THE CHURCH IS OPEN 6 AM TO 6 PM

Daily Mass can be viewed on staidanparish.org, Facebook and Vimeo. The faithful are required to attend Sunday and Holy Days of Obligation Masses. This obligation does not apply to those who are ill, those who are confined to their home, a hospital, or nursing facility, or those with serious underlying health conditions. For

the safety of all, the church doors will be closed when school children attend services during the week.

PARKING AT ST. AIDAN

The number of parking spaces is limited at St. Aidan. The parking lot at the rear of the Upper School and the one on Dover Street are available on weekends and when school is closed. The Lower School has an area that is designated a children's play area. People with disabilities may park in the three reserved parking spaces in front of the rectory on Willis Ave. This special area is needed for church access by people who use wheelchairs and specially-equipped vehicles. Thank you for being parking considerate.

BAPTISM

To arrange a baptism contact the rectory office. Forms need to be completed giving information on the parents, child's date and place of birth, as well as the names and religious affiliation of the sponsors. At least one sponsor must be a practicing Catholic. Baptisms are held on the 1st Sunday and 3rd Sunday at 1:30 PM. To hold a private baptism you must make arrangements with a priest or deacon to perform the baptism. Private baptisms are held on Saturday or Sunday when the church is available. First time parents are required to attend a Baptism Class. Classes are held in the church on the second Sunday of the month after the 12 PM Mass. Parents are asked to gather at St. Joseph's statue to the right of the altar.

RECEIVING HOLY COMMUNION

Holy Communion unites us more closely to Jesus, and it is also a sign that we are living in communion with His Church, following the teachings that Jesus has handed down to us. If you know of someone homebound who would like to receive Communion from a Eucharistic Minister, please contact the Rectory.

First and Third Fridays of the month 1:00-3:00

PM in the church.

CONFESSION

Confessions are available in the church, screen only, on Saturday from 12:30 PM to 1:30 PM and 4:00 PM to 5:00 PM. You can also make an appointment with a priest by calling the rectory office.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

Anointing of the sick takes place at 1:00 PM on the 4th Sunday of each month. Please wait for the priest at Our Lady's Shrine.

MARRIAGE

Arrangements are to be made at the Rectory office at least 9 months in advance. Pre-Cana and FOCCUS registrations must be arranged. Pre-Cana at St. Aidan consists of a ONE DAY SATURDAY COURSE. The moderator is Deacon Rudy Martin (917) 952-6521. Email: Dcrudy@Staidanparish.org.

I hope you can join us Sunday morning at our PARISH MINISTRY FAIR on Dover Street.







To mark the beginning of the Parish Year of the Eucharistic Revival (June 2023-July 2024), every parish in the country is invited to plan a Eucharistic procession. The time of the procession at St. Aidan will be after the 10:30 AM Mass. In Eucharistic Processions, the missionary aspect of the Eucharist is emphasized as we go forth into the world. Not only gazing upon our Eucharistic Lord, but walking with him, we experience what the disciples did 2000 years ago as they walked with Jesus, proclaiming the Good News to the world. ARE YOU SEARCHING?

Are you searching for a faith to follow? Do you know someone who may be interested in learning more about what the Catholic Church believes and teaches? Were you baptized as an infant but not raised in the faith or raised in another Christian faith? Whatever your situation, wherever you are in your faith journey, OCIA (formally RCIA) is here for YOU. OCIA stands for Order of Christian Initiation for Adults. It is a process by which adults can inquire about the Catholic Church. There is never any pressure put on any inquirer to become a Catholic. If an inquirer or seeker decides to move closer toward becoming a Catholic, he/she receives instruction in a small setting guided by a team of dedicated parishioners. The inquirer decides if he/she wants to move

forward one step at a time. The whole parish family supports this process through prayer and witness. Those who choose to become Catholic are welcomed into the Church through the reception of the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist. Why was St. Francis Health System in Oklahoma Threatened with Expulsion from Medicare, Medicaid and CHIP Over Its Long-Approved Sanctuary Candle?

The government has seen the light and has abandoned its attempt to force an Oklahoma hospital to blow out a small candle or stop serving elderly, disabled, and low-income patients," Lori Windham, vice president and senior counsel at the Becket religious liberty legal group, said May 5 on Twitter

The chapel's candle has never been an issue in previous inspections. Other open flames are permitted at hospitals in kitchen stoves and ovens, gas dryers in the laundry room, flames in gas water heaters, and welding for construction purposes, Windham noted.

