

THE CHURCH IS OPEN 6 AM TO 6 PM

Daily Mass can be viewed on staidanparish.org, Facebook and Vimeo. The faithful are required to attend Sunday and Holy Days of Obligation Masses. This obligation does not apply to those who are ill, those who are confined to their home, a hospital, or nursing facility, or those

with serious underlying health conditions. For the safety of all, the church doors will be closed when school children attend services during the week.

PARKING AT ST. AIDAN

The number of parking spaces is limited at St. Aidan. The parking lot at the rear of the Upper School and the one on Dover Street are available on weekends and when school is closed. The Lower School has an area that is designated a children's play area. People with disabilities may park in the three reserved parking spaces in front of the rectory on Willis Ave. This special area is needed for church access by people who use wheelchairs and specially-equipped vehicles. Thank you for being parking considerate.

BAPTISM

To arrange a baptism contact the rectory office. Forms need to be completed giving information on the parents, child's date and place of birth, as well as the names and religious affiliation of the sponsors. At least one sponsor must be a practicing Catholic. Baptisms are held on the 1st Sunday and 3rd Sunday at 1:30 PM. To hold a private baptism you must make arrangements with a priest or deacon to perform the baptism. Private baptisms are held on Saturday or Sunday when the church is available. First time parents are required to attend a Baptism Class. Classes are held in the church on the second Sunday of the month after the 12 PM Mass. Parents are asked to gather at St. Joseph's statue to the right of the altar.

EUCHARISTIC ADORATION

First and Third Fridays of the month 1:00-3:00 PM in the church.

RECEIVING HOLY COMMUNION

Holy Communion unites us more closely to Jesus, and it is also a sign that we are living in communion with His Church, following the teachings that Jesus has handed down to us. If you know of someone homebound who would

like to receive Communion from a Eucharistic Minister, please contact the Rectory.

CONFESSION

Confessions are available in the church, screen only, on Saturday from 12:30 PM to 1:30 PM and 4:00 PM to 5:00 PM. You can also make an appointment with a priest by calling the rectory office.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

Anointing of the sick takes place at 1:00 PM on the 4th Sunday of each month. Please wait for the priest at Our Lady's Shrine.

MARRIAGE

Arrangements are to be made at the Rectory office at least 9 months in advance. Pre-Cana and FOCCUS registrations must be arranged. Pre-Cana at St. Aidan consists of a ONE DAY SATURDAY COURSE. The moderator is Deacon Rudy Martin (917) 952-6521. Email: Dcrudy@Staidanparish.org.


What's Pastor Thinking

The phrase "FEAR NOT" appears again and again in the gospels. At the time the gospels were written it was

dangerous to be a Christian. Not only could you loose your family and friends, but you could also face persecution and death. Even today when you publicly acknowledge you are Christian and live according to the Church's teaching, you will draw enmity and even hatred upon yourself. And you know why? Because our society has become a society of little conviction. Everything is done to please some group or other, but not God. And at what price? It is the price of moral values, the price of justice, the price of losing God. But 'FEAR NOT!' Jesus says. He promised to send us His Spirit to give us courage. FEAR NOT when people roll their eyes and look at you like you are a fanatic, God will give you courage.

Washington Nationals pitcher Trevor Williams recently showed great courage. He was the first MLB player to denounce the Dodgers' decision to honor the anti-Catholic group, the sisters of perpetual indulgence. This group call themselves nuns and regularly use the likenesses of Jesus, the Blessed Virgin Mary, and women religious in ways that the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops has called 'blasphemous.' Williams said the Dodger's honoring this group makes "a blatant and deeply offensive mockery of my religion, and the religion of over 4 million people in Los Angeles county alone." He added, "we cannot stand idly by while Our Lord gets mocked." "When I die and St. Peter greets me at the gates, he's not





going to ask what your win-loss record was in 2023. He's going to ask, 'How did you build the kingdom of heaven?" Growing up in San Diego, Williams shared that it was in adoration as a teenager that he first felt called to make his Catholic faith the center of his life. As a teenager, he was moved by the idea that "every decision you make is going to destroy the kingdom of heaven or build it up." To this day, he believes he can best hear the voice of God through silent prayer and adoration. "[In adoration], you see and adore Our Creator and the King of the Universe right there on the altar." "I think you need to hear the voice of God first, you need to spend as much time in silence as possible, you need to spend time in front of the Blessed Sacrament." As a 31-year old husband and father of three boys and a girl, he continues to turn toward prayer, the sacraments, and his family for strength. "I want to be able to show my children that we have to stand and walk by our faith," he said. "If they ever get tested at some point in their life, I want them to know that it's OK to stand up for our faith."

