THE CHURCH IS OPEN 6 AM TO 6 PM

Daily Mass can be viewed on staidanparish.org, Facebook and Vimeo. The faithful are required to attend Sunday and Holy Days of Obligation Masses. This obligation does not apply to those who are ill, those who are confined to their home, a hospital, or nursing facility, or those with serious underlying health conditions. For the safety of all, the church doors will be closed

when school children attend services during the week.

ST. AIDAN CONVENT BUILDING IS CLOSED

Repairs to the convent will take some time following a water leak. All meetings that were scheduled there had to be moved to other buildings. Contact the Rectory for more information.

PARKING AT ST. AIDAN

The number of parking spaces is limited at St. Aidan. The parking lot at the rear of the Upper School and the one on Dover Street are available on weekends and when school is closed. The Lower School has an area that is designated a children's play area. People with disabilities may park in the three reserved parking spaces in front of the rectory on Willis Ave. This special area is needed for church access by people who use wheelchairs and specially-equipped vehicles. Thank you for being parking considerate.

BAPTISM

To arrange a baptism contact the rectory office. Forms need to be completed giving information on the parents, child's date and place of birth, as well as the names and religious affiliation of the sponsors. At least one sponsor must be a practicing Catholic. Baptisms are held on the 1st Sunday and 3rd Sunday at 1:30 PM. To hold a private baptism you must make arrangements with a priest or deacon to perform the baptism. Private baptisms are held on Saturday or Sunday when the church is available. First time parents are required to attend a Baptism Class. Classes are held in the church on the second Sunday of the month after the 12 PM Mass. Parents are asked to gather at St. Joseph's statue to the right of the altar.

RECEIVING HOLY COMMUNION

Holy Communion unites us more closely to Jesus, and it is also a sign that we are living in communion with His Church, following the teachings that Jesus has handed down to us. If you know of someone homebound who would like to receive Communion from a Eucharistic Minister, please contact the Rectory.

EUCHARISTIC ADORATION

First and Third Fridays of the month 1:00-3:00 PM in the church.

CONFESSION

Confessions are available in the church, screen only, on Saturday from 12:30 PM to 1:30 PM and 4:00 PM to 5:00 PM. You can also make an appointment with a priest by calling the rectory office.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

Anointing of the sick takes place at 1:00 PM on the 4th Sunday of each month. Please wait for the priest at Our Lady's Shrine.

MARRIAGE

Arrangements are to be made at the Rectory office at least 9 months in advance. Pre-Cana and FOCCUS registrations must be arranged. Pre-Cana at St. Aidan consists of a ONE DAY SATURDAY COURSE. The moderator is Deacon Rudy Martin (917) 952-6521. Email: Dcrudy@Staidanparish.org.



What's Pastor Thinking

The disciple Thomas has been portrayed in a negative light as 'Thomas the Doubter.' But honestly who of us in this situation would not have had the

same questions? After all a fair amount of critical thinking is healthy for our faith.

Some people frown if you question your faith. Doubt is often portrayed as negative. But aren't doubts, when expressed sincerely, a way to reach out to God? Look at the disciple Thomas. His honest questions and doubts about the resurrection of Jesus led him to discover a deeper revelation of Jesus. It's from Thomas's mouth we hear for the first time a statement of the divinity of Jesus Christ: 'my Lord, and my God!' Sincerely expressed doubt can lead to a deeper-rooted faith.

God wants us to be honest with ourselves. God is like that father who wants to sit you down on his lap and explain some things to you; maybe you will not get answers to all your questions, but the story of Thomas gives us hope that by expressing our struggles and our doubts, we will likely gain a deeper revelation of God.

God certainly understands that we can be uncertain in our faith. Doubt is human, we all go through phases of doubt and uncertainty, when we question what we believe about God, or when we even question God, and God is big enough to deal with our questions. Doubt may even be a helpful and a necessary element in our faith. Even in our liturgy

we talk about the 'mystery of faith.' Mystery leaves room for wonderment, uncertainty and doubt about God and our faith.

