### THE CHURCH IS OPEN 6 AM TO 6 PM

Daily Mass can be viewed on staidanparish.org, Facebook and Vimeo. The faithful are required to attend Sunday and Holy Days of Obligation Masses. This obligation does not apply to those who are ill, those who are confined to their home, a hospital, or nursing facility, or those with serious underlying health conditions. For the safety of all, the church doors will be closed

when school children attend services during the week.

### ST. AIDAN CONVENT BUILDING IS CLOSED

Repairs to the convent will take some time following a water leak. All meetings that were scheduled there had to be moved to other buildings. Contact the Rectory for more information.

### **PARKING AT ST. AIDAN**

The number of parking spaces is limited at St. Aidan. The parking lot at the rear of the Upper School and the one on Dover Street are available on weekends and when school is closed. The Lower School has an area that is designated a children's play area. People with disabilities may park in the three reserved parking spaces in front of the rectory on Willis Ave. This special area is needed for church access by people who use wheelchairs and specially-equipped vehicles. Thank you for being parking considerate.

### **BAPTISM**

To arrange a baptism contact the rectory office. Forms need to be completed giving information on the parents, child's date and place of birth, as well as the names and religious affiliation of the sponsors. At least one sponsor must be a practicing Catholic. Baptisms are held on the 1st Sunday and 3rd Sunday at 1:30 PM. To hold a private baptism you must make arrangements with a priest or deacon to perform the baptism. Private baptisms are held on Saturday or Sunday when the church is available. First time parents are required to attend a Baptism Class. Classes are held in the church on the second Sunday of the month after the 12 PM Mass. Parents are asked to gather at St. Joseph's statue to the right of the altar.

### RECEIVING HOLY COMMUNION

Holy Communion unites us more closely to Jesus, and it is also a sign that we are living in communion with His Church, following the teachings that Jesus has handed down to us. If you know of someone homebound who would like to receive Communion from a Eucharistic Minister, please contact the Rectory.

### **EUCHARISTIC ADORATION**

First and Third Fridays of the month 1:00-3:00 PM in the church.

### **CONFESSION**

Confessions are available in the church, screen only, on Saturday from 12:30 PM to 1:30 PM and 4:00 PM to 5:00 PM. You can also make an appointment with a priest by calling the rectory office.

#### ANOINTING OF THE SICK

Anointing of the sick takes place at 1:00 PM on the 4th Sunday of each month. Please wait for the priest at Our Lady's Shrine.

### MARRIAGE

Arrangements are to be made at the Rectory office at least 9 months in advance. Pre-Cana and FOCCUS registrations must be arranged. Pre-Cana at St. Aidan consists of a ONE DAY SATURDAY COURSE. The moderator is Deacon Rudy Martin (917) 952-6521. Email: Dcrudy@Staidanparish.org.

## What's Pastor Thinking

What are you expecting this Christmas? The perfect family gathering with no tension and everyone able to be present? The perfect Christmas gift? A refreshing,

stress-free holiday?

Or, thinking beyond Christmas, what do you expect out of life? Good health and length of days? Safety and security? A good family, filled with love for one another and pride in each other? Satisfaction and purpose in living? And what do you expect from God? That's a big question, isn't it! We'd surely like God to bless us, wouldn't we? To keep us happy and healthy? To keep our families and friends safe? To make the world a peaceful place, putting an end to tension and violence in our communities, and war in our world? To bring judgment to those who deserve it, and, if we're honest about it, doesn't that mean those we don't like? And wouldn't we like it if God did all that with as little inconvenience as possible for us? That sounds a lot like the expectations of John the Baptist. Last week, we heard him roaring in the desert: 'Repent! Turn around! Be baptized for the forgiveness of sins! The Messiah is coming, and when he comes, there's going to be fire! There's going to be judgment! So clean up your act and get ready!'

This week, we meet John again. He's in prison. He's been arrested for telling the truth to King Herod about Herod's own sins. The powerful don't always like to hear the truth, you know!