It is not easy to stand up for faith in an age where having convictions is equated to being a fanatic, or being narrow-minded. But Jesus knows that too. Fear not. You will be hated, you will be made fun of, you will be punished for standing up for God, but when we do we are in good company of many of our brothers and sisters on whose lives the kingdom of God was built. Convictions—you got to have them.

OCIA stands for Order of Christian Initiation for Adults. It is a process by which adults can inquire about the Catholic Church. There is never any pressure put on any inquirer to become a Catholic. If an inquirer or seeker decides to move closer toward becoming a Catholic, he/she receives instruction in a small setting guided by a team of dedicated parishioners. The inquirer decides if he/she wants to move forward one step at a time. The whole parish family supports this process through prayer and witness. Those who choose to become Catholic are welcomed into the Church through the reception of the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist. 



The Unique Contributions of Christianity to the World

Christianity has made numerous contributions to the world, demonstrating that it turned the ancient world upside down and laid the foundation for positive changes in societies around the world. While some choose to list the faults of those who claim to be Christians but have done great harm, the actual good done in the name of Christ is astonishing.

"It is impossible to exaggerate the importance of the coming of Christianity. It brought with it, for one thing, an altogether new sense of human life. For the Greeks had shown man his mind; but the Christians showed him his soul. They taught that in the sight of God, all souls were equal, that every human life was sacrosanct and inviolate," wrote Yale historian R.R. Palmer. (1)

"The gospel not only converts the individual, but it changes real social gospel. They established standards of hygiene and purity, promoted industry, elevated womanhood, restrained anti-social customs, abolished cannibalism and human sacrifice, organized famine relief, checked tribal wars, and changed the social structure of society," wrote Princeton Prof, Samuel Zwerner." (2)

Despite its humble origins, Christianity made more changes on earth for good than any other movement in history. "Education, social reform, medicine, democracy, the arts and modern science all owe much of their current existence to the teaching and ideas of the followers of Jesus Christ," wrote author David Robertson.(3)

Following Emperor Constantine's conversion in A.D. 325, the churches built hospitals, hospices for travelers and houses for orphans, widows and the indigent. Historians note that charitable organizations are almost unknown in the ancient world until the time of Christ.

- * Christians took real, practical steps helping the sick. The Emperor Charlemagne (800-814) decreed that every cathedral was required to have an attached hospital.
- * Monasteries generated the copying of Scripture and other literature, especially from Greece, and their libraries provided the inspiration for the first universities in the 12th and 13th centuries.
- * Christianity places a high value on truth and that truth about the existence of God can be discovered through observation of the natural world, thus having a positive impact on the development of the sciences.
- * Christianity produced a middle class not known to mankind. It had always been the rich and the poor, the elite and the serfs or slaves. But with Christ, the carpenter, there was now honor in all work as a God-given calling, helping to produce a vibrant middle class.(4)

LITURGY


What do we want when we eat food? Something that is both delicious and nutritious. That is exactly what we get with the Eucharist. But it is not physically delicious and nutritious. Rather it is spiritually delicious and nutritious. As St. Thomas Aquinas aptly named it, we receive the bread of angels, the supernatural food which brings heaven down to earth. It provides the spiritual enjoyment and sustenance that we crave to sustain us after we have been Baptized into a new life. In the Eucharist, Christ, through the celebrant, takes bread in His hands and, through the bread, offers us His Body, the best imaginable nourishment. Under the appearance of the most common earthly food, he gives the Church a foretaste of the heavenly banquet. When Christ comes to us in the Eucharist, He gives us spiritual delight and supernatural nourishment beyond what our eyes see or tongue tastes. Far better than the manna of the Old Testament, which only satisfied an earthly hunger, He feeds us with the key to our hunger for an eternal heavenly satisfaction. And in so doing, He fulfills what the Old Testament both required and foretold, as well as what He promised. How does that come about?

The last words Jesus spoke to His disciples at the end of the Gospel of St. Mark were recorded as follows: Mt 28: 20b "And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age." They probably didn't quite get the full meaning of this at the time (this was at the Ascension), but they eventually did, after Pentecost, and we, with the benefit of 2,000 years and much prayer and understanding by the Church fathers, can see this from several points of view. Certainly, the most critical and physical way in which Jesus is still with us until the end of the age is in the Eucharist. There is an extensive background to this. The Old Testament required an ongoing string of imperfect sacrifices as described over and over in the Bible.

