# THE CHURCH IS OPEN 6 AM TO 6 PM

Daily Mass can be viewed on staidanparish.org, Facebook and Vimeo. The faithful are required to attend Sunday and Holy Days of Obligation Masses. This obligation does not apply to those who are ill, those who are confined to their home, a hospital, or nursing facility, or those with serious underlying health conditions. For the safety of all, the church doors will be closed

when school children attend services during the week.

### **PARKING AT ST. AIDAN**

The number of parking spaces is limited at St. Aidan. The parking lot at the rear of the Upper School and the one on Dover Street are available on weekends and when school is closed. The Lower School has an area that is designated a children's play area. People with disabilities may park in the three reserved parking spaces in front of the rectory on Willis Ave. This special area is needed for church access by people who use wheelchairs and specially-equipped vehicles. Thank you for being parking considerate.

### **BAPTISM**

To arrange a baptism contact the rectory office. Forms need to be completed giving information on the parents, child's date and place of birth, as well as the names and religious affiliation of the sponsors. At least one sponsor must be a practicing Catholic. Baptisms are held on the 1st Sunday and 3rd Sunday at 1:30 PM. To hold a private baptism you must make arrangements with a priest or deacon to perform the baptism. Private baptisms are held on Saturday or Sunday when the church is available. First time parents are required to attend a Baptism Class. Classes are held in the church on the second Sunday of the month after the 12 PM Mass. Parents are asked to gather at St. Joseph's statue to the right of the altar.

# RECEIVING HOLY COMMUNION

Holy Communion unites us more closely to Jesus, and it is also a sign that we are living in communion with His Church, following the teachings that Jesus has handed down to us. If you know of someone homebound who would like to receive Communion from a Eucharistic Minister, please contact the Rectory.

First and Third Fridays of the month 1:00-3:00 PM in the church.

### **CONFESSION**

Confessions are available in the church, screen only, on Saturday from 12:30 PM to 1:30 PM and 4:00 PM to 5:00 PM. You can also make an appointment with a priest by calling the rectory office.

### ANOINTING OF THE SICK

Anointing of the sick takes place at 1:00 PM on the 4th Sunday of each month. Please wait for the priest at Our Lady's Shrine.

### MARRIAGE

Arrangements are to be made at the Rectory office at least 9 months in advance. Pre-Cana and FOCCUS registrations must be arranged. Pre-Cana at St. Aidan consists of a ONE DAY SATURDAY COURSE. The moderator is Deacon Rudy Martin (917) 952-6521. Email: Dcrudy@Staidanparish.org.



# What's Pastor Thinking

A bright star appears in the heavens. For Jews who knew their Scripture, the star is a sign of the birth of a King, a

descendant of the great King David.

Some others see the star. They are not Jews. They are Gentiles, outsiders. Although in the Christmas carol they are called 'kings of Orient,' they are really 'magi' magicians, astrologers, star-gazers. They have been studying the heavens, and have been captivated by the bright star they have seen. They decided it is a sign of something of great significance, and so they follow it. King Herod the Great notices too. He doesn't notice the star, but he does notice the Magi, and he's curious about their intentions. He doesn't notice the star because he's a Jew in name only, not in faith or practice. He's a ruthless king, power hungry, striving to please the Romans at whose whim he governed, and he won't hesitate to do away with anyone who gets in his way. A wife, a brother-in-law, and three sons, all were executed on the outside looking in. No longer dependent on rare by Herod because he perceived them to be threats to his rule. This child is a King, and Herod knows that there's not room for both of them just a few miles apart, and so he does what kings do: he puts all the power of his realm to work to destroy the threat, to hunt down Jesus and kill Him.

Although His life is threatened at an early age, this newborn King will grow up to be incredibly powerful! He will grow up to suffer terribly at the hands of those who think they are in power. And then the tables will turn, and Jesus will rise in triumph, and He will, indeed, be made known as ruler of the entire universe! And He will rule with mercy, and forgiveness, and love. What a King Jesus will be!

The Magi followed a star, and were led to Jesus. After the star was gone, they were warned in a dream that Herod had evil intentions. So the Magi went home, changed, transformed, renewed. They went home by another way.

By another way. That phrase has a double meaning. Yes, the Magi took a different route home, steering clear of Jerusalem, avoiding Herod, wanting to honor Jesus. They took a different route. They also took a different path. Their lives were changed. They no longer were and mysterious stars to guide their lives. Now they could follow Jesus and know God's unending mercy and abundant love. They could follow Jesus, and their lives would have a purpose. The Magi found another way, another way to LIVE!

And will we? That's the challenge of this story.





# CHALKING THE DOORS THE EPIPHANY HOME BLESSING

On Epiphany, it is traditional for families to bless their homes, remembering the hospitality of the Holy Family to the Wise Men and asking for protection and blessing on the home and all who enter. The home blessing is done by writing on the door or door frame with chalk the symbols 20+C+M+B+23.

