Daily Mass can be viewed on staidanparish.org, Facebook and Vimeo. The faithful are required to attend Sunday and Holy Days of Obligation Masses. This obligation does not apply to those who are ill, those who are confined to their home, a hospital, or nursing facility, or those

with serious underlying health conditions. For the safety of all, the church doors will be closed when school children attend services during the week.

PARKING AT ST. AIDAN

The number of parking spaces is limited at St. Aidan. The parking lot at the rear of the Upper School and the one on Dover Street are available on weekends and when school is closed. The Lower School has an area that is designated a children's play area. People with disabilities may park in the three reserved parking spaces in front of the rectory on Willis Ave. This special area is needed for church access by people who use wheelchairs and specially-equipped vehicles. Thank you for being parking considerate.

BAPTISM

To arrange a baptism contact the rectory office. Forms need to be completed giving information on the parents, child's date and place of birth, as well as the names and religious affiliation of the sponsors. At least one sponsor must be a practicing Catholic. Baptisms are held on the 1st Sunday and 3rd Sunday at 1:30 PM. To hold a private baptism you must make arrangements with a priest or deacon to perform the baptism. Private baptisms are held on Saturday or Sunday when the church is available. First time parents are required to attend a Baptism Class. Classes are held in the church on the second Sunday of the month after the 12 PM Mass. Parents are asked to gather at St. Joseph's statue to the right of the altar.

EUCHARISTIC ADORATION

First and Third Fridays of the month 1:00-3:00 PM in the church.

RECEIVING HOLY COMMUNION

Holy Communion unites us more closely to Jesus, and it is also a sign that we are living in communion with His Church, following the teachings that Jesus has handed down to us. If you know of someone homebound who would

like to receive Communion from a Eucharistic Minister, please contact the Rectory.

CONFESSION

Confessions are available in the church, screen only, on Saturday from 12:30 PM to 1:30 PM and 4:00 PM to 5:00 PM. You can also make an appointment with a priest by calling the rectory office.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

Anointing of the sick takes place at 1:00 PM on the 4th Sunday of each month. Please wait for the priest at Our Lady's Shrine.

MARRIAGE

Arrangements are to be made at the Rectory office at least 9 months in advance. Pre-Cana and FOCCUS registrations must be arranged. Pre-Cana at St. Aidan consists of a ONE DAY SATURDAY COURSE. The moderator is Deacon Rudy Martin (917) 952-6521. Email: Dcrudy@Staidanparish.org.

What's Pastor Thinking


I listened to a political discussion recently about the Catholic faith of a well known politician. The person was

described as 'Catholic-lite.' That's an interesting phrase for usually the word 'lite' is associated with brands of beer that are light on calories or low in alcohol content. In this case it was used to describe this politician who identifies as Catholic, but who is not faithful to Church teaching on abortion.

While abortion has been one of the most divisive issues in America, the Church's position is very clear. In the document DONUM VITAE (The Gift of Life) the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith affirmed that: 'The human being is to be respected and treated as a person from the moment of conception; and therefore from that same moment his rights as a person must be recognized, among which in the first place is the inviolable right of every innocent human being to life. (Sec I.1). Direct abortion, or the intentional killing of a human being living in the womb, is always seriously immoral because as persons the right-to-life is the most basic and fundamental right we possess.

So how does the church arrive at such a position? Well Catholics believe that the saving truth of God is encountered in Scripture and in the lived faith of the community, which we call tradition. Whether we like it or not, there are rules and laws. Human nature being what it is, we don't seem to be able to function without them. God found laws were necessary, or rather that the people of Israel made them necessary, and so he gave the ten commandments as a set of guidelines for living out a faith relationship. The Church has done the same thing through its precepts. We can't start deciding for ourselves which Church teachings we will abide by, and which we won't, because we don't have that authority. Being a follower of Christ isn't a buffet from which we can pick and choose. If we sign up to be a Catholic, it's for the whole thing. What is lacking in 'Catholic-lite' people is respect for the church's authority. They treat the Church and its God-given teaching authority, the same way they treat authority in general. The Church is the Body of Christ. When we choose to ignore, or even to reject, certain aspects of Church teaching, we are excommunicating ourselves, separating ourselves, from