When Thomas doubted that Jesus had risen, that the other disciples had seen him, he was not mocking anybody's faith. Thomas just had to see it for himself. He was craving his own God experience. There is nothing wrong with wanting to ask questions and get answers from God for ourselves for there comes a time when the classes of our childhood in Catholic School or Religious Education isn't going to be enough. You have to find your own faith. You have to have your own God experience. In fact, the only way to ever discover your own faith comes by way of doubting, by setting aside what you have been told about God by your parents and your faith community.

Hopefully, as you tackle the hardships of the questioning process, as you leave no rock unturned, as you wrestle with life's mysteries and sufferings, as you keep searching for answers until you find that vision, until you have that God experience. Then and only then, can you truly find yourself and your place in the universe.

So, embrace your doubts, don't let anybody hold you back on your faith journey. Don't worry, we all have them. You are not alone. We're all in this together. The story of Thomas shows us that our doubts and our questions have a rightful place in God's Church.



Our Lord appeared to St. Faustina and told her to share the good news about God's unfathomable mercy towards sinners. He told her to share the image and prayers in devotion to the Divine Mercy. There are many promises associated with devotion to Divine Mercy. Saint Aidan Parish will again be celebrating Divine Mercy Sunday with a special afternoon devotion. WHEN AND WHY DID THE CHURCH BEGIN CELEBRATING DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY?



The world was in the midst of the Great
Depression in 1931 and the memories of World
War I were still very much alive in the minds of
Europeans when in
Poland a sister of the
Congregation of Sisters of
Our Lady of Mercy,
Faustina Kowalska (1905-1938), is said to have been personally visited by
Jesus.

According to her diary an image was revealed to her of the risen Lord, from whose heart shone two rays, one red (representing blood) and

the other "pale" (symbolizing water), with the words "Jesus, I trust in you" at the bottom. Faustina wrote in her diary that Jesus told her, "I promise that the soul that will venerate this image will not perish."


When she was canonized in 2000 under the direction of fellow countryman Pope John Paul II, he proclaimed that the Second Sunday of Easter would henceforth be known as Divine Mercy Sunday, thereby widely promoting the devotional practices associated with Faustina's visions, already popular in many communities.

St. Faustina, a poorly educated daughter of a humble Polish family, kept a 600-page diary of the apparitions she claimed continued for years. Her entries focus on God's mercy, the call to accept God's mercy and to be merciful, the need for conversion, and the call to trust in Jesus. It had been Jesus' own wish, she wrote, to establish a feast day: "I [Jesus] desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls.... I am giving them the last hope of salvation; that is, the Feast of My Mercy."

Among the practices associated with the devotion are its novena, the Chaplet of the Divine Mercy, a series of prayers organized similarly to a rosary.



The Decline - and Possible Fall - of Religious Freedom in America

"Historically, religion and its adherents have often been oppressed by government. By contrast, America has been singular in its dedication to preserving the freedom of its people to expect and experience religious freedom. That is now rapidly changing," wrote Kelly Shackelford, president of First Liberty law firm. (1) In the past year there have been a number of violent attacks on churches, church gatherings, statues of Jesus, Virgin Mary, saints and monuments. Churches, synagogues and other church services have been banned or severely restricted, while liquor stores & casinos are allowed to be open. "A nation truly committed to religious freedom would, in a time of national crisis, welcome the essentiality of religion's exercise - not ban it." (2)

Religious liberty court cases have increased at an alarming rate. From the Constitution's ratification until 1940, there were only 3 Supreme Court cases challenging religious freedom. But since then, more than 75 cases have come before the high Court. Religious freedom has been under increasing siege for eight decades now. (3) "Our Constitution was made only for a moral and religious people.

It is wholly inadequate to the government of any other."

