Daily Mass can be viewed on staidanparish.org, Facebook and Vimeo. The faithful are required to attend Sunday and Holy Days of Obligation Masses. This obligation does not apply to those who are ill, those who are confined to their home, a hospital, or nursing facility, or those

with serious underlying health conditions. For the safety of all, the church doors will be closed when school children attend services during the week.

PARKING AT ST. AIDAN

The number of parking spaces is limited at St. Aidan. The parking lot at the rear of the Upper School and the one on Dover Street are available on weekends and when school is closed. The Lower School has an area that is designated a children's play area. People with disabilities may park in the three reserved parking spaces in front of the rectory on Willis Ave. This special area is needed for church access by people who use wheelchairs and specially-equipped vehicles. Thank you for being parking considerate.

BAPTISM

To arrange a baptism contact the rectory office. Forms need to be completed giving information on the parents, child's date and place of birth, as well as the names and religious affiliation of the sponsors. At least one sponsor must be a practicing Catholic. Baptisms are held on the 1st Sunday and 3rd Sunday at 1:30 PM. To hold a private baptism you must make arrangements with a priest or deacon to perform the baptism. Private baptisms are held on Saturday or Sunday when the church is available. First time parents are required to attend a Baptism Class. Classes are held in the church on the second Sunday of the month after the 12 PM Mass. Parents are asked to gather at St. Joseph's statue to the right of the altar.

EUCHARISTIC ADORATION

First and Third Fridays of the month 1:00-3:00 PM in the church.

RECEIVING HOLY COMMUNION

Holy Communion unites us more closely to Jesus, and it is also a sign that we are living in communion with His Church, following the teachings that Jesus has handed down to us. If you know of someone homebound who would

like to receive Communion from a Eucharistic Minister, please contact the Rectory.

CONFESSION

Confessions are available in the church, screen only, on Saturday from 12:30 PM to 1:30 PM and 4:00 PM to 5:00 PM. You can also make an appointment with a priest by calling the rectory office.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

Anointing of the sick takes place at 1:00 PM on the 4th Sunday of each month. Please wait for the priest at Our Lady's Shrine.

MARRIAGE

Arrangements are to be made at the Rectory office at least 9 months in advance. Pre-Cana and FOCCUS registrations must be arranged. Pre-Cana at St. Aidan consists of a ONE DAY SATURDAY COURSE. The moderator is Deacon Rudy Martin (917) 952-6521. Email: Dcrudy@Staidanparish.org.



What's Pastor Thinking

It's hard to believe that it's August already! The stores remind us we will be soon 'back to school.' Hopefully

you are enjoying the Summer and are able to get a break from the routine.

Matthew's gospel today tells us that 'Jesus took Peter, James, and his brother, John, and led them up a high mountain by themselves.' But they were not going on vacation. They went up the mountain to pray. Mountaintop experiences begin with prayer. We can stop and pray anywhere, and Jesus could have too, but he chooses to take the time, to go to the mountain to pray. It seems to me that there is something important in this for us to consider. Perhaps, like Jesus, we need to make the time and take the time; to go to our prayer place to spend time listening and talking to God. Yes, I know that we can pray anywhere—in the car, in the shower, while cleaning - but consider following Jesus' example. WHERE IS YOUR PRAYER PLACE? Where is that special place, that special space where you feel God's presence in an especially powerful way? Perhaps it's the beach, perhaps a garden, the church, perhaps it's a special retreat place. I've shared with you, that one of the places that I go to for prayer is a monastery. As soon as I walk into the church in the monastery, I feel the peace of God's presence and the joy of stepping away of retreating. When I chant the psalms with the monks, I feel bathed in the music and

surrounded by God's love. If you haven't found a prayer place, how going to sit in our church during the day when it is quiet. The silence and beauty of any church is like an oasis in a desert. Moments of transformation begin with moments of prayer. Jesus shows us that we need to find the place and make the time to pray.

