MISSION STATEMENT

We, the parish family of the Church of St Aidan, strengthened by the Eucharist and encouraged by the Word of God, welcome all, for we encourage that everyone is a child of God and no one should be excluded. THE CHURCH OF ST. AIDAN IS OPEN

Daily 6:00 AM to 6:00 PM. Daily Mass can be viewed on staidanparish.org, Facebook and Vimeo. The faithful are required to attend Sunday and Holy Days of Obligation Masses. This obligation does not apply to those who are ill, those who are confined to their home, a hospital, or nursing facility, or those with serious underlying health conditions. Masks are no longer required and are optional when participating in any activities on parish grounds.

PARKING AT ST. AIDAN

As you are aware the number of parking spaces is limited at St. Aidan. The parking lot at the rear of the Upper School and the one on Dover Street are available on weekends and when school is closed. The Lower School has an area that is designated a children's play area. For safety reasons please do not park there. People with disabilities may park in the three reserved parking spaces in front of the rectory on Willis Ave. This special area is needed for church access by people who use wheelchairs and specially-equipped vehicles. Thank you for being parking considerate.

RECEIVING HOLY COMMUNION

Holy Communion unites us more closely to Jesus, and it is also a sign that we are living in communion with His Church, following the teachings that Jesus has handed down to us. One

should only receive Holy Communion if he believes what the Catholic Church teaches, and is living as a member of the Church, following the way of life that she sets out for her children. If one is conscious of serious sin, he should receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation before approaching Holy Communion.

CONFESSION

Confessions are available in the church, screen only, on Saturday from 12:30 PM to 1:30 PM and 4:00 PM to 5:00 PM. You can also make a confession appointment with a priest by calling the rectory office.

BAPTISM

To arrange a baptism contact the rectory at 516-746-6585. Forms need to be completed giving information on the parents, child's date and place of birth, as well as the names and religious affiliation of the sponsors. At least one sponsor must be a practicing Catholic. Baptisms are held on the 1st Sunday and 3rd Sunday at 1:30 PM. To hold a private baptism you must make arrangements with a priest or deacon to perform the baptism. Private baptisms are held on Saturday or Sunday when the church is available. First time parents are required to attend a Baptism Class. Classes are held in the church on the second Sunday of the month after the 12 Noon Mass. Parents are asked to gather at St. Joseph's statue to the right of the main altar.

MARRIAGE

Arrangements are to be made at the Rectory office at least 9 months in advance. Pre-Cana and FOCCUS registrations must be arranged.

ANOINTING


The anointing takes place at 1:00 PM on the 4th Sunday of each month. Please wait for the priest at Our Lady's Shrine.

Forty Days Oftent



What's Pastor Thinking

Forty days is a long time. Moses was on the Mountain of God for forty days. Forty were the years

that Israel wandered in the wilderness. For forty days Jesus went without food in the wilderness. That's why we have forty days of Lent.

'Forty' says conversion is a process — not a once -for-all event. No quick fixes, that's what Lent is about. It's forty days of peeling away the veneer that overlays our soul.

Lent reminds us that we need God's grace to grow, and that we cannot rely on what we can do for ourselves. I recently met a man who knew what it was to rely on God's grace. He was a father, businessperson, and an addict. As we talked, this man told the story of powerlessness over an addiction that had spiraled out of control. The cost of such addiction was severe. It cost him a marriage, his job, and family, before he was willing to admit his addiction. Though my friend has practiced sobriety or quite some time, he knows what addiction can do.

But he also knows what God has done for him. When he was finally able to be honest to God, self, and his family, he admitted that he tried to fill in the blank in his life with the wrong things, and it was then that the healing began. And healing is a process.

St. Augustine prayed, 'You have made us for yourself, O God, and our hearts are restless until they find their rest in you.' 99% of us are addicted to something — food, fashion, accumulation, blaming, shopping, fitness, diets, the pursuit of happiness. Emptiness becomes unbearable and it's quite easy to fill that emptiness with something other than God to numb the pain. Yet, as Augustine discovered, there is nothing on earth that can fill emptiness of the soul but God.

