THE CHURCH IS OPEN 6 AM TO 6 PM

Daily Mass can be viewed on staidanparish.org, Facebook and Vimeo. The faithful are required to attend Sunday and Holy Days of Obligation Masses. This obligation does not apply to those who are ill, those who are confined to their home, a hospital, or nursing facility, or those with serious underlying health conditions. For

the safety of all, the church doors will be closed when school children attend services during the week.

PARKING AT ST. AIDAN

The number of parking spaces is limited at St. Aidan. The parking lot at the rear of the Upper School and the one on Dover Street are available on weekends and when school is closed. The Lower School has an area that is designated a children's play area. People with disabilities may park in the three reserved parking spaces in front of the rectory on Willis Ave. This special area is needed for church access by people who use wheelchairs and specially-equipped vehicles. Thank you for being parking considerate.

BAPTISM

To arrange a baptism contact the rectory office. Forms need to be completed giving information on the parents, child's date and place of birth, as well as the names and religious affiliation of the sponsors. At least one sponsor must be a practicing Catholic. Baptisms are held on the 1st Sunday and 3rd Sunday at 1:30 PM. To hold a private baptism you must make arrangements with a priest or deacon to perform the baptism. Private baptisms are held on Saturday or Sunday when the church is available. First time parents are required to attend a Baptism Class. Classes are held in the church on the second Sunday of the month after the 12 PM Mass. Parents are asked to gather at St. Joseph's statue to the right of the altar.

RECEIVING HOLY COMMUNION

Holy Communion unites us more closely to Jesus, and it is also a sign that we are living in communion with His Church, following the teachings that Jesus has handed down to us. If you know of someone homebound who would like to receive Communion from a Eucharistic Minister, please contact the Rectory.

First and Third Fridays of the month 1:00-3:00

PM in the church.

CONFESSION

Confessions are available in the church, screen only, on Saturday from 12:30 PM to 1:30 PM and 4:00 PM to 5:00 PM. You can also make an appointment with a priest by calling the rectory office.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

Anointing of the sick takes place at 1:00 PM on the 4th Sunday of each month. Please wait for the priest at Our Lady's Shrine.

MARRIAGE

Arrangements are to be made at the Rectory office at least 9 months in advance. Pre-Cana and FOCCUS registrations must be arranged. Pre-Cana at St. Aidan consists of a ONE DAY SATURDAY COURSE. The moderator is Deacon Rudy Martin (917) 952-6521. Email: Dcrudy@Staidanparish.org.

What's Pastor Thinking


"Shhh..." We spent most of our younger life hearing that sound "Shhh..." in the classroom. "Shhh..."

in the library. "Shhh..." on the playground or in the cafeteria — although that never made any sense to me! At home, how many times a day does a parent say, "Shhh..?" For some, its all too much! "Shush yourself Enough. I want the noise." Do you remember another kind of 'shhhh' moment to comfort you and to remind you of all that I have that we looked forward to hearing when we were children. When going to sleep a parent would tuck a blanket around you, lean over and whisper "Shhh, I'm right here if you need me." They wouldn't shush because you were talking or were too loud, but because they wanted to make sure we heard the words of comfort offered to us. That's the kind of 'shush' moment lesus has with his disciples in today's gospel. Today he is giving one of those final pep talks we see sprinkled throughout St. John's gospel. He tells them that He is going to be leaving them soon, but that God would send them someone in His place, the 'Counselor' or 'Comforter.' Those words of departure pierce the disciples' hearts as they realize that the One they had depended on, and

turned to for support, through so many difficult times, was not going to be with them for very much longer. What would they do? How would they carry on without Him? What would happen to them, to the movement?

Jesus knew what they were feeling. He knew their fears, their doubts, their concerns and their questions. 'Shhh! ... the Father will send another taught you. Now shhhhhh. I will not leave you orphans, I leave you my peace, a special kind of peace the world knows nothing about. Now ssshhhhh, listen, wait."

It wasn't because the disciples were being rude or talking too loud that Jesus had to shush them. It was simply that they might really listen to the words of comfort and hope that He had to offer. Shhh! Jesus offers peace the world cannot offer! Shhh! Jesus offers meaning and eternal life! Trouble at home or maybe work or school? Problems with finances? Shhh! God will never leave us orphans. God will send His Spirit. Shhh! Whatever you might be facing now, or whatever you might face in the future, Shhh! God is offering hope and comfort.

