM. Daily Mass can be viewed on staidanparish.org, Facebook and Vimeo. The faithful are required to attend Sunday and Holy Days of Obligation Masses. This obligation does not apply to those who are ill, those who are confined to their home, a hospital, or nursing facility, or those with serious underlying health conditions. Masks are no longer required and are optional when participating in any activities on parish grounds.

PARKING AT ST. AIDAN

As you are aware the number of parking spaces is limited at St. Aidan. The parking lot at the rear of the Upper School and the one on Dover Street are available on weekends and when school is closed. The Lower School has an area that is designated a children's play area. For safety reasons please do not park there. People with disabilities may park in the three reserved parking spaces in front of the rectory on Willis Ave. This special area is needed for church access by people who use wheelchairs and specially-equipped vehicles. Thank you for being parking considerate.

RECEIVING HOLY COMMUNION

Holy Communion unites us more closely to Jesus, and it is also a sign that we are living in communion with His Church, following the teachings that Jesus has handed down to us. One

should only receive Holy Communion if he believes what the Catholic Church teaches, and is living as a member of the Church, following the way of life that she sets out for her children. If one is conscious of serious sin, he should receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation before approaching Holy Communion.

CONFESSION

Confessions are available in the church, screen only, on Saturday from 12:30 PM to 1:30 PM and 4:00 PM to 5:00 PM. You can also make a confession appointment with a priest by calling the rectory office.

BAPTISM

To arrange a baptism contact the rectory at 516-746-6585. Forms need to be completed giving information on the parents, child's date and place of birth, as well as the names and religious affiliation of the sponsors. At least one sponsor must be a practicing Catholic. Baptisms are held on the 1st Sunday and 3rd Sunday at 1:30 PM. To hold a private baptism you must make arrangements with a priest or deacon to perform the baptism. Private baptisms are held on Saturday or Sunday when the church is available. First time parents are required to attend a Baptism Class. Classes are held in the church on the second Sunday of the month after the 12 Noon Mass. Parents are asked to gather at St. Joseph's statue to the right of the main altar.

MARRIAGE

Arrangements are to be made at the Rectory office at least 9 months in advance. Pre-Cana and FOCCUS registrations must be arranged.

ANOINTING


The anointing takes place at 1:00 PM on the 4th Sunday of each month. Please wait for the priest at Our Lady's Shrine.



MARCH 2ND ASH WEDNESDAY IS A DAY OF FAST AND ABSTINENCE

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence. For members of the Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.

DISTRIBUTION OF ASHES

- The distribution of ashes will take place at the end of the Mass or Prayer service.
- Those distributing ashes may wear a face mask (optional).
- In these times of Pandemic, ashes may be applied to the faithful by normal application with the thumb,

- or by sprinkling over the crown of the head. Both options will be available at St. Aidan. The minister or priest distributing the ashes will choose which way they to distribute ashes on their line.
- If the minister chooses the usual distribution of ashes with the thumb, masks may be worn. Also, they should sanitize their thumbs before the distribution of ashes begins and at the end of the distribution period.

The Congregation for Divine Worship and Discipline of the Sacraments has approved the sprinkling of ashes on the top of the recipient's head with no physical contact. This method of distributing ashes by sprinkling is a common practice in other countries, including at the Vatican, but was introduced in the United States during the time of pandemic.



GETTING MARRIED IN CHURCH

The Catholic Church has a long history of helping couples to prepare for marriage. It has learned a great deal that can benefit any couple, regardless of religion. Because the Catholic Church wants couples to form strong, lasting marriages, couples who wish to marry in the Catholic Church are asked to:

- Contact and meet with your parish priest as soon as you are engaged.
- Take at least six months to intensively prepare for your marriage. This goes beyond choosing a date and church, reserving a place for the reception, and picking out dresses. It means using this time to

- delve more deeply into your relationship and approach this momentous day with prayer and reflection.
- Attend an approved marriage preparation program. There are many different formats for marriage preparation programs ranging from intensive weekends, to a weekly series, to "in home" mentor couple programs. Catholic marriage preparation programs are usually presented by a team of lay married couples and a priest or deacon. They are not restricted to Catholics, but they are always in keeping with Church teaching.
- Most dioceses ask couples to take a marriage preparation inventory (such as FOCCUS). These are not "tests" to determine whether you can get married in the Church, but rather discussion starters to assess what issues you already agree on and what you might need to discuss further.