Lent says to us, 'pay attention to your life.' Enter the wilderness of Lent and expect great things from God. Join us this week at the Lenten Mission. Believe that with God all things are possible.

We pray for those with power over war or peace,



MEMORIALS AND PLAQUES

Many thanks to the St.
Aidan family who recently made a donation to purchase six new ciboria for the church. Having inquired about repairing the ciboria we currently use to distribute



communion, we were advised they should be replaced as repair would cost more than their worth.

It is always difficult to retire memorialized gifts that are given to a church. However, chalices crack, vestments are worn and torn, ciboria get tarnished, glass breaks, benches buckle, trees die. Understandably, people get upset when the gift they gave to the church is no longer used, or the tree they gifted dies. It's because, plaques and memorials are placed on objects and in places that are not permanent. I remember the story of a particular church that had pews for many years. Almost every pew had a plaque attached to it. Then the pews became old and worn, so the church decided to replace them with better pews. The fight was brutal when the pews were removed. 'That's MY pew,' they said. The story can be even more intense when an entire building or street named for someone is replaced. Please understand that retired vestments, chalices, ciboria etc. are kept in storage or are sent to a church that is in greater need. Every year there is an appeal for items from churches in North and South America and churches throughout Africa. It is better to use sacred items than keep them in storage. And although trees die and are not replaced, their plaques still remain in our garden for people to view.

If you wish to memorialize a vestment, chalice etc. for a loved one, please do not purchase any item without asking us what we need. We will soon publish a list of items that are needed for the church. Thank you for your understanding and your continued generosity.





Lent 2022

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

Lent is a journey from the desert of death to the springs of new life. We follow Jesus into the wilderness of the desert to renew our baptismal covenant with the Father. During this sacred time, we die to sin, and washed clean from our self-centeredness and attachment to the world, rise to divine grace and love. As we enter this privileged season, let us reflect once more on the three means we employ during this forty-day journey of penance and conversion: prayer, fasting, and almsgiving.

Prayer. Prayer is most simply a conversation with God, and St. Paul reminds us that this conversation must be continual. The Apostle to the Gentiles enjoins us to "pray at all times" (Eph 6:18), "pray without ceasing" (1 Thess 5:17), and "be constant in prayer" (Rom 12:12). To pray this way requires effort. It demands silence, artful listening, and remaining in the presence of God. This Lent we remember two powerful ways we enter into this holy conversation: by sitting in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament and through *lectio divina*, a prayerful reading of Sacred Scripture.

Fasting. The Church Fathers speak extensively on the power of fasting to break sin and open our hearts to the grace of God. Saint Peter Chrysologus writes: "Fasting is the soul of prayer, mercy is the lifeblood of fasting. So if you pray, fast; if you fast, show mercy; if you want your petition to be heard, hear the petition of others. If you do not close your ear to others, you open God's ear to yourself" (Sermo 43: PL 52, 320, 322). Let us remember, too, that bodily fasting is useless unless it is joined with spiritual fasting, that is, fasting from our passions.

Almsgiving. Scripture brings the three marks of our Lenten journey together and puts the emphasis on the last: "Prayer and fasting are good, but better than either is almsgiving accompanied by righteousness ... It is better to give alms than to store up gold; for almsgiving saves one from death and expiates every sin. Those who regularly give alms shall enjoy a full life" (Tob 12:8-9). Almsgiving is better because it points to charity. We remember we are not only to give materially to those in need but also give of ourselves as we love God and neighbor.

Last October, Pope Francis invited the Church into a synod on synodality. The Holy Father wants the Church to journey together in a multi-year process listening to each other, hearing the Word and celebrating the Eucharist. As we journey towards Easter, let us be united in mind and spirit. May the spiritual exercises of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving prepare us for Easter and an experience of the power of God, which "dispels wickedness, washes faults away, restores innocence to the fallen, and joy to mourners, drives out hatred, fosters concord, and brings down the mighty" (*The Easter Proclamation - Exsultet*). Then, alive in Christ, we can go forward evangelizing, as Pope Francis would want, with *parrhesia*: "Boldness, enthusiasm, the freedom to speak out, [and] apostolic fervor" (*Gaudete et Exsultate* 129).