Now Jesus could have gone up the mountain by himself, but Luke tells us that Jesus chose to bring three of his disciples with him. I tend to like to be by myself when I pray, but Jesus shows us another way, and that is SOLIDARITY instead of SOLITUDE. There is something special about praying with and in the presence of others. There is something very intimate about being part of a liturgical celebration or a prayer group, and being with others to pray. And so I offer that as a possibility for you to consider. Why not join one of our many parish prayer groups. Take the time and make the time to pray.

Peter was moved by what he experienced on the mountain. He witnessed Jesus' transfiguration and was transformed himself. Holy moments are fleeting—we can't hold on to them—yet they stay with us because we are changed forever. They live on in our hearts. We remember our holy moments with a sense of awe and wonder knowing that God is very near. So look for your mountain top place of prayer. Moments of transformation begin with moments of prayer.

The Church of St. Aidan will hold First Holy Communion for children in our Faith Formation Process on Saturday, May 4, 11 & 18, 2024.



If an inquirer or seeker decides to move closer toward becoming a Catholic, he/she receives instruction in a small setting guided by a team of dedicated parishioners. The inquirer decides if he/ she wants to move forward one step at a time. The whole parish family supports this process through prayer and witness. Those who choose to become Catholic are welcomed into the Church through the reception of the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist. Religious Discrimination in the Workplace Surges to an All Time High Equal Employment Opportunity Commission (EEOC) Report shows Six Times Increase

Our founders often spoke and acted in support of freedom of conscience and the free exercise of religion for all Americans. They learned from the history of generations of their forefathers that when government interferes in the individual's faith and practices, tyranny and bloodshed were the usual results.

The 1st amendment of the United States' Constitution protects each citizen's right to believe and to practice their faith or to choose not to profess any religious beliefs.

The free expression of faith in every aspect of our lives injurious to other is protected and expected but frequently denied neighbor to say the unnecessarily and unconstitutionally in the workplace. Instances of religious discrimination often take the form of

denial of hiring, being fired or denied promotion being harassed over religious beliefs, dress and food

choices failure to accommodate religious holy days, not allowing religious icons displayed in the employee's workspace or banning religiouslyobservant clothing. The latest report from the EEOC shows that from 2021 to 2022 the instances of complaints of religious discrimination in the workplace surged from 2,111 to 13,814. The increase is sharp and alarming and may or may not reflect all the discrimination that actually occurs.

LITURGY COLUMN will return in a few weeks

August 15th is the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary!

The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary is a Holy Day of Obligation, and we're looking forward to seeing you here at Mass!

Mary was always a virgin, both in conceiving Jesus, giving birth to him, and remaining virgin ever after. God granted her this privilege to emphasize that this was a unique moment in history—the birth of Jesus who is the Son of God and the Son of Mary. The liturgy of the Church speaks of Mary as "ever virgin." In the early Church some denied this, arguing that the Gospels speak of the brothers and sisters of Jesus, and thus maintained that Mary did



not remain a virgin after the birth of Jesus. But already in the fourth century, theologians pointed out that the Greek word for brother used in the New Testament can refer also to cousin. A second explanation was that these brothers and sisters were children of Joseph by a previous marriage. However, it is the constant teaching of the Church that Mary remained a virgin even after the birth of Jesus. In her virginity, Mary lived a life dedicated exclusively to her Son and his mission. Her example has been followed by some of Christ's disciples who have lived lives of consecrated virginity and celibacy from apostolic times to the present.

In the mystery of her Assumption, Mary experiences immediately what we all will experience eventually, a bodily resurrection like Christ's own. "The Immaculate Virgin . . . when the course of her earthly life was finished, was taken up body and soul into heavenly glory, and exalted by the Lord as Queen over all things, so that she might be more fully conformed to her Son, the Lord of lords and conqueror of death" (CCC, no. 966, citing LG, no. 59).

Finally, in Mary we behold what the Church is already like during her pilgrimage of faith—and what the Church will become at the end of the journey. "Mary figured profoundly in the history of salvation and in a certain way unites and mirrors within herself the central truths of the faith" (LG, no. 65).





I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.


