

THE CHURCH IS OPEN 6 AM TO 6 PM

Daily Mass can be viewed on staidanparish.org, Facebook and Vimeo. The faithful are required to attend Sunday and Holy Days of Obligation Masses. This obligation does not apply to those who are ill, those who are confined to their home, a hospital, or nursing facility, or those

with serious underlying health conditions. For the safety of all, the church doors will be closed when school children attend services during the week.

PARKING AT ST. AIDAN

The number of parking spaces is limited at St. Aidan. The parking lot at the rear of the Upper School and the one on Dover Street are available on weekends and when school is closed. The Lower School has an area that is designated a children's play area. People with disabilities may park in the three reserved parking spaces in front of the rectory on Willis Ave. This special area is needed for church access by people who use wheelchairs and specially-equipped vehicles. Thank you for being parking considerate.

BAPTISM

To arrange a baptism contact the rectory office. Forms need to be completed giving information on the parents, child's date and place of birth, as well as the names and religious affiliation of the sponsors. At least one sponsor must be a practicing Catholic. Baptisms are held on the 1st Sunday and 3rd Sunday at 1:30 PM. To hold a private baptism you must make arrangements with a priest or deacon to perform the baptism. Private baptisms are held on Saturday or Sunday when the church is available. First time parents are required to attend a Baptism Class. Classes are held in the church on the second Sunday of the month after the 12 PM Mass. Parents are asked to gather at St. Joseph's statue to the right of the altar.

EUCHARISTIC ADORATION

First and Third Fridays of the month 1:00-3:00 PM in the church.

RECEIVING HOLY COMMUNION

Holy Communion unites us more closely to Jesus, and it is also a sign that we are living in communion with His Church, following the teachings that Jesus has handed down to us. If you know of someone homebound who would

like to receive Communion from a Eucharistic Minister, please contact the Rectory.

CONFESSION

Confessions are available in the church, screen only, on Saturday from 12:30 PM to 1:30 PM and 4:00 PM to 5:00 PM. You can also make an appointment with a priest by calling the rectory office.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

Anointing of the sick takes place at 1:00 PM on the 4th Sunday of each month. Please wait for the priest at Our Lady's Shrine.

MARRIAGE

Arrangements are to be made at the Rectory office at least 9 months in advance. Pre-Cana and FOCCUS registrations must be arranged. Pre-Cana at St. Aidan consists of a ONE DAY SATURDAY COURSE. The moderator is Deacon Rudy Martin (917) 952-6521. Email: Dcrudy@Staidanparish.org.

What's Pastor Thinking

Today's gospel gives an example of how conflicts can be resolved. In all relationships conflicts are inevitable. When marriage counselors find a

couple who claim that they have never had a disagreement or argument, the counselors know they have found an unhealthy situation, because it is not natural for independent individuals not to have differences of opinions. And while 'making up is hard to do,' conflict resolution is essential for growth and maturity.

In a mature society we expect difference of opinion. Efforts by the privileged elites in politics, media and intelligence agencies to silence the opinions of others, including the opinions of Catholics, are a dangerous threat to a free society. Catholics have a duty to speak out when we see a nation and a world in trouble. As followers of Christ we believe that He teaches the truth. Together with Christ, we have a power—the power of the Spirit to change the world. The Lord gives us courage to stand up to the lies and falsehoods that are promoted as 'progress.' And we all have a voice. Have you heard about the seventh grader in a Colorado Springs school who found his voice and spoke up after he was removed from class by administrators who said the patches on his backpack were racist. The patches included the Gadsden Flag, which was designed during the

American Revolutionary War and features a rattlesnake on a yellow background with the phrase 'Don't Tread On Me.' This was not a racist symbol but too often powerful elites use 'racism' and 'sexism' and 'phobia' to silence people. Against all odds the seventh grader stood up to the school authorities. He acknowledged he got the strength from his beliefs.

Jesus gives us strength and courage to stand up for truth. We do not merely belong to church, WE ARE CHURCH. And although the church always messes up every century and every generation, it is still the expression of the love of Christ for the world. We, as church, are here for a reason—that the world that God created and loves might be transformed and redeemed to be what it is meant to be. Each one of us can make a difference because the Holy Spirit flows through the church into the world, and miracles happen. Jesus is with us and will go with us into the world until the end of the age.