According to Windham, the hospital candle is "encased in a thick glass globe, which is itself encased in a second glass globe, covered by a bronze top that fits over the second globe." This globe rests in a bronze holder affixed to the chapel wall. There are fire extinguishing sprinkler heads around the candle and the local fire marshal has long approved it.

During a Feb. 21 inspection, Windham's letter to CMS recounted, a surveyor from The Joint Commission at Saint Francis Hospital South in Tulsa "expressly asked to go to the chapel to see if there was a living flame." The surveyor observed to hospital personnel that "other Catholic hospitals had complied and extinguished the living flame at their chapels, substituting it with an electric light." While federal standards do classify chapel candles as "flame-producing equipment," these are only barred within one foot of a nasal cannula, a device to provide supplemental oxygen. The hospital candle is never near such a device. The relevant codes and standards of the National Fire Protection Association expressly permit sanctuary candles.

LITURGY

Today will finish our tour through the Our Father. There is one more petition, then something called a doxology, which comes from the Greek "doxa" meaning "glory" and "logia" meaning "saying", hence a short hymn of praise to God often added to the end of psalms, prayers, and hymns. You are all familiar with one, the Final Doxology at the end of the Eucharistic Prayer at Mass ("Through Him, and with Him..."). There is a second one at the end of the Our Father, to which we now return.

The last petition in the Our Father is "but deliver us from evil". This is something Jesus specifically prayed for during His final discourse with His apostles. From the CCC, "2850

The last petition to our Father is also included in Jesus' prayer: "I am not asking you to take them out of the world, but I ask you to protect them from the evil one...2851 In this petition, evil is not an abstraction, but refers to a person, Satan, the Evil One, the angel who opposes God...2852... Through him sin and death entered the world and by his definitive defeat all creation will be "freed from the corruption of sin and death." The Lord Who has taken away your sin and pardoned your faults also protects you and keeps you from the wiles of your adversary the devil, so that the enemy, who is accustomed to leading into sin, may not surprise you. One who entrusts himself to God does not dread the devil. "If God is for us, who is against us?" So here we are asking God to extend the protection Jesus purchased for us on the cross. It also reinforces our plea "to be holy as God is holy" as being protected from the lures of the devil will help us in our quest. Other than "Amen", this is the end of the prayer Jesus gave us, and as we pray it outside of Mass. Our "Amen" is a formal ratification of everything we have just said in prayer. But at Mass, there are two more brief additions. The first is said by the priest, and it further extends that final petition we just saw. "Deliver us, Lord, we beseech you, from every evil and grant us peace in our day, so that aided by your mercy we might be ever free from sin and protected from all anxiety, as we await the blessed hope and the coming of our Savior, Jesus Christ." And we all respond in unison with the final doxology, "For the kingdom, the power and the glory are yours, now and forever." In a way, this closes the circle of the Our Father by returning us to where we started. "2855 The final doxology...takes up again, by inclusion, the first three petitions to our Father: the glorification of his name, the coming of his reign, and the power of his saving will. But these prayers are now proclaimed as adoration and thanksgiving, as in the liturgy of heaven. The ruler of this world (Satan) has mendaciously attributed to himself the three titles of kingship, power, and glory. Christ, the Lord, restores them to his Father and our Father, until he hands over the kingdom to him when the mystery of salvation will be brought to its completion and God will be all in all. 2856 "Then, after the prayer is over you say 'Amen,' which means 'So be it,' thus ratifying with our 'Amen' what is contained in the prayer that God has taught us." And how could we not be in full agreement with the words Our Lord gave us? So to wrap up the Our Father, "2857 In the Our Father, the object of the first three petitions is the glory of the Father: the sanctification of his name, the coming of the kingdom, and the fulfillment of his will. The four others present our wants to him: they ask that our lives be nourished, healed of sin, and made victorious in the struggle of good over evil." In the first three petitions which relate to God, "2858 ..." we enter into God's plan, the sanctification of his name... 2859...the Church

looks first to Christ's return and the final coming of the Reign of God. It also prays for the growth of the Kingdom of God in the "today" of our own lives. 2860...we ask our Father to unite our will to that of his Son, so as to fulfill his plan of salvation in the life of the world." In the final four petitions in which we ask for what we need, "2861... by saying "give us," we express in communion with our brethren our filial trust in our heavenly Father. "Our daily bread" refers to the earthly nourishment necessary to everyone for subsistence, and also to the Bread of Life...2862 The fifth petition begs God's mercy for our offences, mercy which can penetrate our hearts only if we have learned to forgive our enemies, with the example and help of Christ. 2863 When we say "lead us not into temptation" we are asking God not to allow us to take the path that leads to sin. This petition implores the Spirit of discernment and strength...2864 In the last petition, "but deliver us from evil," Christians pray to God with the Church to show forth the victory, already won by Christ, over the "ruler of this world," Satan...2865 By the final "Amen," we express our "fiat" concerning the seven petitions: "So be it." I hope all this gives you a better understanding and appreciation of the richness of The Lord's Prayer.