The 20 and 23 represent the current year. The + reminds us of the cross on which our Savior died. The C, M, and B stand for the traditional names of the Wise Men, Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar, as well as an abbreviation for the Latin phrase "Christus mansionem benedicat" which means "Christ bless this house." Pray: "Lord God of heaven and earth, you revealed your only-begotten Son to every nation by the guidance of a star. Bless this house and all who inhabit it. Fill us with the light of



Christ, that our concern for others may reflect your love. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen." Chalk the door, door frame, with 20+C+M+B+20. Pray the Our Father. Make the Sign of the Cross.

# FOCUS ON RELIGIOUS FREEDOM

"Are you Praying?" A Cautionary Tale for America A pro-life volunteer, Isabel Vaughan-Spruce, was approached by police in Birmingham, England on Dec. 6, 2022 and asked, "Are you praying?" as she silently stood near a closed abortion clinic. She was subsequently arrested when she admitted she "might" be praying inside her head. She was charged with four counts of breaking a Public Space Protection Order (PSPO), designed to stop antisocial behavior, because police received complaints from an onlooker who suspected she was praying even though she was not holding a sign or making any visible form of protest. She had been spotted near the clinic three other times and when asked about these occasions, she explained that she may have been praying but she also may have been thinking about other things. Nevertheless, she endured this ordeal even though her 'behavior' was quiet and peaceful.

"It's abhorrently wrong that I was searched, arrested, interrogated by police and charged simply for praying in the privacy of my own mind. Censorship zones purport to ban harassment, which is already illegal. Nobody should ever be subject to harassment. But what I did was the furthest thing from harmful - I was exercising my freedom of thought, my freedom of religion, inside the privacy of my own mind. Nobody should be criminalized for thinking and for praying, in a public space in the UK," Isabel told Alliance Defending Freedom UK.(1) George Washington University Law Professor, Jonathan Turley, wrote, "... free speech has been in free fall in the UK for years. It is a cautionary tale for those in the United States, which is facing arguably the largest anti-free speech movement in its history. ... It is easy for Americans to wave off such European prosecutions by pointing to our First Amendment. However, there is a growing movement in the U.S. to replicate such European laws." (2)

"The UK is an example of the slippery slope of speech criminalization that inevitably took them to 'thought crimes,' even criminal prayers. These cases should be a wake up for all who value free speech (and freedom of religion). If such prosecutions stands, free speech literally does not have a prayer in the Western world." (3)

# **LITURGY**

As we saw last week, we humans have been praying for a long time, but how and why we pray has evolved as we learned more about our world and about God. While this is not unique to Catholic prayer, this week we will focus on just that, beginning with a definition of prayer that paraphrases what the CCC says. Prayer is an act of the virtue of religion which consists in asking proper gifts or graces from God. In a more general sense, it is the application of the mind to Divine things, not merely to acquire a knowledge of them but to make use of such knowledge as a means of union with God. Keep this last sentence in mind. It is very important to how our Catholic understanding of prayer developed. Prayer presupposes faith in God and hope in his goodness. By both, God, to Whom one prays, moves the individual to prayer. But all of this is generic. It would apply to prayer as we saw last week. What does Catholic thought add to this?

The Church has prayed since it began. We saw how Jesus prayed. His followers, the apostles, regarded prayer as an essential part of their lives, too. The first thing we see in Acts after Pentecost and the brief description of the communal life of the early church is this. Acts 3: 1 "Now Peter and John were going up to the temple area for the three o'clock hour of prayer." So they prayed daily as a matter of course. Later we see how important prayer was to the apostles, as it led to the appointment of the first deacons. Acts 6: 3-4 "Brothers, select from among you seven reputable men, filled with the Spirit and wisdom, whom we shall appoint to this task, whereas we shall devote ourselves to prayer and to the ministry of the word." So prayer was critical to the Church from the start. Indeed, St. Paul wrote 1 Thess 5: 17-18 "Pray without ceasing. In all circumstances give thanks, for this is the will of God for you in Christ Jesus." Early Christian prayers were really Jewish prayers, especially the psalms, which are still prayed by both Christians and Jews. They are timeless. But just as our understanding of God evolved over time, so did our understanding of prayer. St Isaac of Nineveh (7th century) offered this, which begins to give some hint of the deeper meaning of prayer: "It (prayer) is the mind detached from earthly things and the whole heart pointed to that in which it hopes." This begins to get at that sentence noted earlier and