Meanwhile, Jesus has been creating quite a stir, curing the sick, casting out demons, giving sight to the blind and hearing to the deaf, making the lame walk, calming the sea, and even raising the dead. Jesus has been eating with sinners and tax-collectors, announcing God's favor for the poor, forgiving sins and teaching the truths of God.

So, John's disciples bring reports about all of this to John and it makes John wonder. Back when he had baptized Jesus, he had thought Jesus was the Messiah. But now he wasn't so sure. Jesus wasn't living up to his expectations. Where was the fire? Where was the judgment? John was expecting a Messiah who came with thunder and the fire of judgment. Instead, Jesus came and demonstrated mercy and forgiveness and a willingness to suffer for the sake of God's kingdom. What kind of Messiah was that? Well, Jesus was, and still is today, the Messiah God intended to send—giving life and showing mercy, rather than judging and destroying like a conquering King. Do you believe that? Catholics find the Sacrament of Reconciliation a helpful spiritual experience that confirms our belief in a merciful God. Pope Francis said: "The center of confession is not the sins we declare, but the divine love we receive, of which we are always in need." God is at work, not to give us what we want and expect, but to give us what we really and truly need—His love. You should come away from confession with a sense of God's mercy, more than a sense of your own guilt. In the absence of mortal sin, you may choose to confess the behavior you are most sorry for, and the behavior you most want to change. But, please be sensitive to those waiting in line. There are times when only one priest is available to hear confessions, and the line may be long. Know you can always visit with a priest or spiritual director another time, to discuss important issues or questions in your spiritual or personal life. It is best to do this at a time when others are not waiting to see the priest for confession. Confession is available at various times this December at the Church of St. Aidan, and in our neighboring churches. May this sacrament always bring you to encounter a merciful and loving God.

### A HEALTHY ENVIRONMENT

Whenever two or more people gather, some sharing of germs is inevitable. When Catholics gather in Jesus' name to celebrate the Eucharist, our first concern is sharing our gratitude, our faith and our belief in Christ among us. However each of us has the responsibility of taking precautions to prevent the spread of illness. As a result of the pandemic we got used to washing and sanitizing our hands frequently. Take care where you cough and sneeze, and scrutinize your habits and procedures where the spread of infection seems most possible.

- SHOULD YOU COME TO MASS? The obligation to attend
  Mass on Sunday and other Holy Days of Obligation is the
  ordinary expectation for Roman Catholics (Canon 1247).
  However, extraordinary circumstances such as sickness
  or severe weather excuse the faithful from this
  obligation. If you suspect you are ill, please stay at home
  and do not risk spreading infection to others.
- HOLDING HANDS DURING THE LORD'S PRAYER: No one is required to hold hands. It is very fitting to pray the "Our Father" with your palms lifted upward, or with your hands placed together in prayer.
- THE SIGN OF PEACE: Please don't be offended if someone chooses not to shake hands with you during the Sign of Peace. An appropriate gesture might be to strive for eye contact rather than physical contact. You could clasp your hands together and bow gently to those around you, and with a smile say "Peace be with you.' Or simply offer a wave of your hand.

 RECEIVING HOLY COMMUNION: If you are feeling ill, please receive Holy Communion in the hand, rather on the tongue.

The December Dilemma 2022: Celebrating Religious Holidays in Public Schools

"Mankind is a great, an immense family... This is proved by what

we feel in our hearts at Christmas." - Pope John Paul XXIII December holidays are always a challenge and educators often receive confusing advice about how to treat religious holidays. The last decades of increased diversity in our schools have challenged public schools to deal creatively and sensitively with student populations representing many faiths and beliefs, secular and religious. Happily, research reveals that celebrating Christmas and other holidays in the classroom brings children and teachers closer together, builds community links, and improves pupils' learning. (1) A good way to deal with the December Dilemma is to begin the season with a focus on an often ignored holiday: Bill of Rights Day, December 15th. It was established to commemorate the adoption of the Bill of Rights to the U.S. Constitution on December 15. 1791. Beginning the season with activities around the Bill of Rights offers an opportunity for students to reflect on the civic values of rights, responsibility, and respect that all Americans share as citizens, no matter their religious or secular beliefs. Senior fellow at the Freedom Forum, Charles Haynes, recommends that before planning holiday activities in public schools, choral directors, teachers, and administrators should ask themselves three simple questions:

- "1. Do we have a clear educational purpose? Under the First Amendment, learning about religious holidays is an appropriate educational goal devotionally celebrating is not.