Jesus very clearly states that these offerings which were made under God's original covenant had now come to an end, as He would offer the new eternal sacrifice of the new and everlasting covenant. That is what He described at the Last Supper, and then carried out the next day. He clearly said the words our priests use at every Mass when He offered the bread and wine to His apostles. This is My Body. This is the new covenant in My Blood. By so doing, He answers two questions. Previously, He had told them, as recorded in Jn 6: 53-55, "So Jesus said to them, "Very truly, I tell you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you

have no life in you. Those who eat my flesh and drink my blood have eternal life, and I will raise them up on the last day; for my flesh is true food and my blood is true drink." That, of course, offended many of His Jewish followers for whom this would be totally forbidden on several levels. Even His apostles were clearly confused. But Jesus really resolves the confusion at the Last Supper. Recall what that was, the Passover meal. The Jewish feast required the slaughter of a lamb, just at their priests sacrificed a lamb as a sin offering to God, and, just as both the Passover lamb and the sacrifices offered by the priests would be eaten, so would Jesus, the Lamb of God, be sacrificed as the final eternal sacrifice for the forgiveness of sins, not just sins from the past year, but for all sins for all time. And just as those lambs were eaten, so would He be eaten by us, just as He said we must do. That is why what looks like bread and wine has become His Body and Blood in the Eucharist when the priest uses the same words spoken by Jesus at the Last Supper. That is why regardless of what our eyes and tongue tell us, we hold to the doctrine of the Real Presence of the Body and Blood of Christ under the appearance of bread and wine.

That will take us into some very deep theological discussions concerning transubstantiation when the Liturgy column returns in a few weeks.





CONNECTING CHURCH AND HOME! Today is the Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time. The liturgical color is green. Today's gospel, (Matthew 10:26-33), is a continuation of Jesus' instruction to His disciples before sending them out to preach and teach His message. Jesus reminds them over and over that fulfilling His commission is not easy. He is preparing them for the resistance they would ultimately experience. They will face not only verbal abuse from others, but also, their physical lives would be endangered. Those, whom the disciples might have expected to accept Jesus' message, will reject it. Jesus reassures His disciples that regardless of what struggles they may face, or obstacles thrown before them, the disciples can rely on knowing that the Father knows what they need and will provide for them. This providence may not be what the disciples would necessarily want, but it would be what they need. Jesus sets the priority that their souls and the souls of others are worth whatever may come their way.

This gospel almost sounds like a battle cry! No matter what the situation, the struggle between good and evil, between comfort and discomfort, between trust and fear, between light and darkness will continue but love always wins in the end. True disciples of Jesus must approach the spiritual warfare that shrouds our human struggles with confidence and a clarity that comes from having a relationship with God. Three times in just the few verses of this gospel, Jesus reminds them not to be fearful.

Like those first disciples, it is easier said than done to put aside our very realistic fears. We don't like uncertainty. These first disciples did not have the whole picture since Jesus had not yet suffered His Passion, Death, and Resurrection. They would need to walk into the world around them relying completely on trusting God.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church reminds us the, "Jesus Christ, himself the revelation of God to the world, suffered persecution at the hands of an obstinate world. The Church, the community of those whom he sends to complete his work, is Christ's instrument in the work of salvation." (CCC, 737, 778). Members of the Church should expect to be ignored or mistreated but must continue without fear, knowing God is with them.

Children often encounter struggles. For many young children, the first struggles will come from trying to get along with those in their nuclear households, especially siblings. As they acquire outside friends and attend school, some will experience persecution in ways that may seem very insignificant to adults, but these difficult experiences are tough for children. Being left out or feeling bad because of some limitation a child may have can be devastating for children. Unfortunately, as a society, we see and hear about the serious bullying that often takes place in schools, on playgrounds, and in sports. Discussing situations children may

involved can help them cope if a time comes along that affects them. Discussing how to show the message of Jesus by definite preparation can help them to trust that God is in control.

observe even if they are not directly

This week, with younger children, cut out a pointed topped paper house. Talk about how Jesus wants us to shout out His message form the rooftops. (In Jesus' time, this is how a person would get the attention of others by going to a high place like a roof or mountaintop because there were not microphones!!) Talk about ways we could be good witnesses for Jesus and let children decorate the tops of the paper houses by drawing little pictures or writing words that

describe the good things we must share. Some examples could be things in creation, positive words, different acts of kindness etc.) Display those houses throughout the week. With older children, talk about what an evangelist is. An evangelist is a faith witness. An evangelist is someone who preaches and teaches about following Jesus through words and actions. Make a list of words and actions that would help children become more conscious little evangelists.

Being a Catholic Christian especially in today's world is challenging but in keeping with Jesus' instruction to His first disciples, well worth the effort. The reward for faithfulness is great and will be greater for eternity!

Today is the last Family Mass Sunday for this season; however, our responsibility to take our children to Mass every Sunday or Saturday evening continues. Family Mass will continue to provide some limited children's Mass support materials throughout the summer months as well as some Family Connection ideas in the bulletin. Please take advantage of these materials.

Many thanks to the generous members of the Family Mass Team and the great number of young teens who assisted at Family Mass during the past school year. Family Mass is scheduled to resume on Sunday, September 10th at the 10:30AM Mass. Have a Blessed and Happy Summer!


NICENE CREED