At the time of your engagement, the Church welcomes you to this sacrament of Marriage in the spirit of Jesus who said: 'This is my commandment: love one another as I love you. No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends.' (John 15:12-13)'

Each week the Family Mass continues to provide some materials to help children participate at Sunday Mass and to enhance follow-up during the week. The Magnifikids magazines are available on a weekly basis along with the Children's Worship Bulletins for ages 3 to 7 and ages 7 to 12. They are located in the Children's Corner racks in the main lobby of the Church. Please do not leave them in the pews.

Today is the Eighth Sunday in Ordinary
Time. The liturgical color is green. Each
week we have been focusing on a Word,
Phrase, or Short Sentence of the Week to
help to link the Sunday Gospel to Family
Life. This week's Short Sentence of the
Week is: LEARN TO LIVE LIKE JESUS.
Write the Short Sentence of the Week and

place it on your refrigerator as a reminder during the week.

Today's Gospel, (Luke 6:39-45), is a continuation of the Sermon on the Plain that began two weeks ago. In the previous gospels, Jesus described as "Blessed" those who may not have social standing or material things. Jesus then expanded His teaching by instructing His followers to do the very opposite of what the Jewish culture of the time subscribed to by loving one's enemies and not judging others. This week Jesus uses short parables to provide more concrete examples of how His followers should conduct themselves. Jesus' teaching is telling us not to be fooled by what we may think we see or hear. The second part of His message teaches us about examining our motives for the things we do and the choices we make. We are taught that if we really want to know what kind of person someone is, we should look at how he/she behaves and what kind of results flow from his/her actions and words. This is how we LEARN TO LIVE LIKE JESUS. This is how we will learn how to recognize the "good fruit" in and around us like the good tree in today's gospel, we are called to bear "good fruit."

The Catechism of the Catholic Church says, "In order to lead others to God, we as Catholics must first examine our own lives and adjust our conduct to match what we are saying in proclaiming the Good News of Christ. How we speak and act determines how we are judged in our own lives. (CCC,2472) When we strive to LEARN TO LIVE LIKE JESUS, we allow ourselves to become open to Jesus filling our hearts with good, holy, thoughts and deeds.

Children generally respond well to parables. By definition, a parable is a story meant to teach us a lesson. The story is told in a way that helps us to think about what the true message and lesson is about by using familiar images, scenarios, and facts. In this gospel, Jesus asks a series of questions such as, can one blind person lead another blind person? The questions in this gospel are straight

forward and not too difficult for most children to answer. Except for very young children, it should be easy to draw children's attention to the importance of practicing what we are preaching! To help children incorporate this message and connect with it, using situations as they arise within the family provides very current, concrete venues that can lead to the early stages of what we know as adults as examination of conscience. Keeping in mind the children lack a broad range of experiences, when conflicts, misunderstandings, or outright fights break out among siblings, these are the teachable moments that can prove to be most valuable. Real situations within the safety of the nuclear family can also help children identify with how they are feeling during the different stages of conflict resolution. For intermediate age children, tweens, and teens who are spending an increased amount of their time outside the nuclear family, reviewing challenging encounters with their friends can be opportunities to LEARN TO LIVE LIKE IESUS.


This week, remind younger children that a person's words and actions reflect what is in his/her heart. Have them illustrate and write good and kind words and actions on cut-out hearts. Invite them to hang up their hearts and /or use them as visual reminders during the week. Compose a list of kind and unkind words/phrases. Ask children to categorize them as either kind or unkind. Solicit some suggestions as to how to transform the unkind responses into kind ones. Brainstorm with children several ways that children their age can produce good fruit. How can they live as Jesus asks us to live? What are some actions that they can do in their daily activities that reflect God's love for everyone? write down some answers. Then have the children choose a fruit shape and write down one of the suggestions. Place the "fruit" into a small basket or on a drawing of a tree. Have children write down some things they know are characteristics of God. Then ask them about what good qualities they have. Invite children to look for some good

characteristics in other people and to share their own good characteristics with others. Talk with older children about the importance of examining our consciences each day to review our thoughts and actions. Since Lent is almost here, talk about how to examine one's conscience to prepare for the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Guide them through a very simple review using either prepared materials or using this gospel. Use the quote, "A good tree does not bear rotten fruit, nor does a rotten tree bear good fruit. For people do not pick figs from thorn bushes, nor do they gather grapes from brambles. A good person out of the store of goodness in his heart produces good, but an evil person out of the store of evil produces evil for from the fullness of the heart the mouth speaks" (Luke 6:43-45). Help older children ponder this passage and ask themselves to think about when they produced good fruit and when they missed opportunities God offered them.

