ST. AIDAN CONVENT BUILDING IS CLOSED


Repairs to the convent will take some time following a water leak. All meetings that were scheduled there have to be moved to other buildings. Contact the Rectory for more information.

BAPTISM

To arrange a baptism contact the rectory office. Forms need to be completed giving information on the parents, child's date and place of birth, as well as the names and religious affiliation of the sponsors. At least one sponsor must be a practicing Catholic. Baptisms are held on the 1st Sunday and 3rd Sunday at 1:30 PM. To hold a private baptism you must make arrangements with a priest or deacon to perform the baptism. What's Pastor Thinking

I suppose every one knows

who makes us feel less important than they, less together - manicured lawn, neat-as-a-pin house, beautiful children, fancy cars. Yet, when you try to make friends with these people, you get the distinct impression that they would be doing you a favor by being your friend. And, that makes you feel second-class.

Today's gospel is about two people, both of whom receive communion. Yet, he kept returning. was a first-class citizen, one who we should admire. He participated in church: Sunday morning Mass, Wednesday night prayer meetings and volunteered at everything. He was, as we say, in everything but the Christmas creche! If there was a church group formed or something to be done, he was there.

Like the Pharisee, he was a faithful man, but something was missing. Nothing in all his church activity had touched his heart. Nothing usually did. Last Sunday his wife commented about all those young people who had been in church that morning. Couldn't their parents contain them? Couldn't their parents keep them quiet? After all, when their children were young, they knew how to behave.

Also in church that morning, tucked away, leaning someone who is 'stuck up,' someone against the wall near the confessional, was a second man. The usher had seen him around human than they. These people seem to have it all town, but couldn't figure out why he had come to our church. Actually, the second man had been coming to church for quite a while. He started when he lost his job, just before his marriage dissolved. He had been there every week since, just to get right with God. He knew he wasn't good enough to be a volunteer, never mind believed in God, both of whom prayed to God. One This morning, long after the Mass, he remained in church, overcome with joy or grief, he didn't know which. He could not explain what happened to him during that morning. All he could say was 'God will help me.'

> Two men went up to pray and God was available to both. God didn't love one more than the other. God did not love the tax-collector more than the Pharisee. God loves us all the same. The problem is that we don't love each other all the same. It is the Pharisee's lack of connection with the tax collector, his determination to set himself apart from, and above, the tax-collector that prevents the Pharisee from opening himself to God's grace. Two people went up to pray. One sought God to tell God how good he was. One sought God to ask for God's love.

FOCUS ON RELIGIOUS FREEDOM

"Indeed, all who desire to live a godly life in Christ Jesus, will be persecuted." 2 Timothy 3:12

Globally, Religious Freedom is Under Siege

According to a 2022 Pew Research Center report, over 75% of the world's population live in countries with high or very high governmental and/or societal restrictions on religious freedom. Throughout the Middle East, Church leaders - from Jerusalem to Iraq - are concerned that the Christian population is emigrating at alarming rates. The very birthplace of Christianity now faces the serious threat of losing its heritage because Christians are fleeing systematic violence in their homeland. (1)

In Southeast Asia and Africa, the countries of Myanmar and Nigeria are now seeing the most brutal persecution. "Myanmar authorities brutalized us," said a 30-year-old Muslim refugee. "They burned down our houses, raped our mothers and sisters, burned our children. We took shelter in Bangladesh to escape that brutality." (2) These killings by the Myanmar military led to over 700,00 Rohingya Muslims into overcrowded, disease-ridden camps.

Christians are the particular target of persecution in Nigeria. More Christians are killed for their faith in Nigeria than in the rest of the world combined. (3) "Nigeria is currently one of the scariest places to be a Christian," says an Open Door's analyst. "The country has witnessed an explosion of violence in recent months. Attacks are happening almost on a daily basis.... (This) is what is happening across West Africa - the agenda, and

the process and model of persecution are being implemented elsewhere with impunity."(4)

"The United Nations estimates that over 82 million people are forcibly displaced worldwide, the highest number on record. Many are displaced due to conflicts, real or manufactured, over religion..." (5)

LITURGY

Jesus is the master of prayer. As we saw last week, He learned human prayer from His mother who would certainly have introduced Him to the Jewish prayer traditions, enhanced by her inspired prayer which we will see later. But the CCC cites many times that the New Testament tells us how He showed His disciples and us how much more intense and personal His prayers were. And He gave us a completely new way of seeing how His, and by example, our, relationship to God was and could be. In so doing, He also introduced a whole new image of His Father. Just how does He do this? The Gospels walk us through it by weaving Jesus' prayer life throughout their narratives. If we pay attention, we see how important prayer was to Jesus by watching how often He prayed, why He prayed, and how He prayed.