the Body. In some cases we may be excluding ourselves from receiving Holy Communion because the actions resulting from our choices may be seriously sinful. So being 'Catholic-lite' isn't an option because we don't have the authority. The real authority is Jesus Christ. He delegated His teaching authority to the Church. The Church is place where humanity rediscovers salvation, which was Our Lord's intention in founding it. Let us pray for the courage to continue to share His Good News with the world. Here is a prayer for Respect Life Month. Heavenly Father, the beauty and dignity of human life was the crowning of your creation. You further ennobled that life when your Son became one with us in his incarnation. Help us to realize the sacredness of human life and to respect it from the moment of conception until the last moment at death. Give us courage to speak with truth and love and with conviction in defense of life. Help us to extend the gentle hand of mercy and forgiveness to those who do not reverence your gift of life. To all, grant pardon for the times we have failed to be grateful for your precious gift of life or to respect it in others. We ask this through Christ Our Lord. Amen.

- Through participating in CLASS, attending MASS and making our lives an act of SERVICE to others, we become alive in Christ.


ACTS OF SERVICE FOR CONFIRMATION

September 2023: Pro Life Activists Convicted and Immediately Imprisoned

In Oct. 2020 nine pro-life activists participated in a "rescue" they believed could prevent the taking of innocent lives at an abortion clinic in Washington, D.C. This abortion clinic was shown in a 2013 undercover film taken by the pro-life group, Live Action. During that video an abortionist states that if a baby survives the abortion, and that some had, there would be no medical care provided and that the child would soon expire.

The Born-Alive Infants Protection Act was signed into law in August of 2002. It says from the point of birth forward a child who is born alive is to have the care that any child born at that gestational age would have as well as the same rights as any child.

A year and a half after the "rescue", with predawn raids, the nine were arrested and charged under the FACE Act (Freedom of Access to Clinic Entrances) plus a civil rights conspiracy charge. A FACE Act conviction calls for a maximum one-year prison term. A conspiracy conviction carries up to ten years in prison and fines up to \$350,000. At September 2023 trials in Washington D.C. eight activists were convicted of both charges. One had pleaded guilty. The actions of the activists inside the clinic, recorded on a security video, were shown during the trial on behalf of the prosecution. According to many who saw it that video

showed the only violence was from clinic workers pushing and hitting the activists with a broom stick. Nevertheless, the judge stated that this was a crime of violence and, in a highly unusual action, instructed that all defendants be immediately incarcerated even before any sentence had been decided. LITURGY COLUMN

The early Church Fathers clearly believed in and promulgated the belief in the Real Presence of the body and blood of Christ in the Eucharist. But it was still hard to explain why what was perceived by the senses and what was perceived by faith were different. So several centuries later, this led to further debate, including some doubt about the Real Presence. In the 9th century, Charles the Bald, who was a grandson of Charlemagne and had become king of parts of what is now France and Italy by virtue of both political and military operations, decided to indulge in theological speculation about the nature of the Eucharist. He asked whether the faithful receive the body of Christ in mystery or in truth and whether that body was the same as that which was born of Mary and died on the cross. He really asked two questions. The first concerns the nature of the Eucharist: is it "truth", that is, something we can perceive with our senses, or is it "mystery", something beyond what our senses can perceive. The second question depends upon the answer to the first one. If it is a mystery, is it the body that hung on the cross. This reopened the same debate that the Church Fathers had decided hundreds of years before, but was now influenced by philosophical and scientific concerns besides the theological issue.