There are many lessons to be learned in Luke's Sermon on the Plain. It calls each of us to a level of accountability that can be challenging for anyone at any age. The beauty of knowing Jesus is that we can embrace that each of us, in our human dignity given to us by God ,is a work in progress until He calls us back to Himself at the end of our earthly lives. In the meantime, God patiently offers us everything we need to LEARN TO LIVE LIKE JESUS. How Blessed Are We?

Jesus told his disciples a parable, "Can a blind person guide a blind person? Will not both fall into a pit? No disciple is superior to the teacher; but when fully trained, every

disciple will be like his teacher. Why do you notice the splinter in your brother's eye, but do not perceive the wooden beam in your own? How can you say to your brother, Brother, let me remove that splinter in your eye,' when you do not even notice the wooden beam in your own eye? You hypocrite! Remove the wooden beam from your eye first; then you will see clearly to remove the splinter in your brother's eye. "A good tree does not bear rotten fruit, nor does a rotten tree bear good fruit. For every tree is known by its own fruit. For people do not pick figs from thorn bushes, nor do they gather grapes from brambles. A good person out of the store of goodness in his heart produces good, but an evil person out of a store of evil produces evil; for from the fullness of the heart the mouth speaks."



The preamble to the GIRM which we saw last week is followed by three introductory explanatory sections before it gets into the actual meat of the document. The first of these is entitled "Testimony of an Unaltered Faith", and it affirms the sacrificial nature of the Mass as defined by the Council of Trent, citing its institution by Christ: "At the Last Supper, Our Saviour instituted the Eucharistic Sacrifice of his Body and Blood, by which the Sacrifice of his Cross is perpetuated until he comes again; and till then he entrusts the memorial of his Death and Resurrection to his beloved spouse, the Church." It explains why the words used by the priest are critical to this purpose: as the Priest says these prayers "in the name of all the people, he renders thanks and offers the living and holy sacrifice, that is, the Church's oblation and the sacrificial Victim by whose death God himself willed to reconcile us to himself; and the Priest also prays that the Body and Blood of Christ may be a sacrifice which is acceptable to the Father and which brings salvation to the whole world." Very specifically, he does this so that "the sacrifice of his Cross and its sacramental renewal in the Mass, which Christ the Lord instituted at the Last Supper and commanded his Apostles to do in his

memory, are one and the same, differing only in the manner of their offering; and as a result, that the Mass is at one and the same time a sacrifice of praise, thanksgiving, propitiation and satisfaction." In so doing, Vatican II reaffirms exactly what the Council of Trent declared to be a dogmatic truth, that the Real Presence of the Lord becomes present under the Eucharistic species of bread and wine. The GIRM continues to describe the role of the priests and bishops, but includes the laity, using words similar to those of St. Peter in 1 Pt 2:9 "But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's own people, in order that you may proclaim the mighty acts of him who called you out of darkness into his marvelous light." This sets the stage for some of what the Council opened up for the laity, for it adds "...the celebration of the Eucharist is the action of the whole Church, and in it each one should carry out solely but totally that which pertains to him, in virtue of the place of each within the People of God. The result of this is that greater consideration is also given to some aspects of the celebration that have sometimes been accorded less attention in the course of the centuries. For this people is the People of God, purchased by Christ's Blood, gathered together by the Lord, nourished by his word, the people called to present to God the prayers of the entire human family, a people that gives thanks in Christ for the mystery of salvation by offering his Sacrifice, a people, finally, that is brought together in unity by Communion in the Body and Blood of Christ." And this is critical to what Vatican II was trying to do, enable us all to participate more fully in the source and summit of our faith. Note that it does not say it changed anything from past teachings, it only says that it gives greater consideration to some aspects of the liturgy that had sometimes been given less attention. Which leads to the next section entitled "Uninterrupted Tradition". Here it looks back to Trent, noting how St. Pius V, much like the conclave at Vatican II, cited a restoration of some of the rites "to the original norm of the holy Fathers." Then as now, there were external issues affecting the Church (think of the Reformation, to which Trent was reacting) as well as some resistance to change within the Church itself. Hence, St. Pius V and the magisterium cited the truth of the Real