THE SOLEMNITY OF THE MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST - CORPUS CHRISTI, WILL BE CELEBRATED THIS YEAR ON SUNDAY, JUNE 11, 2023.

To mark the beginning of the Parish Year of the Eucharistic Revival (June 2023-July 2024), every parish in the country is invited to plan a Eucharistic procession. The time of the procession at St. Aidan will be after the 10:30 AM Mass. A Eucharistic Procession, just like Eucharistic Adoration, is an extension of the worship of Jesus Christ, truly present in the Blessed Sacrament. The supreme act of adoration and the source and summit of the Christian life is the celebration of the Mass, and that celebration is prolonged and intensified through Eucharistic worship outside of the Mass. In Eucharistic Processions, the missionary aspect of the Eucharist is emphasized as we go forth into the world. Not only gazing upon our Eucharistic Lord, but walking with him, we experience what the disciples did 2000 years ago as they walked with Jesus, proclaiming the Good News to the world. A parish community that undertakes a Eucharistic Procession has made the decision to publicly proclaim its belief in Jesus' True Presence in the Eucharist. By this public witness of faith, the parish invites people in the community to encounter the Risen Lord present in the Eucharistic Host. For those who participate in the procession, it is an opportunity not only to proclaim their faith but also to grow in their faith. The procession is, finally, an invitation to Jesus

himself to be a part of our daily lives, to be immersed in the world in which we live.

The eight Catholic dioceses of New York State are sponsoring an historic statewide Eucharistic Congress, which will be held at Our Lady of Martyrs Shrine in Auriesville, New York from October 20-22, 2023.

The Eucharistic Congress is taking place as part of a national effort of the Catholic Church to reinvigorate devotion to the Eucharist on a national level. This National Eucharistic Revival, sponsored by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, aims to restore understanding and fidelity to the great mystery of Jesus really and truly present in the Eucharist and to encourage all Catholics to make the Eucharist the source and summit of their faith. The bishops of New York State have launched an easy to use

The bishops of New York State have launched an easy to use website, https://nyseucharisticcongress.org/, to provide comprehensive information about the Eucharistic Congress and allow people to register.

Bishop Edward Scharfenberger, Bishop of the Diocese of Albany and one of the chairs of the New York State Eucharistic Congress, said, "We look forward to welcoming upwards of 10,000 people to the Eucharistic Congress, who want to draw closer to Jesus and share in this historic three day event. Our Congress will feature Mass on Saturday celebrated by Cardinal Timothy Dolan of New York, great speakers, opportunities for prayer and adoration before the Blessed Sacrament, and time to socialize. It will be a wonderful time to renew our faith in Jesus, and share that faith with others."

The location of the Eucharistic Congress, the Shrine of Our Lady of Martyrs, is the site of the 17th century martyrdoms of Jesuit missionaries Saints Isaac Jogues, Rene Goupil and Jean Lalande and of the birth of the first native American saint, St. Kateri Tekakwitha. Jogues is famous for his love for the Mass and Tekakwitha for her love for Eucharistic adoration. The Shrine's Coliseum, built in 1931 in response to the canonization of martyred Jesuit missionaries, is the largest Church building in the United States, holding 10,000.

The Congress' website will be updated regularly to provide information on the complete schedule of events, the speakers who will captivate and inspire the crowd, religious services that will take place, and nearby places to stay. It will also allow individuals, families, groups and parishes to register as well as give them the opportunity to volunteer during this historic three-day event.

ARE YOU SEARCHING?