leads to the mysticism that will come later. St. Thomas Aguinas (13th century) added another dimension to Christian prayer. He wrote that we reach truth in two ways. In the first way, we receive truth from outside ourselves, and to access such truths directly from God, prayer is our means. Tracing back to our roots, he cites the words of Wisdom 7:7: "I called upon God, and the spirit of wisdom came upon me." When St. Thomas the apostle asked Jesus where He was going, Jesus answered him by saying, Jn 14:6 "I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me." St. Thomas Aquinas, one of the earlier Doctors of the Church, told us how to find that truth in prayer. Later, one of the first great mystical thinkers of the Church, St. Catherine of Siena (14th century), who, along with St. Teresa of Avila: (16 century) were the first women recognized as Doctors of the Church, had many insights into prayer. Among them, "Holy Spirit, come into my heart, and in your power draw it to you." Here, in a single sentence, she captures the essence of prayer in a nutshell. It is all about union with God, a heart-to-heart relationship with Jesus, Who desires to be united with us. She also adds a cautionary thought for us, "There are more tears shed over answered prayers than over unanswered prayers." As human beings, we have a couple of unfortunate tendencies: one is to want things that are bad for us, and the other is to convince ourselves that what we want is actually good for us. Consequently, when we get what "we want," we often find ourselves unpleasantly surprised. God, however, always knows and wants what is best for us, and He is always able to give us what will help us, rather than harm us. God has one thing in mind: our salvation. St. Catherine suggests we would do well to trust Him. All of these thoughts came before the Reformation, but that event brought about more wisdom from the Holy Spirit. Listen to St. Theresa of Avila (16 century). "Prayer is an act of love; words are not needed. Even if sickness distracts from thoughts, all that is needed is the will to love." As St. John told us, God is love. St. Theresa tells us that prayer through love unites us with the very essence of God. Both St. Catherine of Siena and St, Theresa of Avila experienced extremely deep relationships with God. Their writings reflect this relationship and require close attention to begin to appreciate what they tell us. They are mystical theologians. No, not magicians. From the Catholic Encyclopedia, "Mysticism is either a religious tendency and desire of the human soul towards an intimate union with the Divinity, or a system growing out of such a tendency and desire. (It) considers as the end of philosophy the direct union of the human soul with the Divinity through contemplation and love, and attempts to determine the processes and the means of realizing this end. It adds that there are specific Catholic qualities which must be considered, but suffice it to say that if you wish to dig more deeply into their writings, take a look if you dare, but I would advise finding someone well versed in theology to assist you. Next week we will see some more recent thoughts on this subject.

Family Mass: Connecting Church and Home! Today is the Epiphany of the Lord also known as Three Kings Day or The Coming of the Three Wise Men. Or Magi. The liturgical color is white. Today's Gospel, (Matthew 2: 1-12) tells the story of the Wise Men following the star in the east and arriving in Jerusalem to find the newborn king of the Jews. Herod tries to trick them into checking back with him after the Wise Men find the child. The Wise Men find the Holy Family and offered royal gifts. They didn't reveal any information to Herod and returned home using another way. Today we celebrate that Jesus came for all people. Talk about the Wise Men's gifts to Jesus. Frankincense represents our prayers going up to Heaven. Gold was used for money. Children understand that money gets us what we need and sometimes what we want. Myrrh is an oil used for anointing and was used in perfume and as medicine, especially in Jesus' time. Ask children to reflect on what gifts do they have to offer Jesus? Emphasize that importance of hospitality because Jesus wants us to welcome others. Being hospitable brings people together and tears down the walls of separation that can happen. Older children are acutely aware of how the world seems to be divided in all kinds of ways. Encourage inclusiveness. Finally, bless the doorway of your home. Use a marker to write the following: 20 + C + M + B + 23. The numbers stand for the year while the letters are the first letters of the names of the Wise Men: Casper, Melchoir, and Balthassar. They also abbreviate the Latin words "Christus maisonem benedicat "which means "May Christ bless the house." Say a prayer as you hang the sign and leave it up to welcome all who come to your door in 2023.

This unique opportunity allows taxpayers to make charitable contributions through a direct IRA transfer.

If you would like to make a gift using your Ira and if:

- 1. You are at least 70 1/2 years old on the date you make your gift
- 2. Your IRA is a traditional (some Roth IRA's may qualify)
- 3. You don't exceed your personal maximum of \$100,000 per year in qualified charitable distributions

### **Tax Saving Advantages:**

- 1. QCDs are not included in your adjusted gross income.
- QCDs deliver a tax benefit while "regular" charitable donations might not since the Tax Cuts and Jobs Act almost doubled the standard deductions amounts.
- 3. QCDs taken from your traditional IRA counts as a distribution for the required minimum distribution (RMD) rules. Therefore, you can donate all or part of your RMD that you would otherwise be forced to receive and pay taxes on.

The best way for you to start is with your IRA custodian. Tell them you want to make a "qualified charitable distribution." In most cases you will only have to fill out a simple form.

VERY IMPORTANT!! Your gift <u>must</u> go directly from your IRA to the Charity. If you receive the money first then you'll be taxed on it like any other distribution.

Bill has a \$125,000 in a traditional IRA and would like to contribute \$5,000 to his parish. 