FAMILY MASS Please Help Family Mass! Family Mass is looking for more adults to assist in supervising the young people who volunteer each week. It takes very little time and/or training. Family Mass: Connecting Church and Home! Today, we celebrate the Seventh Sunday of Easter. The liturgical color is white. Today's gospel, (John 12: 1-11a), is part of what is called Jesus' last discourse. It is set in the time very immediate to His death. We hear His deep prayer with the Father. He acknowledged those who follow Him are intimately joined to the Father, just as He and the Father are one. Those who belong to God are contrasted with those who belong to the world. Since we are also followers of Jesus, we proclaim to the world through our own actions our commitment to Jesus Christ. Thus, we are called Christians. This gospel also emphasizes how important prayer was to Jesus.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church says, "Prayer is crucial to the formation and life of the Church. During his earthly ministry, Jesus prayed to the Father, demonstrating to his disciples his unity with the Father and placing them under his care. (CCC, 2751) Through prayer, we are united to Christ through the power of the Holy Spirit, who prays in us. Christian prayer is always Trinitarian, addressing the unity of the Father and the Son - who prays for us and in us - inspired and enabled by the power of the Holy Spirit." (CCC, 2749). The Catechism points out to us that prayer is our communication with God. All three Persons of the Blessed Trinity are involved in our prayer even if we direct our prayer to one specific Person of the Trinity for God is One. It is worthy to note that during times of extreme hardship, people readily flocked to

prayer and to places of worship. This was evident following political assassinations, the 9/11 tragic disaster, school shootings, as well as prayers even being encouraged across many avenues within the media during the pandemic. Our children need to be formed to be people who pray all the time. Besides the prayers that are memorized early in childhood, children should be exposed to the five kinds of prayer the Catechism teaches us. These forms of prayer are Blessing and Adoration (blessing God, who blesses us with all good gifts), Petition (asking God for what we need), Thanksgiving (thanking God for all that he gives us), Intercession (praying for things that others need), and praise (praising God, not because he has done something for us, but because he is God). These forms of prayer exist in their fullness at Mass as well as prayers spoken spontaneously, memorized, reflective thoughts directed to God, listening, and Lectio Divina, which is praying with the Scriptures. In family life, we can expose children starting simple and small to all the above forms of prayer. It's only natural, if we are devoted to prayer, to share prayer with our children. With older children, point out some of the prayer forms even as they occur during Mass. Making older children more aware of these kinds of prayer can help them as they grow. With younger children, talk simply about prayer being talking to God. Use some prayer starters such as continuing the following "God, please let me know what You want me to do when....." "Thank you, God, for", "God, please heal....." "Jesus, please bless" The Lord's Prayer commonly called the Our Father, is the prayer that Jesus prayed. Explain what each line of this prayer means because this prayer is memorized early in childhood and contains many of the forms of prayer. Here is the prayer with prompt questions or comments. Our Father (Why is the word OUR important? What kind of love does a father show?) who art in heaven, (We know heaven is our destination. We know God has a place for us.) hallowed be thy name, (How do we keep God's name holy?) Thy kingdom come. (We are part of the Kingdom. Our mission is to act

in ways that others will also want to

be part of God's Kingdom.) Thy will be done on earth, as it is in heaven. (What is God's will or plan for us? How do we listen and respond to God's plan?) Give us this day our daily bread, (What do we need to live? Besides what we need to live, how else does God take care of us?) and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us, (We ask for God's forgiveness, and we are challenged to extend the same forgiveness to others.) and lead us not into temptation, (We will always face temptation. How do we depend on God to help us avoid making bad choices?) but deliver us from evil. (We know that God loves us and will protect us. How does that give us the strength and courage to confront evil ourselves and help us bring goodness to the world?) Amen. (This is our saying YES to all the things stated in the Our Father.) Prayer changes us for the better! When we help children by sharing prayer and the forms of prayer with them, we are helping children establish a solid comfort level of communication with God. We know life will bring its challenges to our children so exposing them early in life to communicating with God will be a legacy that will empower then throughout their lives.

The Easter season will end next week on Pentecost Sunday. The church will be celebrating the Coming of the Holy Spirit. Pray this week as a family for each family member to be filled with the power of the Holy Spirit! COME HOLY SPIRIT!