Are you searching for a faith to follow? Do you know someone who may be interested in learning more about what the Catholic Church believes and teaches? Were you baptized as an infant but not raised in the faith or raised in another Christian faith? Whatever your situation, wherever you are in your faith journey, OCIA (formally RCIA) is here for YOU. OCIA stands for Order of Christian Initiation for Adults. It is a process by which adults can inquire about the Catholic Church. There is never any pressure put on any inquirer to become a Catholic. If an inquirer or seeker decides to move closer toward becoming a Catholic, he/she receives instruction in a small setting guided by a team of dedicated parishioners. The inquirer decides if he/she wants to move forward one step at a time. The whole parish

Catholic Hospital System Told to Extinguish Their Sanctuary Candle or Lose Their Ability to Help the Poor Through Medicaid, Medicare or CHIP St. Francis, non-profit Health System in Oklahoma is the 12th largest hospital in the

country and serves over 400,000 patients each year and has provided over 650 million in free health services over the last five years. For 63 years a sanctuary candle has burned without a problem in the chapel at Saint Francis Hospital Yale Campus where vital healthcare is provided for the elderly, poor and disabled in Oklahoma. The fire marshal and government never complained about the candle until now. The hospital's attorneys from the Beckett Fund point out that the candle is far from medical equipment and shielded by glass holders and a brass top.

Health and Human Services has mandated the extinguishing of the candle even though the hospital has applied four times for an exemption. Now they are working with the Becket Fund attorneys to protect the hospital system's right to maintain the living flame in accordance with their 1st Amendment right to religious expression and in keeping with Cannon Law which states that when the Eucharist is present, a lamp must shine continuously. If the hospital is forced to extinguish the candle, they will have to remove the Eucharist



The next petition in the Our Father has led me to think deeply about what it entails, even before I read what the CCC has to say, beginning with this: ""AND FORGIVE US OUR TRESPASSES, AS WE FORGIVE THOSE WHO TRESPASS AGAINST US" 2838 This petition is astonishing. If it consisted only of the first phrase, "And forgive us our trespasses," it might have been included, implicitly, in the first three petitions of the Lord's Prayer, since Christ's sacrifice is "that sins may be forgiven." But, according to the second phrase, our petition will not be heard unless we have first met a strict requirement." Remember how Jesus told St. Peter he had to forgive not seven times, but seventy-seven times, which meant every time. Don't count, just forgive. My thought, and my prayer, is not that God forgive me as I forgive, but that He help me to forgive as He forgives. After all, as we saw in the first petition, we sort of asked Him to help us be holy as He is holy, while we still recognize that we cannot, by ourselves, reach this goal. So we depend on His constant forgiveness. And the CCC reminds us of this, "2839 With bold confidence, we began praying to our Father. In begging him that his name be hallowed, we were in fact asking him that we ourselves might be always made more holy. But though we are clothed with the baptismal garment, we do not cease to sin... Now, in this new petition, we return to him like the prodigal son and...(o)ur petition begins with a "confession" of our wretchedness and his mercy. Our hope is firm because, in his Son, "we have redemption, the forgiveness of sins." But it goes on to both warn and encourage us. "2840 Now - and this is daunting - this outpouring of mercy cannot penetrate our hearts as long as we have not forgiven those who have trespassed against us. Love, like the Body of Christ, is indivisible; we cannot love the God we cannot see if we do not love the brother or sister we do see. In refusing to forgive our brothers and sisters, our hearts are closed and their hardness makes them impervious to the Father's merciful love; but in confessing our sins, our

hearts are opened to his grace. 2841 This petition is so important that it is the only one to which the Lord returns and which he develops explicitly in the Sermon on the Mount. This crucial requirement of the covenant mystery is impossible for man. But "with God all things are possible." The CCC cites several other examples of how important this is for Jesus, most notably, "2842 ... "A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another, even as I have loved you, that you also love one another." It is impossible to keep the Lord's commandment by imitating the divine model from outside; there has to be a vital participation, coming from the depths of the heart, ...(t)hen the unity of forgiveness becomes possible and we find ourselves "forgiving one another, as God in Christ forgave" us." The CCC cites many other examples of forgiveness and more arguments for what we are to do, but the bottom line is that we must try to be more forgiving and trust in God both for His help in doing that and in His constant forgiveness of our faults. The CCC then sums up the importance of forgiveness in a single sentence. "2844 ... Forgiveness is the fundamental condition of the reconciliation of the children of God with their Father and of men with one another."

