# THE CHURCH IS OPEN 6 AM TO 6 PM

Daily Mass can be viewed on staidanparish.org, Facebook and Vimeo. The faithful are required to attend Sunday and Holy Days of Obligation Masses. This obligation does not apply to those who are ill, those who are confined to their home, a hospital, or nursing facility, or those

with serious underlying health conditions. For the safety of all, the church doors will be closed when school children attend services during the week.

#### **PARKING AT ST. AIDAN**

The number of parking spaces is limited at St. Aidan. The parking lot at the rear of the Upper School and the one on Dover Street are available on weekends and when school is closed. The Lower School has an area that is designated a children's play area. People with disabilities may park in the three reserved parking spaces in front of the rectory on Willis Ave. This special area is needed for church access by people who use wheelchairs and specially-equipped vehicles. Thank you for being parking considerate.

# **BAPTISM**

To arrange a baptism contact the rectory office. Forms need to be completed giving information on the parents, child's date and place of birth, as well as the names and religious affiliation of the sponsors. At least one sponsor must be a practicing Catholic. Baptisms are held on the 1st Sunday and 3rd Sunday at 1:30 PM. To hold a private baptism you must make arrangements with a priest or deacon to perform the baptism. Private baptisms are held on Saturday or Sunday when the church is available. First time parents are required to attend a Baptism Class. Classes are held in the church on the second Sunday of the month after the 12 PM Mass. Parents are asked to gather at St. Joseph's statue to the right of the altar.

# RECEIVING HOLY COMMUNION

Holy Communion unites us more closely to Jesus, and it is also a sign that we are living in communion with His Church, following the teachings that Jesus has handed down to us. If you know of someone homebound who would

like to receive Communion from a Eucharistic Minister, please contact the Rectory.

#### **CONFESSION**

Confessions are available in the church, screen only, on Saturday from 12:30 PM to 1:30 PM and 4:00 PM to 5:00 PM. You can also make an appointment with a priest by calling the rectory office.

#### **ANOINTING OF THE SICK**

Anointing of the sick takes place at 1:00 PM on the 4th Sunday of each month. Please wait for the priest at Our Lady's Shrine.

#### **MARRIAGE**

Arrangements are to be made at the Rectory office at least 9 months in advance. Pre-Cana and FOCCUS registrations must be arranged. Pre-Cana at St. Aidan consists of a ONE DAY SATURDAY COURSE. The moderator is Deacon Rudy Martin (917) 952-6521. Email: Dcrudy@Staidanparish.org.

# What's Pastor Thinking

This weekend we are thrilled to welcome a first class relic of Blessed Carlo Acutis and


an exposition designed and created by him at ST AIDAN PARISH MSGR KIRWIN HALL. Carlo Acutis, a Catholic Italian teenager who died in 2006, was beatified Oct. 10, 2020 in Assisi. You can visit on SATURDAY, SEPTEMBER. 23RD FROM 11 AM TO 4 PM AND ON SUNDAY SEPTEMBER. 24TH FROM 8 AM TO 2 PM. This exposition is presented by the Corpus Christi Council #2502 Knights of Columbus.

So who was Carlo Acutis?

- Carlo, a gamer and computer programmer who loved soccer and the Eucharist, gained interest around the world. He was born May 3, 1991, in London, where his parents were working. Just a few months later, his parents, Andrea Acutis and Antonia Salzano, moved to Milan.
- special love for God, even though his parents weren't especially devout. His mom said that before Carlo, she went to Mass only for her First Communion, her confirmation, and her wedding. But as a young child, Carlo loved to pray the rosary. After he made his First Communion, he went to Mass as often as he could, and he made Holy Hours before or after Mass. He went to confession weekly. He asked his parents to take him on pilgrimages to the places of the saints, and to the sites of Eucharistic miracles.
- His witness of faith led to a deep conversion in his mom, because, according to the priest promoting his cause for sainthood, he "managed to drag his relatives, his parents to Mass every day. It was not the other way around; it was not his parents bringing the little boy to Mass, but it was he who managed to get himself to Mass and to convince others to receive Communion daily."
- He was known for defending kids at school who got picked on, especially disabled kids. When a friend's parents were getting a divorce, Carlo made a special effort to include his friend in the Acutis family life.



- He was also a programmer, and built a website cataloguing and promoting Eucharistic miracles. On the site, he told people that "the more often we receive the Eucharist, the more we will become like Jesus, so that on this earth we will have a foretaste of heaven."
- Carlo loved playing video games. His console of choice was a Playstation, or possibly a PS2, which was released in 2000, when Carlo was nine. We know he only allowed himself to play games for an hour a week, as a penance and a spiritual discipline, but he wanted to play much more.
- As a teenager, Carlo was diagnosed with leukemia. He offered his sufferings for Pope Benedict XVI and for the Church, saying ""I offer all the suffering I will have to suffer for the Lord, for the Pope, and the Church." He died on Oct. 12, 2006, and was buried in Assisi, at his request, because of his love for St. Francis of Assisi. His cause for canonization began in 2013. He was designated "Venerable" in 2018, and was designated "Blessed" October 10, 2020.