John Adams, Founding Father and second president. Speaking at the Univ. of Notre Dame Law School on Oct. 11, 2019, A.G. William Barr said that attacks on religious liberty have contributed to a moral decline in this country. "Secularists and their allies have marshaled all the forces of mass communication, popular culture, the entertainment industry, and academia in an unremitting assault on religion and traditional values." (4) "The moral problems Barr mentioned in his speech - plus murder, mayhem, and other forms of anti-social behavior - will continue until we regain our moral footing," wrote Dr. Walter E. Williams, professor of economics at George Mason University. "I am all too afraid that a historian, writing a few hundred years from now, will note that the liberty America enjoyed was simply a historical curiosity. Then it all returned to mankind's normal state of affairs - arbitrary abuse and control by the powerful elite." (5)

LITURGY

What else does the CCC have to say about the Our Father? As you might expect, quite a bit. Last week we saw it as the perfect prayer, from several points of view. But the CCC adds more. "2765 The traditional expression "the Lord's Prayer" ... means that the prayer to our Father is taught and given to us by the Lord Jesus. The prayer that comes to us from Jesus is truly unique: it is "of the Lord." On the one hand, in the words of this prayer the only Son gives us the words the Father gave him:....On the other, as Word incarnate, he knows in his human heart the needs of his human brothers and sisters and reveals them to us: he is the model of our prayer." Jesus is the only being Who knows both His Father and each of us intimately, so He is uniquely able to provide us with the perfect prayer. But He doesn't just give us words to parrot back. "2766 But Jesus does not give us a formula to repeat mechanically. As in every vocal prayer, it is through the Word of God that the Holy Spirit teaches the children of God to pray to their Father. Jesus not only gives us the words of our filial prayer; at the same time he gives us the Spirit by whom these words become in us "spirit and life." Even more, the proof and possibility of our filial prayer is that the Father "sent the Spirit of his Son into our hearts, crying, 'Abba! Father!'".... The prayer to Our Father is inserted into the mysterious mission of the Son and of the Spirit."

Recall how the prayer came to be. The apostles asked Jesus to teach them how to pray. And remember further how in His last discourse with them (see John, chapters 14 through 17), He promised that He would send the Paraclete, the Holy Spirit, to guide them in the future. That is what the CCC is referring to here. They asked for a prayer, and they got it, but while it is short, it has a very deep meaning of which we should be aware as we pray Jesus' words. The CCC goes into this in detail, so rather than just say the words, we can meditate on them, and get much more from them. In fact, if we truly do this, we may realize that we are getting answers to the prayer almost as we pray. This begins right away, with the first words of the prayer. What does it mean when we call God "our Father"? To pick a few things from the CCC, "2777 ... From the burning bush Moses heard a voice saying to him, "Do not come near; put off your shoes from your feet, for the place on which you are



AT THE SEMINARY OF THE IMMACULATE CONCEPTION IN HUNTINGTON

After graduating from college, he began the adventure of following that call and entered the seminary. In 2022, Fr. standing is holy ground." Only Jesus could cross that threshold of the divine holiness, for "when he had made purification for sins," he brought us into the Father's presence: "Here am I, and the children God has given me....2779... When Moses himself asked God who he was, he heard another name. The Father's name has been revealed to us in the Son, for the name "Son" implies the new name "Father." 2780 We can invoke God as "Father" because he is revealed to us by his Son become man and because his Spirit makes him known to us. The personal relation of the Son to the Father is something that man cannot conceive of nor the angelic powers even dimly see: and yet, the Spirit of the Son grants a participation in that very relation to us who believe that Jesus is the Christ and that we are born of God We give him thanks for having revealed his name to us, for the gift of believing in it, and for the indwelling of his Presence in us. 2782 We can adore the Father because he has caused us to be reborn to his life by adopting us as his children in his only Son: by Baptism, he incorporates us into the Body of his Christ....

God, indeed, who has predestined us to adoption as his sons, has conformed us to the glorious Body of Christ....2783 Thus the Lord's Prayer reveals us to ourselves at the same time that it reveals the Father to us."