  2. Will any student or parent be made to feel like an outsider by the concert, lesson or activity? Most parents and students are fine with learning about religious traditions as long as the approach is academic, not devotional.
- 3. Is our overall curriculum balanced and fair? December shouldn't be the only time sacred music is in the curriculum. Students should learn about religious music from

various world traditions at other times in the school year." (2)

Prepare, celebrate and evangelize the coming of our Savior Let your December explode with joy as you anticipate the Birth of the Christ Child with a manger on your lawn, Christmas lights on your bushes, a glowing tree in your window, a magnet on your car, a lapel pin on your coat, a donation to the local soup kitchen, a gift under your church's Giving Tree

### **LITURGY**

There are two more sections in the CCC concerning the background and traditions of prayer, The Battle of Prayer and The prayer at the Hour of Jesus. The former sounds sort of counter-intuitive, but it is not what the title implies. We will cover it today. It deals with external, and some internal, things that may make it difficult to pray effectively. "2725 Prayer is both a gift of grace and a determined response on our part. It always presupposes effort.... 2726 In the battle of prayer, we must face in ourselves and around us erroneous notions of prayer.... 2727 We must also face the fact that certain attitudes deriving from the mentality of "this present world" can penetrate our lives if we are not vigilant....2728 Finally, our battle has to confront what we experience as failure in prayer: discouragement during periods of dryness... sadness... disappointment...and.... (a sense of) what good does it do to pray?" Notice that the first and third issues are more internal, and the middle one comes from outside. How should we deal with them? The CCC reminds us that prayer is inspired by the Holy Spirit. We do not have to go it alone. Last week we saw different methods of praying. We can start our prayer life simply, with the ritualistic words of common prayers, but then look more deeply - what are those words really saying? What are they saying to me? What does it mean when I pray those words? This requires that we devote some time to prayer. That is a bit of where the external world comes in. There are too many distractions, too many other things that demand our time, things that lead us away from God. You night start by setting aside just a few minutes each day. Try to make it a consistent time and place, so that it becomes associated with prayer and less subject to outside influences. There is a reason why many of us were taught to say our morning and nighttime prayers, as well as why the priest's breviary has specific times of day for specific prayers. For us, morning is a good time to prepare for all the day will throw at us, and evening is a good time to review our successes and failures during the day, think about them, and say thanks for the good and sorry for the not so good. Set

times not only help us avoid distractions, but they also help us get past those periods of dryness, or frustration, when we might feel God is not listening. The CCC reminds us to not be discouraged. Many of our greatest saints faced similar periods. It is perseverance and faith that gets us through. And maintaining that regular pattern of prayer enables us to do just that.

The CCC takes a good look at one aspect of this which is probably something that most of us have experienced. Why doesn't God answer my prayers? Or why does He take so long, or maybe why is the answer "no"? To try to put this in a different perspective, here is what the CCC says. "2735 In the first place, we ought to be astonished by this fact: when we praise God or give him thanks for his benefits in general, we are not particularly concerned whether or not our prayer is acceptable to him. On the other hand, we demand to see the results of our petitions. What is the image of God that motivates our prayer: an instrument to be used? or the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ? 2736.... Are we asking God for "what is good for us"? Our Father knows what we need before we ask him....2737 "You ask and do not receive, because you ask wrongly, to spend it on your passions.".... If we enter into the desire of his Spirit, we shall be heard. Do not be troubled if you do not immediately receive from God what you ask him; for he desires to do something even greater for you, while you cling to him in prayer." There is a lot in this. We tend to ask for what we want, and we tend to want it soon. And what we ask may be "good" for us, or someone we love. Help me get an A on this test. Please cure my wife and relieve her of the cancer from which she is suffering. And make it snappy. In themselves, these are good things, but they may not be what we most need. So study for the test, don't just expect God to take it for you. And remember that we will all die someday. We just don't know when or how. And while it is still hard to watch someone we love suffer, listen to one of the greatest prophets as he reminds us, Is 55: 8a "For my thoughts are not your thoughts, nor are your ways my ways..." It is often hard, but prayer requires faith and trust in God. There is a line in one of the prayers in the Perpetual Novena to Our Lady of the Miraculous Medal that sums this up perfectly: "...we your loving and trustful children implore you to obtain for us the graces and favors we ask during this Novena, if they be beneficial to our immortal souls, and the souls for whom we pray." The CCC goes on to remind us of the words of St Paul, Eph 6: 18a "With all prayer and supplication, pray at every opportunity in the Spirit." So don't give up. Pray regularly. Like St Paul, keep the faith, persevere. Trust in God to listen and answer your prayers with what you truly need to obtain eternal life, not just what is good for today.