The next petition, "and lead us not into temptation", sounds a bit odd if we take it literally as it is translated into English. God would certainly never lead us into temptation. But as the CCC explains, "2846 ... It is difficult to translate the Greek verb used by a single English word: the Greek means both "do not allow us to enter into temptation" and "do not let us yield to temptation...We ask him not to allow us to take the way that leads to sin. We are engaged in the battle "between flesh and spirit"; this petition implores the Spirit of discernment and strength. 2847 The Holy Spirit makes us discern between trials, which are necessary for the growth of the inner man, and temptation, which leads to sin and death. We must also discern between being tempted and consenting to temptation." And we must trust in God as we exercise this discernment. "2848 God is faithful, and he will not let you be tempted beyond your strength, but with the temptation will also provide the way of escape, so that you may be able to endure it." So our prayer is really more like an understanding that we will be tempted, but the Holy Spirit will enable us to discern what is going on, and God will never allow us to be tempted beyond the strength He gives us. But just like muscular strength is built up by resistance training, so is our spiritual strength built up by the same sort of training.

FAMILY MASS Please Help Family Mass! Family Mass is looking for more adults to assist in supervising the young people who volunteer each week. It takes very little time and/or training. Family Mass: Connecting Church and Home! Today, we celebrate the Sixth Sunday of Easter. The liturgical color is white. In today's Gospel, (John 14:15-21), Jesus gives His parting instructions to His disciples. He tells them if they are His followers, they must keep the commandments. Keeping His commandments is the way His disciples will show their love for Him. Jesus also promises to ask the father to send the Holy Spirit to help His followers. He was anticipating how directionless and lost His followers would be when He would no longer be physically present to them. The promise of the Holy Spirit would both empower and sustain His struggling followers as they were charged with the mission to spread Jesus' message to others.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church tell us, "Although Jesus no longer lives among us in physical form, the Holy Spirit continues his work in the world. The Spirit awakens faith and enables communion with Christ. (CCC,

683). He grants his many and varied gifts to all. (CCC, 2003), making possible spiritual freedom (CCC, 1742) by allowing and enabling prayer. Through the inspiration of the Holy Spirit, the Scriptures were written (CCC, 304) and God is revealed in myriad ways (CCC, 244, 687) primarily but not exclusively through the Church." This coming Thursday, (May 18) is Ascension Thursday, the day the church celebrates when Jesus returned to Heaven. Historically in the church, the 10-day period between the Ascension and the coming of the Holy Spirit was considered as a mini-Lent. It was a time of deep prayer and preparation so the early Christians could become more open to the Holy Spirit in their lives. All the Scripture readings between now and then point us in the direction of the Holy Spirit. Although teaching children about the Holy Spirit, the Third Person of the Blessed Trinity, can be challenging, they do understand some common images used to help them absorb the Spirit's power. Common examples would be wind, which although we can't see wind as such, we see its effects. The other most common image is fire. Fire is all consuming and very powerful. We need fire to survive the cold and to sustain other basic needs. Fire can completely consume the environment. These examples in nature can help children learn about how powerful the Holy Spirit is.

This week, with younger children, explain that the word Spirit really mans breath. We can see our breath on a cold day. Talk about how breathing is necessary for us to live. The presence of God in our lives is necessary for us. We can't hold breath in our hands, but we know it exists and is very important. Then use a little pinwheel to create wind. Again, we can't pick up wind, but we can see its effects. The Holy Spirit moves within us to help us make good choices and to do good. With school age children, place some sugar in the water and ask children to separate the sugar from the water. Food coloring can also be used the same way. Children will see

that once the plain water is mixed with something, the original ingredients can not be removed. Through Baptism, we become part of God's family. All three Persons of the Blessed Trinity live in us. Our job is to follow God's rules and to ask Him to help us act like His children. Ask older children to think of those in their lives who demonstrate one or more of the Gifts of the Holy Spirit. This is a particularly good conversation to have with those preparing for the Sacrament of Confirmation. Make a list of people the children and even adult family members recognize as demonstrating a particular Gift of the Holy Spirit. Decide on one person and send a note to that person telling him/her which Gift of the Holy Spirit you see in his/ her actions. Decide to learn by this good example.

We are getting closer to the end of the Church's Easter season, but these remaining days are extremely important for all of us to observe, especially children. Be sure to bring your children to Mass on Ascension Thursday this week as it is a Holy day of Obligation, but don't consider going to Mass just an "obligation." Rather consider it a great opportunity to celebrate this next "milestone" in the Easter journey. Making connections for children is how they put together the great treasure they have been given as Catholics. Have a Blessed Mother's Day!