With various opinions being offered, the debate centered around "in truth" meaning simply "what is perceptible to the senses", as opposed to the "mystery" inherent in the Ambrosian teaching. This led to the concept that since the consecration left the bread and wine unchanged in their outward appearance, they were merely signs of the body and blood of Christ. Hence the faithful receive the body of Christ not "in veritate", truth, but "in figura, in mysterio, in virtute", figure, mystery, power. While this did probably did not affect the majority of the recipients of the Eucharist, it did open a can of worms for the Church itself. The debate was not

decided, but sort of calmed down for the next few centuries until the issue of the true nature of the Eucharist arose again in the 11th century, when a French theologian and archdeacon named Berengar of Tours denied that any material change in the elements was needed to explain the Eucharistic presence. This caused a controversy which led to the explicit clarification of the Catholic doctrine of the Eucharist as one result of one of the most important events in the history of the Church, the Fourth Council of the Lateran or Lateran IV. which was called together by Pope Innocent III in April 1213 but didn't actually convene until November 1215. This gave many bishops the opportunity to both prepare for and travel to Rome to attend this council. It addressed a number of issues, including the sacraments, the role of the laity, the treatment of heretics, and the organization of the church. Does any of this sound familiar today?

Lateran IV had three objectives: crusading, Church reform, and combating heresy. We can ignore the first concern, but the other two resulted in a significant codification of much that we take for granted today in the way the Church functions and in many of our beliefs. The end result was seventy-one Lateran canons, or laws, which were only formally adopted on the last day of the council. They were probably drafted by Pope Innocent III himself. They cover a range of themes including Church reform and elections, taxation, matrimony, tithing, and Judaism. After being officially recorded in the papal registers, the canons were quickly promulgated to the church and other law offices. For the purposes of our review of the Real Presence, it is the first of these canons which is important. Canon 1 (De fide catholica, or On the catholic faith) infallibly defined the teaching of the Catholic Church concerning the doctrine of transubstantiation in very precise terms, describing how the bread and wine offered in the Eucharist becomes the actual blood and body of Christ. As far as the Catholic Church is concerned, this ended the debate on the Real Presence, among other things. But next week we will see how further definition was achieved and how that can of worms was still there.



CONNECTING CHURCH AND HOME:

Today is the Twenty-Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time. The liturgical color is green.

Today's Gospel, (Matthew 21:28-32), begins with Jesus trying to make an important point to the Jewish elders who questioned Jesus' authority. Jesus then tells a parable unique to Matthew's gospel. The story, set in a vineyard, is about a father who had two sons. He asked the first son to work in the vineyard. At first, he refused but

then decided to obey his father. The second son immediately said Yes to the father, but then did not go. Jesus asked the elders who followed the father's will. Of course, the first son!

Two common sayings can sum-up today's gospel. "Say what you mean and mean what you say" and "Actions speak louder than words." The Catechism of the Catholic Church tells us, "We are called to humble ourselves, as Jesus did that we may cooperate with God's grace and glorify God. We are justified through faith in Jesus Christ, through whom we are granted the grace of obedience to the will of the Father." (CCC, 1989-91)


We are called to be humble and seek to do not our own will but God's Will for us. This comes

about through prayer AND good actions. So, being a Catholic means growing throughout our lives in faith, prayer, and good works so that we can walk securely on the path that leads us to God. Children are not too young to begin!

young to begin!
This week, teach children the phrase, "Jesus, help me (us) to follow You!" Each time that phrase is repeated, encourage children to come up with a "following idea." An example would be when we would rather watch TV instead of helping our parents. It's amazing to hear all the examples children of all ages can come up with once they get the idea! Make an "I Will" tree out of construction paper. Cut out leaves and roots. On the leaves,

children can write or draw some things they can do to say Yes to God's Will. On the roots, they can write or draw what they will need to do to accomplish the intentions on the leaves. This activity works better with school-age children but parents can scribe for little ones and little children can put their own personal touch on the leaves. Hopefully over some time, the "I Will" tree will become the "The Tree of Good Works." Help children reflect each day or their actions. This is a great bedtime activity. Taking a personal inventory of one's actions throughout the day is an ancient practice in the Church that is still strongly encouraged for all ages and stages of life.