Presence and the return to older traditions and practices as they modified, and even then as now, only to a slight degree, the Missal then in use. In fact, they cited other ancient Roman and Ambrosian Sacramentaries among other documents. And Vatican II did the same thing: "In the same way, traditions of the first centuries, before the rites of East and West were formed, are now better known because of the discovery of so many liturgical documents. Furthermore, continuing progress in the study of the holy Fathers has also shed upon the theology of the mystery of the Eucharist the light brought by the doctrine of such illustrious Fathers of Christian antiquity as St. Irenaeus, St. Ambrose, St. Cyril of Jerusalem, and St. John Chrysostom. Hence, the "norm of the holy Fathers" requires not only the preservation of what our immediate forebears have handed on to us, but also an understanding and a more profound pondering of the Church's entire past ages and of all the ways in which her one faith has been expressed in forms of human and social culture so greatly differing among themselves". Which brings us the last section of the Introduction to the GIRM, "Accommodation to New Conditions". Here the Fathers of Vatican II noted that many things have changed during the intervening four centuries which could not have been foreseen at that time. One of these things concerned the use of the vernacular, that is, the use of local languages as opposed to Latin at the Mass. While Trent proscribed the use of the vernacular, it also ordered "... pastors of souls to put appropriate catechesis in its place: "lest Christ's flock go hungry... the Holy Synod commands pastors and each and all of those others having the care of souls that frequently during the celebration of Mass, either personally or through others, they should explain what is read at Mass; and expound, among other things, something of the mystery of this most holy Sacrifice, especially on Sundays and feast days." In compliance with this directive, Vatican II said "'not rarely adopting the vernacular language may be of great usefulness for the people' and gave permission for it to be used." It also ordered that some prescriptions of Trent which were not being followed, notably relating to homilies (remember that requirement for catechesis) be implemented. Other changes

were added in accordance with the same principle, such a greater participation of the laity and reception of Communion under both species, which "offers a particular opportunity for understanding more deeply the mystery in which the faithful participate. In this manner the Church, while remaining faithful to her office as teacher of truth, safeguarding "things old," that is, the deposit of tradition, fulfills at the same time the duty of examining and prudently adopting "things new". Similarly, some phraseology was modified "so that the language would be in accord with that of modern theology and would truly reflect the current state of the Church's discipline." And to wrap up, this section ends by tying it all together. "The liturgical norms of the Council of Trent have certainly been completed and perfected in many particulars by those of the Second Vatican Council, which has carried into effect the efforts to bring the faithful closer to the Sacred Liturgy."



Focus on Religious Freedom

New HHS Rule Would Deny Religious Freedom's Conscience Protections in Healthcare

Before April 2022 Catholics and Americans of all faiths must learn, pray, speak out, and act.

The Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) seeks to reverse and dismantle the

Affordable Care Act (ACA) religious liberty protections that were implemented in 2017 as well as the 2020 clarification of discrimination criteria. The proposed new rule would add an "expansive definition" of discrimination on the basis of sex. "Via this redefinition of sexual discrimination, all health-care entities must participate in the provision of abortions, sterilizations, contraception, (and) gender-transition

services." (1) Adding "sexual orientation and gender identity" to the ACA would require insurers to cover transgender surgeries, cross sex hormones and puberty blockers as "medically necessary genderaffirming care" without the ability to investigate religious freedom complaints. (2)

This new HHS rule, if approved, would allow no religious exemptions, and would force many medical professionals to violate their medical expertise and religious convictions. HHS advises in court documents that it expects this rule to be enacted in April 2022. In late 2017, the administration delegated to the Office of Civil Rights (OCR) broad authority to enforce violations of the Religious Freedom Restoration Act (RFRA). "Prior to the delegation in 2017, no division was singularly responsible for the Department's compliance with RFRA or the First Amendment," wrote OCR Director Lisa Pino. (3)

Also, in June 2020, HHS issued a final rule that affirmed it cannot discriminate on the basis of race, color, national origin, disability, age or sex. HHS "did not create new protected categories under civil rights law," and determined that sex discrimination does not include gender identity or sexual orientation. (4) Sex neuroscientist, Debra Soh, explains that the term "gender" is a social and psychological correlate to sex and connotes "masculine" and "feminine." But gender is not a biological characteristic as is "male" and "female," nor is it equivalent to the inherent, biological characteristics of race, color, etc.

This plan would "effectively remove all religious considerations from issues around life, family, marriage, the very nature of men and women," said Doug Wilson, from Catholic Benefits Association. "This isn't a Catholic issue; this is a religious issue. This will impact everyone religious, and, essentially, they're saying that your beliefs have no standing in this discussion."