Family Mass: Connecting Church and Home! Today is the Third Sunday of Advent. The liturgical color is rose or pink to remind us that we are around the halfway point of Advent and Christmas is coming very soon. (Rose or pink is only worn on two Sundays during the Church Year: halfway through advent and halfway through Lent!) All three readings focus on waiting for Jesus, the Messiah, the One promised by God. John the Baptist expected a Messiah that matched the images he learned in the Hebrew scriptures, which emphasized that a King would come to save them. Jesus did not fit into the image of the Hebrew

scriptures. He was not wealthy or considered powerful. Jesus points us to the way of compassion, caring, and service. We are filled with joy as we wait patiently for Jesus. Younger children can be encouraged to look for signs around them. Signs give us directions and needed information. Have younger children look at signs and talk about what they mean. Then ask them to look specifically for signs that Jesus is coming. Point out how the appearance of the church changes during this time as we prepare for Christmas. Primary school children should think about some of the great things Jesus like how He was a good friend, cured people, provided food for them, and welcomed even people that were not treated very well. Jesus brought His joyful Light wherever He went. Ask the children how they can bring some joyful light into the lives of others. Spreading joy is a great act of service and the hallmark of a follower of Jesus, also called being a Missionary disciple. Have the children make cards and write notes/letters to people who need some Advent Joy. Link this with lighting the third candle on the Advent wreath: the candle of joy. Point out how much brighter the advent wreath is now that three candles are glowing. Older children can practice their skills looking up passages in the Bible. Here are a few places where they will find something wonderful that Jesus did. The blind see. (Mark 8:22-26) The lame walk. (Mark 2:1-12) Lepers are cleansed. (Mark 1:40-45) The deaf hear. (Mark 7:31-37) The dead are raised. (Luke 7:11-17) The poor will hear the Good News about God. (Matthew 5:1-12) For parents, take a few minutes away from the added stress of holiday preparations to praise and thank God for the greatest gift He could give: JESUS. For the whole family, (at least those who are old enough) plan to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation before Christmas.



Qualified Charitable Donations (QCD)

This unique opportunity allows taxpayers to make charitable contributions through a direct IRA transfer.

If you would like to make a gift using your Ira and if:

- 1. You are at least 70 1/2 years old on the date you make your gift
- 2. Your IRA is a traditional (some Roth IRA's may qualify)
- 3. You don't exceed your personal maximum of \$100,000 per year in qualified charitable distributions

### Tax Saving Advantages:

- 1. QCDs are not included in your adjusted gross income.
- QCDs deliver a tax benefit while "regular" charitable donations might not since the Tax Cuts and Jobs Act almost doubled the standard deductions amounts.
- 3. QCDs taken from your traditional IRA counts as a distribution for the required minimum distribution (RMD) rules. Therefore, you can donate all or part of your RMD that you would otherwise be forced to receive and pay taxes on.

The best way for you to start is with your IRA custodian. Tell them you want to make a "qualified charitable distribution." In most cases you will only have to fill out a simple form.

VERY IMPORTANT!! Your gift <u>must</u> go directly from your IRA to the Charity. If you receive the money first then you'll be taxed on it like any other distribution.