I share this prayer with you that I say every day: "Jesus, I invite you into my heart today. Please make your home there, feel at home there, and be at home there. May your presence within me today touch the hearts of those I meet, either through the words I say, the prayers I pray, the life I live, or the person that I am." Feel the presence of Christ and take it with you to all you meet.



This exposition was designed and created by Blessed Carlo Acutis, who was beatified in 2020. Blessed Carlo Arcutis was a regular young boy who loved soccer, playing video games and going to the movies with his friends. While living a relatively normal life, there was something truly remarkable about him. He possessed a deep love and devotion to Christ in the Eucharist. As the internet was gaining popularity in the early 2000s, he helped form websites for parishes, the Vatican, and made a website with information on Eucharistic miracles.

'To always be close to Jesus, that's my life plan.' With these few words Carlos Acutis, the boy who died of leukemia, outlines the distinguishing feature of his brief existence; to live with Jesus, for Jesus and in Jesus. By viewing Carlos' collection, you can experience the places and history of these documented miracles and learn the fascinating stories. Your visit to the exhibition could help come closer to Jesus during this time of Eucharistic Revival.



Celebrating Constitution Week, September 13-19, in All Schools "The U.S. Constitution stands as a testament to the tenacity of Americans throughout history to maintain their liberties, freedoms and inalienable rights." (1) In 1956, the Daughters of the American Revolution started the celebration of the Constitution adopted by Congress. Then, in 2004, Sen. Robert Byrd, correctly believing that American school children lacked significant knowledge regarding the Constitution, proposed an amendment, passed by Congress, requiring that all educational institutions receiving federal funds implement educational programs relating to the U.S. Constitution on Sept. 17 every year, celebrating the signing of the Constitution on Sept. 17, 1787. This Constitution is the world's longest surviving written charter of government with its first 3 words, "We the People", affirming that the government of these United States exists to serve its citizens. "...its framers wisely separated and balanced governmental powers to safeguard the interests of majority rule and minority rights, of liberty and equality, and of the state and federal governments." (2)

"To prevent the abuses of power they felt under the British monarchy, the Founding Fathers framed the Constitution carefully, distributing power over three branches of government, outlining its powers, limitations on those powers, and the rights of citizens." (3) The three branches were to have equal powers, called "checks and balances." "Powers not assigned to one of the three branches are left to the individual states." (4)

Some of the original delegates from the states were troubled that the original Constitution lacked a description of individual rights. In 1791, Americans added the first 10 Amendments known as the Bill of Rights. The first and foundational right is: "Congress shall make no law respecting an establishment of religion, or prohibiting the free exercise thereof; ..." (5)

Remembering September 11, 2001. We pray, especially today, for those killed in the attack on our city, country and liberties. We pray for comfort for their loved ones as a nation still grieving the loss of each one of them. Let our lives reflect respect and appreciation for the liberties they had no chance to defend that day.

If the liberties they lived are to prevail, each generation must be taught the bedrock of our liberties is inalienable rights from our Creator. The natural rights of life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness guided our founders to construct a Constitution written

for "ages and millions yet unborn" ...a Constitution not bounded by culture or by technology but by the immutable nature of man and his reliance on God.

Those Americans who died on Sept. 11, 2001, lived in the freedom to follow their faith or to choose no faith. They were not forced to behave or worship according to the dictates of any government. They were not subject to an all-powerful culture or government selecting winners and losers, rich and poor, respected and vilified. We honor them by living those freedoms and insuring them for their loved ones

As we remember the joy of their lives and the anguish of their loss, we pray for the repose of their souls in the comforting arms of the Savior of us all. May they rest in peace and may we protect and preserve the liberties for which they were so grievously attacked.

LITURGY COLUMN

Do you recognize these words? And do you know what they say? Qui pridie quam pateretur, accepit panem in sanctas ac venerabiles manus suas, et elevatis oculis in coelum ad te Deum Patrem suum omnipotentem, tibi gratias agens, benedixit, fregit, deditque discipulis suis, dicens: Accipite, et manducate ex hoc omnes: Hoc est enim Corpus Meum. Simili modo postquam coenatum est, accipiens et hunc praeclarum Calicem in sanctas ac venerabiles manus suas: item tibi gratias agens, benedixit, deditque discipulis suis, dicens: Accipite, et bibite ex eo omnes: Hic est enim Calix Sanguinis Mei, novi et aeterni testamenti: Mysterium fidei, qui pro vobis et pro multis effundetur in remissionem peccatorum. Haec quotiescumque feceritis, in mei memoriam facietis.

