THE CHURCH IS OPEN 6 AM TO 6 PM

Daily Mass can be viewed on staidanparish.org, Facebook and Vimeo. The faithful are required to attend Sunday and Holy Days of Obligation Masses. This obligation does not apply to those who are ill, those who are confined to their home, a hospital, or nursing facility, or those

with serious underlying health conditions. For the safety of all, the church doors will be closed when school children attend services during the week.

PARKING AT ST. AIDAN

The number of parking spaces is limited at St. Aidan. The parking lot at the rear of the Upper School and the one on Dover Street are available on weekends and when school is closed. The Lower School has an area that is designated a children's play area. People with disabilities may park in the three reserved parking spaces in front of the rectory on Willis Ave. This special area is needed for church access by people who use wheelchairs and specially-equipped vehicles. Thank you for being parking considerate.

BAPTISM

To arrange a baptism contact the rectory office. Forms need to be completed giving information on the parents, child's date and place of birth, as well as the names and religious affiliation of the sponsors. At least one sponsor must be a practicing Catholic. Baptisms are held on the 1st Sunday and 3rd Sunday at 1:30 PM. To hold a private baptism you must make arrangements with a priest or deacon to perform the baptism. Private baptisms are held on Saturday or Sunday when the church is available. First time parents are required to attend a Baptism Class. Classes are held in the church on the second Sunday of the month after the 12 PM Mass. Parents are asked to gather at St. Joseph's statue to the right of the altar.

EUCHARISTIC ADORATION

First and Third Fridays of the month 1:00-3:00 PM in the church.

RECEIVING HOLY COMMUNION

Holy Communion unites us more closely to Jesus, and it is also a sign that we are living in communion with His Church, following the teachings that Jesus has handed down to us. If you know of someone homebound who would

like to receive Communion from a Eucharistic Minister, please contact the Rectory.

CONFESSION

Confessions are available in the church, screen only, on Saturday from 12:30 PM to 1:30 PM and 4:00 PM to 5:00 PM. You can also make an appointment with a priest by calling the rectory office.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

Anointing of the sick takes place at 1:00 PM on the 4th Sunday of each month. Please wait for the priest at Our Lady's Shrine.

MARRIAGE

Arrangements are to be made at the Rectory office at least 9 months in advance. Pre-Cana and FOCCUS registrations must be arranged. Pre-Cana at St. Aidan consists of a ONE DAY SATURDAY COURSE. The moderator is Deacon Rudy Martin (917) 952-6521. Email: Dcrudy@Staidanparish.org.

What's Pastor Thinking

If someone were to ask you, what is faith, how would you reply? We all have some faith. The very fact that

we go to bed at night expecting to wake up in the morning is faith. When you came to Church this weekend, you expected the floor to hold you, the pew to seat you, and that the roof would not cave in on you. That is faith. Why is it so easy to have faith in these things, and so difficult to have faith in God? St. Peter is the model of faith for millions of believers. Why? Well he had faith in Jesus because Jesus had faith in him. Today we see him step out of a boat because Jesus believed he could. 'Doubt no longer but believe.' We have faith in God because God has given us faith in God.

Now, most of us don't know this. We grow up going to Peter's faith made him take risks. Faith made him Church, we know the prayers before we can read them. We hear the rhythm of the Mass before we can understand it. We see the candles, the Christmas lights, the changing colors on the sanctuary, and they become part of our faith's expression. Yet, these alone are not faith, for faith is more than a feeling or an understanding. Faith is also commitment to the One

who has given us faith.

Peter didn't know where he was going when he first followed Jesus and left his fishing nets behind him. When he accompanied him for three years he didn't know everything about Him, but he believed him. Later when he got to Rome, and to the hill of execution, he accepted his end in faith. He moved on in stages toward God. In all that time, in all those stages, the only thing Peter had to guide him was his belief in his faith in Jesus.

If someone were to ask you, what is faith, how do you know you have it? How would you reply? I can't tell you what faith is. I can't tell you if you have enough faith, or too much faith. I can only show you that because of faith, my life has changed.

Too often, we are afraid to take the risks our faith tells us we should. We are comfortable. Yet, every night when we go to bed, we take the risk that we will get up in the morning.

- Students attending CATHOLIC SCHOOL participate in religion class at their school.
- All students and parents from Faith Formation and Catholic School are required to attend Mass. Three Masses this year will focus on 7th Grade, and three Masses will focus on 8th Grade.
- All students from Faith Formation and Catholic School will be asked to engage in acts of service to church, family and community.
- Through participating in CLASS, attending MASS and making our lives an act of SERVICE to others, we become ALIVE IN CHRIST.

I look forward to seeing you at the SEPTEMBER INTRODUCTION MEETING. The Holy Spirit has great plans for you and your family. Let the fire of the Spirit's love warm the heart of your home and enable your family to be a light to the world that brings everyone who meets you closer to Christ.

August 15th is the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary!

The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary is a Holy Day of Obligation, and we're looking forward to seeing you here at Mass!

Mary was always a virgin, both in conceiving Jesus, giving birth to him, and remaining virgin ever after. God granted her this privilege to emphasize that this was a unique moment in history—the birth of Jesus who is the Son of God and the Son of Mary. The liturgy of the Church speaks of Mary as "ever virgin." In the early Church some denied this, arguing that the Gospels speak of the brothers and sisters of Jesus, and thus maintained that Mary did



not remain a virgin after the birth of Jesus. But already in the fourth century, theologians pointed out that the Greek word for brother used in the New Testament can refer also to cousin. A second explanation was that these brothers and sisters were children of Joseph by a previous marriage. However, it is the constant teaching of the Church that Mary remained a virgin even after the birth of Jesus. In her virginity, Mary lived a life dedicated exclusively to her Son and his mission. Her example has been followed by some of Christ's disciples who have lived lives of consecrated virginity and celibacy from apostolic times to the present.

In the mystery of her Assumption, Mary experiences immediately what we all will experience eventually, a bodily resurrection like Christ's own. "The Immaculate Virgin . . . when the course of her earthly life was finished, was taken up body and soul into heavenly glory, and exalted by the Lord as Queen over all things, so that she might be more fully conformed to her Son, the Lord of lords and conqueror of death" (CCC, no. 966, citing LG, no. 59).

Finally, in Mary we behold what the Church is already like during her pilgrimage of faith—and what the Church will become at the end of the journey. "Mary figured profoundly in the history of salvation and in a certain way unites and mirrors within herself the central truths of the faith" (LG, no. 65).

There is never any pressure put on any inquirer to become a Catholic. If an inquirer or seeker

decides to move closer toward becoming a Catholic, he/she receives instruction in a small setting guided by a team of dedicated parishioners.