May the loving presence of the Blessed Virgin Mary, who remained faithful to her son at the foot of the cross, protect and sustain us in our Lenten journey.

Today is the First Sunday of Lent. The liturgical color is purple/violet, the church's color for penance and preparation. Each week we have been

focusing on a Word, Phrase, or Short
Sentence of the Week to help link the
Sunday Gospel to Family Life. This week's
Short Sentence of the Week is: GOD
ALWAYS HELPS US! Write the Short
Sentence of the Week and place it on your
refrigerator as a reminder during the
week.

Today's Gospel, (Luke 4:1-13), is the story of Jesus being tempted by the devil in the desert. Jesus often set aside time for prayer. You may recall that a few weeks ago we read about when Jesus was baptized by John the Baptist. The Holy Spirit manifested His Presence and identified Jesus as the Son of God. Jesus understood the value of preparing Himself for the work He was sent to do during His earthly life. Prayer and fasting were an integral part of this preparatory process. We hear today that Jesus fasted in the desert for 40 days and so He was hungry and being very hungry can cause a person to "give-in" more easily; however, the gospel writer, Luke, tells us that Jesus was filled with the Holy Spirit. The devil tempts Jesus with good things. It is good to eat when hungry and to have authority to bring about change. It is also good to be protected from danger. Regardless of the challenge the devil presented, Jesus firmly responded by quoting God's Word from the Scriptures.

Lent is not intended to be a time of "gloom and doom." Lent is a time when the whole Church takes a spiritual breather by slowing down the pace of our busy every day lives to focus on our individual relationships with God. Where are we? How are things going? How can we carve out a little bit of extra time to "inventory" our spiritual state of being.? What inside of each of us could use a "tune-up?" What Lent should not be is a chore that we take on from Ash Wednesday to Easter. The Catechism of the Catholic Church has a few citations, that can give us some food for thought as we begin this Lent. "Jesus' example in the desert encourages us to put our full trust in God." (CCC540). "Just as Jesus was tempted in the desert, we face daily temptations to place earthly bliss, goods, and dominion before God." (CCC,

540) "God is ever present to us, even in difficult times." (CCC, 2948) "We can rely on God in all things and trust that we will be saved by the power of Jesús Christ." (CCC, 301-307, 430) To summarize, in every dimension of our lives, GOD ALWAYS HELPS US.

When children are exposed to Lent in positive ways, they receive a huge blessing in understanding how to have and nurture a personal relationship with God. Reading Lenten Bible stories with children opens them up to becoming active listeners of God's Word. Helping them to establish even at young ages a special prayer time is SO important. Of course, focusing a little more on the spiritual during Lent should lead us to act more like Jesus. This is the reason the Church encourages the three practices of Prayer, Fasting, and Almsgiving during Lent. Fasting for children (or most of us) should not be too drastic because the better road to take with the young is to try to ensure success. Encouraging some "fasting" action for a week at a time may be more realistic. Whatever they are "giving-up" should be replaced with some greater good. That is how children learn to value what is truly important. If they fail in their efforts, remind them to go to God for some help. Reinforce the Short Sentence of the Week, GOD ALWAYS HELPS US. Almsgiving can also take many forms such as giving of our time, talents, and financial

This week, read about the Ten Commandments from a Children's Bible. Ask them which of God's rules they like most and why? Teach young children about the importance of being sorry when they make a wrong choice. Help them learn how to make-up a simple Act of Contrition. As a family, make a list of something extra each family member plans to do during Lent or at least during the First Week of Lent. Review how things are going mid-week and then at the end of the week. Celebrate every effort made. Cut out larger red paper

resources.

hearts followed by cutting out white paper hearts that are a little smaller than the red ones. Glue the white hearts on the red hearts. Write a line from the Bible that speaks about God's love and faithfulness to His people. Hang up the hearts and refer to them during the week. (Younger children will need adults to select a few simple quotes for them to choose from.) Make Lenten crosses. They can be drawn, downloaded, and cut out etc. Give one to each family member and divide the crosses into six sections. Each week, older children can draw or write a symbol of something they heard in church or accomplished that week as part of their preparation for Easter. Younger children can simply color in a section each week. Use it like a Lenten calendar. There are easy to download Lenten calendars that mark every day of Lent which is also helpful.