To continue with the CCC, "2600 The Gospel according to St. Luke emphasizes the action of the Holy Spirit and the meaning of prayer in Christ's ministry. Jesus prays before the decisive moments of his mission: before his Father's witness to him during his baptism and Transfiguration, and before his own fulfillment of the Father's plan of love by his Passion. He also prays before the decisive moments involving the mission of his apostles: at his election and call of the Twelve, before Peter's confession of him as "the Christ of God," and again that the faith of the chief of the Apostles may not fail when tempted. Jesus' prayer before the events of salvation that the Father has asked him to fulfill is a humble and trusting commitment of his human will to the loving will of the Father." So we see how Jesus prays at critical moments in His life. He prays not only for Himself, but for others. Sometimes His prayers are answered immediately in the sight of others, such as at His Baptism Lk 3:21 "the holy Spirit descended upon him in bodily form like a dove. And a voice came from heaven, "You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased." Sometimes, His prayers aren't answered as He asks. Perhaps the best example of this, and His response is Lk 22:42 "Father, if you are willing, take this cup away from me; still, not my will but yours be done." Clearly, there are lessons here for all of us.

Jesus also provides specific words to use in prayer. At the apostles' request, He teaches them how to pray, giving us the words of the greatest and most universal prayer of all, the Our

Father, Both Luke and Matthew tell the story, but Matthew's version is the one with which we are familiar. The prayer is full of wonderful thoughts, words, praise, ideas, but the most revolutionary concept it introduces is right up front: it starts not with "Oh Lord" or "Oh God" as we see many Jewish prayers begin, but with "our Father", not a distant austere God, but a close, loving Father. In addition to this sort of shared public prayers, Jesus also has deeply private prayers. "2602 Jesus often draws apart to pray in solitude, on a mountain, preferably at night." Think of this perhaps as our invitation to meditative prayer. The CCC cites more examples of Jesus' prayer in which He is also teaching as well as praying. "2603 The evangelists have preserved two more explicit prayers offered by Christ during his public ministry. Each begins with thanksgiving. In the first, Jesus confesses the Father, acknowledges, and blesses him because he has hidden the mysteries of the Kingdom from those who think themselves learned and has revealed them to infants, the poor of the Beatitudes.... 2604 The second prayer, before the raising of Lazarus, is recorded by St. John. Thanksgiving precedes the event: "Father, I thank you for having heard me," which implies that the Father always hears his petitions. Jesus immediately adds: "I know that you always hear me," which implies that Jesus, on his part, constantly made such petitions. Jesus' prayer, characterized by thanksgiving, reveals to us how to ask: before the gift is given, Jesus commits himself to the One who in giving gives himself. The Giver is more precious than the gift; he is the "treasure"; in him abides his Son's heart; the gift is given "as well." Notice in these citations that Jesus gives thanks, even before He asks. There is certainly a message for us! Before wrapping up for this week, let's look a bit closer at how Jesus addresses God, and this was truly revolutionary. It goes beyond "our Father". Here is what we read in another version of the agony in the garden. In Mk 13:46 "he said, "Abba, Father, all things are possible to you. Take this cup away from me, but not what I will but what you will." St. Paul also uses the word "abba" in the letters to both the Galatians and Romans. Most people think "abba" simply means having an intimate relationship with your father, but there are actually two elements, not just one. "Abba" is a more complex word than we usually think. It isn't exactly "daddy" but that is pretty close. But it is more than just that. It does mean having a very close intimate relationship with your father, but also implies obedience. It is the relationship of a dutiful son and a very loving father. It would have been incomprehensible to the Jewish people to call God "abba", but it is very apt for us, because as St. Paul sees it, we are adopted sons (and daughters) of God, thus making us heirs, but also demonstrating the great love He has for us. Maybe the prodigal son should have thought of calling his father "abba". Maybe we should, too.