That is a lot to process in just those two words of the prayer. Jesus reveals a whole new picture of God, vastly different from that of the Old Testament. Not only that, but He tells us that we are not just God's chosen people, rather, we are His children, His sons and daughters. So we have a very different picture of who we are, and how this is a direct result of this relationship with God. And this is a very personal relationship. Jesus referred to His Father as "Abba", which as we saw some time ago, means something close to "daddy". This is a loving Father, but one to Whom we owe full filial fidelity. "2784 ... We must remember... and know that when we call God "our Father" we ought to behave as sons of God." Hold that thought until next week when the CCC will take us deeper into just what "Our Father" means.



Family Mass: Connecting Church and Home! Today, we celebrate the Second Sunday of Easter also known as Divine Mercy Sunday. The liturgical color is white. Today's Gospel, (John 20:19-31), is the story of Doubting Thomas. Jesus appears to His disciples gathered together but Thomas was not present at the time. The Catechism of the Catholic Church gives an excellent explanation regarding the meaning of this gospel. "The Risen Christ dispels the fears of the disciples, who have been in hiding since the time of his death because they were afraid of the religious authorities. (CCC, 1808). Jesus shows his wounds not only to prove his identity but also to show his power over death. (CCC, 635). He bestows his peace and the Holy Spirit on them and sends them out to proclaim his Gospel and offer the world forgiveness of sin. All who believe in Jesus, whether they have seen him or not, are equally blessed and sent. (CCC, 2014)." We shouldn't be too hard on poor Thomas because the Resurrection was so hard for Jesus' followers to absorb. It was like trying to see crystal clear through an opaque veil, however, Jesus returned to help Thomas believe. Thomas' proclamation of faith, the famous "My Lord and my God!", is probably the finest, most well-known statement of belief in the Bible. Today is also known as Divine Mercy Sunday, a relatively new feast in the church. It was instituted by St. Pope John Paul II at the canonization of a Polish nun, St. Sr. Faustina Kowalska. St. Faustina received a divine message commanding her to share God's mercy with all people. She received the Divine Mercy image of Jesus radiating His mercy to all. The Divine Mercy chaplet, a set of repetitive prayers that focus on Jesus' mercy can be prayed using rosary beads. The prayers are extensions of Prayers common to prayers offered in the Easter Rite of the Church and so they were at least partially known to the people she encountered. Her goal was to have everyone she encountered filled with joy just for being in her presence. She saw herself and her direct mandate from God as being a simple messenger of mercy and reflection of God's goodness to all people.

Children can usually understand doubting Thomas' situation. Faith especially when we do not see is challenging. St. Faustina learned the importance of placing our faith and complete trust in Jesus' love. Mercy is love in action. It isn't enough to simply talk about bringing God's love to others. Jesus calls us to step up. First, we need to grow into an understanding of experiencing mercy and then practicing mercy in our everyday lives. For children it also means encountering mercy first in their nuclear families. Granting each other in the family the mercy Jesus shares with us is often hard, but this unconditional love begins at home so the more we use those challenging moments, the more children learn what they live. This is the peace that Jesus gives us and the peace He extended to those frightened disciples in fear. This is what makes us Bold for Christ.

This week, with younger children, sing this song to the tune of "The farmer in the Dell." My Lord and My God. (2x) Thomas, he cried aloud, My Lord and My God. Trace younger children's hands and talk about how Jesus wants us to share His mercy, forgiveness, and love with others. Write or draw some simple ways this can be done. For older children, talk about St. Teresa's of Avila's prayer, Christ Has No Body on earth but yours, No hands, no feet on earth but yours. Yours are the eyes with which he looks compassion on this world. Yours are the feet with which he works to do good. Yours are the hands, with which he blesses all the world. Christ has no body now on earth but yours. Point out when the exchange of Peace offered at Mass. Practice with younger children how to make eye contact and say the words to others around them at Mass. Also, point out when we pray the Lord, Have Mercy at the beginning of some Masses. The Sundays of the Easter season are rich in images and ideas. Other than Ordinary Time, it is the longest liturgical season in the Church Year lasting for 50 days. Try to keep the momentum of the Easter season alive in your homes. The chocolate bunnies and decorated eggs may dwindle over the 50 days, but Jesus's message of true joy, peace, mercy, and glory should keep the Alleluias shouting from our lips and resounding within us.