Lent is a wonderful time of grace. The Little Sisters of the Sick Poor have a Lenten expression that sums up the importance of this holy season. "You will never repent of a Lent well spent." Let us all take comfort in the fact that GOD ALWAYS HELPS US. May this Lent be a special time for each of us to explore how truly faithful and loving our God is. May our children see our example and grow closer to God because GOD ALWAYS HELPS US.

Reading II Rom 10:8-13

Brothers and sisters: What does Scripture say? Gospel Lk 4:1-13

Filled with the Holy Spirit, Jesus returned from the Jordan and was led by the Spirit into the desert for forty days, to be tempted by the devil. He ate nothing during those days, and when they were over he was hungry. The devil said to him, "If you are the Son of God, command this stone to become bread." Jesus answered him, "It is written, One does not live on bread alone." Then he took him up and showed him all the kingdoms of the world in a single instant. The devil said to him, "I shall give to you all this power and glory; for it has been handed over to me, and I may give it to whomever I wish. All this will be yours, if you worship me." Jesus said to him in reply, "It is written You shall worship the Lord, your God, and him alone shall you serve." Then he led him to Jerusalem, made him stand on the parapet of the temple, and said to him, "If you are the Son of God, throw yourself down from here, for it is written: He will command his angels concerning you, to guard you, and: With their hands they will support you, lest you dash your foot against a stone." Jesus said to him in reply, "It also says, You shall not put the Lord, your God, to the test." When the devil had finished every temptation, he departed from him for a time.



Following the introduction, we begin to see the meat of the GIRM in CHAPTER I: THE IMPORTANCE AND DIGNITY OF THE CELEBRATION OF THE EUCHARIST. Here, again, the document reminds us of what the intent is, and why, as it prepares to go into depth as to how all this will be accomplished. As we go on looking at the GIRM, whenever I quote it, I will leave in the paragraph numbers so it will be easier to follow the logic, and, if you wish, to look for further detail by reading the GIRM yourself. They are numbered consecutively and in the past two weeks, the material cited was from the first fifteen paragraphs. Embedded in the document are numerous footnote citations which I will omit. In general, they refer to specific parts of the documents from Vatican II. So I'll begin with paragraph sixteen, the start of Chapter 1. "16. The celebration of Mass, as the action of Christ and of the People of God arrayed hierarchically, is the center of the whole of Christian life for the Church both universal and local, as well as for each of the faithful individually. For in it is found the high point both of the action by which God sanctifies the world in Christ and of the worship that the human race offers to the Father, adoring him through Christ, the Son of God, in the Holy Spirit. In it, moreover, during the course of the year, the mysteries of redemption are celebrated so as to be in some way made present. As to the other sacred actions and all the activities of the Christian life, these are bound up with it, flow from it, and are ordered to it. 17. It is, therefore, of the greatest importance that the celebration of the Mass or the Lord's Supper be so ordered that the sacred ministers and the faithful taking part in it, according to the state proper to each, may draw from it more abundantly those fruits, to obtain which, Christ the Lord instituted the Eucharistic Sacrifice of his Body and Blood and entrusted it as the memorial of his Passion and Resurrection to the Church, his beloved Bride. 18. This will fittingly come about if, with due regard for the