They are the Latin words of consecration from the pre-Vatican II Mass. Here is the old translation, which sounds a bit stilted. For instance, we don't say "ye" anymore and it's likely that the original Christians used the equivalent of "you", not "ye". Words like "ye" were used to make the bible and some prayers sound more impressive, not necessarily to be literal translations of ancient texts. That's why the King James bible sounds like it does. Anyhow, here it is.

Who, the day before He suffered, took bread into His holy and venerable hands, and having raised His eyes to heaven to Thee, God, His Almighty Father, giving thanks to Thee, blessed it, broke it, and gave it to His disciples, saying: Take ye, and eat ye all of this: For this is My Body.

In like manner, after He had supper, taking also into His holy and venerable hands this goodly chalice, again giving thanks to Thee, He blessed it, and gave it to His disciples, saying: Take ye, and drink ye all of this:

For this is the Chalice of My Blood, of the new and eternal testament, the mystery of faith, which for you and for many will be shed unto the remission of sins.

As often as you shall do these things, you shall do them in memory of $\ensuremath{\mathsf{Me}}$

Now here is the most common post-Vatican II translation. On the day before he was to suffer, he took bread in his holy and venerable hands, and with eyes raised to heaven to you, O God, his almighty Father, giving you thanks, he said the blessing, broke the bread and gave it to his disciples, saying:

Take this, all of you, and eat of it, for this is my Body, which will be given up for you.

In a similar way, when supper was ended, he took this precious chalice in his holy and venerable hands, and once more giving you thanks, he said the blessing and gave the chalice to his disciples, saying:

Take this, all of you, and drink from it, for this is the chalice of my Blood, the Blood of the new and eternal covenant, which will be poured out for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this in memory of me.

This is from Eucharistic Prayer I, the Roman Canon, which adheres most closely to the old Latin Eucharistic Prayer. There are now three others from which the priest may choose, and they are all similar in what they say. But in all four, the words of consecration are exactly the same, and they have been since the earliest days of the Church, even before they were first written down by St. Paul in his first letter to the Corinthians, 11: 23 -- 25 " For I received from the Lord what I also handed on to you, that the Lord Jesus on the night when he was betrayed took a loaf of bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and said, "This is my body that is for you. Do this in remembrance of me." In the same way he took the cup also, after supper, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me." These words were later repeated in all three synoptic Gospels, all three of which relate how Jesus instituted the sacrament of the Eucharist at the Last Supper, describing it in similar words, but using exactly the same words for the actual consecration. Jesus says "This is My Body... This is My Blood." He doesn't mince words any more than He did when earlier in His ministry He upset many of His followers as described in In 6: 48 - 56 "I am the bread of life. Your ancestors ate the manna in the wilderness, and they died. This is the bread that comes down from heaven, so that one may eat of it and not die. I am the living bread that came down from heaven. Whoever eats of this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give for the life of the world is my flesh." The Jews then disputed among themselves, saying, "How can this man give us his flesh to eat?" So Jesus said to them, "Very truly, I tell you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you have no life in you. Those who eat my flesh and drink my blood have eternal life, and I will raise them up on the last day; for my flesh is true food and my blood is true drink. Those who eat my flesh and drink my blood abide in me, and I in them." We are in a year of Eucharistic Revival. We are also divided about many things in our Church, including the old Mass and the new one. Very few of us could understand Latin when the Mass was universally said in Latin. Now we can understand the words in English, or Spanish, or whatever language we speak. But years ago, most of us understood what we received in the Eucharist. Now, however, according to several polls, far fewer of us do. Let us pray that this year of revival resolves some of our differences, but most especially, that it brings more of us to the belief in the Real Presence of the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ in the what appears as bread and wine at Mass. Because that is both the most fundamental doctrine of our faith and His most precious gift to us.

Each year Americans celebrate Labor Day as a national holiday to honor working people. For Catholics, it is also an opportunity to recall the traditional teaching of the Church on dignity of work and the rights of workers. As Pope Francis pointed out, "Work is fundamental to the dignity of a person. . . It gives one the ability to maintain oneself, one's family, to contribute to the growth of one's own Nation."







This Labor Day, the economic facts are stark, and the human costs are real, especially for the poor, who may be unemployed or underemployed, the struggle to support their families is a daily battle.