Those who insist there is no problem with America's religious liberty are uninformed and unaware of the daily encroachments and denials of 1st Amendment rights to follow the faith of one's choice, not beliefs chosen by government, and to live and exercise that faith openly free from government restraint. # LITURGY COLUMN

As we saw last week, Jesus changed everything. He would become the ultimate sin offering and tell us that we must eat His flesh sacrificed for our sins, in order to have the life He promised us. In order for us to do as He said, the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist has been a core belief of the Church from the earliest days. As noted in our discussions in prior weeks, this is based on the fact that all four New Testament references to the Last Supper and the institution of the Eucharist use the same words from Jesus: "This is my body... this is my blood", so we have His flesh to eat. And that was the original traditional oral belief held as the Church evolved. But while there were some people who did not believe, there does not seem to have been much debate among the early Church fathers; rather many early leaders clearly expressed the belief in writing. The Didache, which dates to the early 100s and is the earliest known Church document outside of the New Testament to speak of the Eucharist says "Let no one eat or drink of your Eucharist, unless they have been baptized into the name of the Lord; for concerning this also the Lord has said, 'Give not that which is holy to the dogs'." While this doesn't specifically say that the Eucharist is the Body and Blood of Christ, it does speak to the reverence with which it was to be treated. The Didache is sort of an early combination catechism and missal whose author or authors are unknown. But individual leaders also wrote about the Eucharist. At roughly the same time as the Didache was written, St. Ignatius of Antioch wrote "I desire the bread of God, the heavenly bread, the bread of life, which is the flesh of Jesus Christ, the Son of God, who became afterwards of the seed of David and Abraham; and I desire the drink of God, namely His blood, which is incorruptible

love and eternal life." Concerning those who did not share his faith, he warned the Christians of Smyrna to "stand aloof from such heretics", because, among other reasons, "they abstain from the Eucharist and from prayer, because they confess not the Eucharist to be the flesh of our Saviour Jesus Christ, which suffered for our sins, and which the Father, of His goodness, raised up again." Note why they were heretics: they did not accept the Eucharist as the Body of Christ.

In about 150, St. Justin Martyr wrote about the Eucharist, describing it in these words "Not as common bread and common drink do we receive these; but in like manner as Jesus Christ our Savior, having been made flesh by the Word of God, had both flesh and blood for our salvation, so likewise have we been taught that the food which is blessed by the prayer of His word, and from which our blood and flesh by transmutation are nourished, is the flesh and blood of that Jesus who was made flesh."

Later, the Apostolic Constitutions (circa 375-380), a series of eight books on Early Christian discipline, worship, and doctrine, which serve as a manual of guidance for the clergy, and to some extent for the laity says: "Let the bishop give the oblation, saying, The body of Christ; and let him that receiveth say, Amen. And let the deacon take the cup; and when he gives it, say, The blood of Christ, the cup of life; and let him that drinketh say, Amen." The word "amen" comes from a Hebrew word meaning "to be trusted", which in the Greek biblical translation became "so be it", so this attestation literally confirmed the communicant's belief in the presence of the Body and Blood of Christ in the Eucharist.

Furthermore, around the same time, St. Ambrose of Milan wrote: "Perhaps you will say, "I see something else, how is it that you assert that I receive the Body of Christ?" ... Let us prove that this is not

what nature made, but what the blessing consecrated, and the power of blessing is greater than that of nature, because by blessing nature itself is changed. ... For that sacrament which you receive is made what it is by the word of Christ. But if the word of Elijah had such power as to bring down fire from heaven, shall not the word of Christ have power to change the nature of the elements? ... Why do you seek the order of nature in the Body of Christ, seeing that the Lord Jesus Himself was born of a Virgin, not according to nature? It is the true Flesh of Christ which was crucified and buried, this is then truly the Sacrament of His Body. The Lord Jesus Himself proclaims: "This Is My Body." Before the blessing of the heavenly words another nature is spoken of, after the consecration the Body is signified. He Himself speaks of His Blood. Before the consecration it has another name, after it is called Blood. And you say, Amen, that is, it is true. Let the heart within confess what the mouth utters, let the soul feel what the voice speaks." St. Ambrose expresses what later theologians will address further: do not be misled by what your eyes see. Rather trust the word of God and what your faith and soul perceive.

St. Augustine, who was taught by St. Ambrose, reinforced this belief that only the bread consecrated in the Eucharist actually becomes the Body of Christ: "The faithful know what I'm talking about; they know Christ in the breaking of bread. It isn't every loaf of bread, you see, but the one receiving Christ's blessing, that becomes the body of Christ." It is, then, a special bread, the bread of life, which becomes what Jesus told us we must consume.

So, clearly, the belief in the Real Presence of the body and blood of Christ in the Eucharist goes back to the beginning of the Church. Next week we will see how this developed further over the years.

This week, talk with children asking them how they can build God's Kingdom? As a family, try to reflect on all the blessings each family member has received. Go one step further by helping younger children draw or list the things they have received from God and talk about how these gifts may be used to help others. Decide using different scenarios that naturally come up during the week how Jesus would want us to deal with the situations. This is great for both adults and children because it will help us grow in the mindset of Christ so we can become more like Him.

St. Pope John Paul II calls us to become more like Jesus in his writing particularly to America, Ecclesia in America, by saying, "Christians must continually learn to think as God does. This is not something that happens automatically by virtue of Baptism. We must be catechized throughout our lives to continue to understand how to embrace Christ." (EIA, 69) At any age, our mission is to PRACTICE, PRACTICE, PRACTICE, becoming like our model, Jesus Christ!