nature and other circumstances of each liturgical assembly, the entire celebration is arranged in such a way that it leads to a conscious, active, and full participation of the faithful, namely in body and in mind, a participation fervent with faith, hope, and charity, of the sort which is desired by the Church and which is required by the very nature of the celebration and to which the Christian people have a right and duty in virtue of their Baptism." Here again we can see the intent of the Church Fathers and why. The celebration of the Mass is the center of our faith, and it is critical that all of us understand that and participate as fully as possible in that celebration. A few paragraphs later, this goal will be reaffirmed: "21. Hence this Instruction aims both to offer general lines for a suitable ordering of the celebration of the Eucharist and to explain the rules by which individual forms of celebration may be arranged." The rest of Chapter 1 deals mostly with the general duties of the ordained ministers, priests, deacons, and especially bishops, stressing their responsibility in ensuring that the directives of Vatican II are met. It covers the need to maintain the dignity of the liturgical celebrations, the importance of catechesis, how the synthesis of the many facets of our liturgy, music, art, prayer, teaching, must all contribute, and it recognizes that some adaptations may be necessary to reflect the various local conditions. Some of these adaptations can be made by the priest/celebrant. They deal with such things as the choice of certain rites or texts, that is, of the chants, readings, prayers, explanatory interventions, which are both suitable for the local congregation and lend themselves to better understanding and participation. For instance, some of the prayers at Mass have options in the missal and the priest may choose which of them he thinks most appropriate for the community at that time. But he cannot add or remove anything from the celebration of the Mass. There are some other adaptations which are reserved for the diocesan bishop laid out in the Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy and a final note of more profound adaptations mostly concerned with traditions and culture of peoples and regions, which may be made in accordance with the CSL under

limited special circumstances which are detailed near the end of the GIRM.

As we will continue to see, the bishops who made up the membership of Vatican II, and that was the vast majority of all the bishops at the time, were very concerned with ensuring that all of the members of the faithful could understand and participate in the church, especially in the Mass. They repeatedly refer to the long-standing teachings and traditions of the Church and to how they must remain inviolate. They also maintain their sense of the need for the catholicity of the church. This is the word we hear in both the Nicene Creed at Mass and the Apostles' Creed when we say "one, holy, catholic, and apostolic" It is also part of the formal name of our faith, Roman Catholic, but what it means is "universal". And that is one of the main concerns of the GIRM, that the Church, in its celebration of the central part of our life in faith, will be universal with the same liturgy throughout the world.



Focus on Religious Freedom

Christian Values on Trial in Finland Will Affect Religious Freedom in Europe and the World

"Part of the scary thing about what's happening in Finland is that it could happen anywhere else," said human rights lawyer Paul Coleman. (1) Coleman cautioned that the Finnish cases are the "canary in the coalmine" for freedom of speech and freedom of religion in the Western world.

If the court finds them guilty, two
Christians in Finland face fines or up to two
years in prison and thus would set the
precedent of making quoting the Bible a
criminal offense in Western countries. Dr.
Paivi Rasanen, member of Parliament
(2011-2015), physician and mother of five
and Bishop Juhana Pohjola of the Lutheran
Mission Diocese in Finland, were charged
with incitement against a minority group
for publishing a pamphlet, "Male and

Female He Created Them," that states the theological and scientific truth that men and women are different. Bishop Pohjola warned that "the Gospel of Christ is at stake" as Western governments liken the Bible's teachings about marriage and sexuality to "hate speech." (2)

"The Prosecutors main idea seems to be that the Bible should not be taught in its own right in public, and that freedom of religion does not allow permission to speak out loud if what is said is considered to discriminate against a minority group," said Bishop Pohjola. "In this view, biblical teachings on marriage, sexuality, sin, and mercy could not be proclaimed publicly. This is an attack on religious freedom." (3)

"Although (the Prosecutor) stated this was not about the Bible or about freedom of religion or opinions, she went quite deeply into theological issues," said Bishop Pohjola. (4) Throughout her argumentation and questioning, the Prosecutor returned repeatedly to discussions of the nature of scripture, the defendant's interpretation of texts, and the Christian understanding of sin.


The defendants rejected all charges against them as false, arguing that the pamphlet in question and Christian teaching does not consider (minority groups) different before God. "All (people) are of equal worth, and all are under sin, and all are under grace," explained Bishop Pohjola. "We all have the same position before God ...(all) are welcome in our churches, to live in contact with Christ, and to find their identity - just as each of us should find our identity - as the creation of God, redeemed by Jesus Christ." (5)

"It is incredible this trial is happening in a modern European country and not in a religious theocracy," said Alliance
Defending Freedom (ADF) International.




