THE CHURCH IS OPEN 6 AM TO 6 PM

Daily Mass can be viewed on staidanparish.org, Facebook and Vimeo. The faithful are required to attend Sunday and Holy Days of Obligation Masses. This obligation does not apply to those who are ill, those who are confined to their home, a hospital, or nursing facility, or those

with serious underlying health conditions. For the safety of all, the church doors will be closed when school children attend services during the week.

PARKING AT ST. AIDAN

The number of parking spaces is limited at St. Aidan. The parking lot at the rear of the Upper School and the one on Dover Street are available on weekends and when school is closed. The Lower School has an area that is designated a children's play area. People with disabilities may park in the three reserved parking spaces in front of the rectory on Willis Ave. This special area is needed for church access by people who use wheelchairs and specially-equipped vehicles. Thank you for being parking considerate.

BAPTISM

To arrange a baptism contact the rectory office. Forms need to be completed giving information on the parents, child's date and place of birth, as well as the names and religious affiliation of the sponsors. At least one sponsor must be a practicing Catholic. Baptisms are held on the 1st Sunday and 3rd Sunday at 1:30 PM. To hold a private baptism you must make arrangements with a priest or deacon to perform the baptism. Private baptisms are held on Saturday or Sunday when the church is available. First time parents are required to attend a Baptism Class. Classes are held in the church on the second Sunday of the month after the 12 PM Mass. Parents are asked to gather at St. Joseph's statue to the right of the altar.

EUCHARISTIC ADORATION

First and Third Fridays of the month 1:00-3:00 PM in the church.

RECEIVING HOLY COMMUNION

Holy Communion unites us more closely to Jesus, and it is also a sign that we are living in communion with His Church, following the teachings that Jesus has handed down to us. If you know of someone homebound who would

like to receive Communion from a Eucharistic Minister, please contact the Rectory.

CONFESSION

Confessions are available in the church, screen only, on Saturday from 12:30 PM to 1:30 PM and 4:00 PM to 5:00 PM. You can also make an appointment with a priest by calling the rectory office.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

Anointing of the sick takes place at 1:00 PM on the 4th Sunday of each month. Please wait for the priest at Our Lady's Shrine.

MARRIAGE

Arrangements are to be made at the Rectory office at least 9 months in advance. Pre-Cana and FOCCUS registrations must be arranged. Pre-Cana at St. Aidan consists of a ONE DAY SATURDAY COURSE. The moderator is Deacon Rudy Martin (917) 952-6521. Email: Dcrudy@Staidanparish.org.

What's Pastor Thinking

Today's story is of vineyards and tenants; of treachery and betrayal; of murder and mayhem! It's the second

in a series of three parables Jesus told to the chief priests and elders in the Temple in Jerusalem just days before His arrest and crucifixion. He was calling the priests and elders to account for their stewardship of the "vineyard" God had given to them - their stewardship as the leaders of the chosen people of Israel. He then gives the final warning to them: 'Therefore, I say to you, the kingdom of God will be taken away from you and given to people that will produce its fruit.'

how like the son in the parable He was soon to be killed. Killed for the message He preached: the


challenge He issued to those in charge. So they rejected Him. Not a pretty story, is it? But an all too human one.


We live in a time when many have rejected their faith, some quite openly, while many others seem quietly to have minimized their faith in Jesus and in His Church. One reason is that Jesus does make extraordinary claims, and heavy claims on us. He calls us to believe that He is the Son of God in the flesh. People reject Jesus because He says things they do not want to hear. Their minds are formed by the relativism of our culture and so numbers of people refuse to consider what Jesus is saying, and they end up wanting to do away with Him and His Church. Today we pray for those in public life who are attacked because of their Catholic faith. Hostility against Catholics is channeled through the media, and normally only against Catholics who defend their church's teachings on the dignity of life and the sanctity of marriage. On the other hand those public representatives and politicians who claim 'I am Catholic,' but do not promote Catholic values, get praised in

the media for their duplicity!

We must pray daily for those courageous individuals who promote Catholic values in the public square. When our faith is attacked, and our values undermined, may we be strengthened by God's grace. May we always believe in Him as our truth, and then we will rejoice forever in the truth.

A PRAYER FOR LIFE: Father and maker of all, you adorn all creation with splendor and beauty, and fashion human lives in your image and likeness. Awaken in every heart reverence for the work of your hands, and renew among your people a readiness to nurture and sustain your precious gift of life. Grant this We know what happens next, how they arrest Him, and through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God forever and ever. Amen



America's Public Schools are not God-Free Zones Guidance on Constitutionally Protected Prayer and Religious Expression in Public Elementary and Secondary Schools: May 15, 2023

With the new school year well underway, this is a good time for parents, teachers and public-school students to review the rights of students to live their faith in many ways throughout their school days as set forth by the U.S. Department of Education.

The Students of Faith program, explained under the link to "School Prayer" on the website of Catholics for Freedom of Religion (cffor.org), has been used to teach thousands of students their protected rights to exercise their faith throughout the many hundreds of days they will spend in our public schools.

As long as the prayer is student-initiated, student-led and non-disruptive students may pray alone or with other students at many non-instructional times throughout the school day.

If other non-curricular clubs are allowed, students may form prayer groups and religious clubs and advertise their meetings and events as do the other clubs.

Teachers, administrators, and other school employees may not encourage or discourage private prayer or other religious activities. Students may wear clothing and jewelry with religious messages to the same extent other non-religious messages are permitted.

Students have many other opportunities to practice their faith in public schools as put forth in the Dept of Education document linked below.

Although the Constitution forbids public school officials acting in their official capacities from directing or favoring prayer, students and teachers do not "shed their constitutional rights to freedom of speech or expression at the schoolhouse gate". LITURGY COLUMN

As far as the Christian faith was concerned, by 1215, the Fourth Council of the Lateran had defined the doctrine of the Real Presence of the body and blood of Christ under the physical appearance of bread and wine in the Eucharist. And this remains a core belief of the Catholic Church. But it still needed more definition to explain how this could be so, at least in part, because at roughly the same time, Europe was rediscovering some of the philosophy and science of the classical Greeks and began to apply this to their understanding not only of the world, but also theology. Scholars refer to this as scholasticism. It was first taken up by medieval Christian thinkers attempting to address issues within their own tradition, as well as to reconcile Christian theology with classical philosophy and science. It used Aristotelian principles as a method of learning, relying on dialectical reasoning to extend knowledge and to resolve contradictions. Think of it sort of as an author or speaker presenting both sides of a debate with all their pros and cons, arguing them all out in extended discussions, and then arriving at a conclusion. Many scholars over several centuries followed these principles, but one of the earliest, and most influential, was St. Thomas Aquinas (1225 - 1274). He is a Doctor of the Church and a very prolific author and composer. Among other things, he wrote O Salutaris Hostia and Tantum Ergo (actually the last part of Pange Lingua) which we sing at Benediction. But his major work is Summa Theologica, which has influenced western thought and the Catholic Church for centuries. Among other topics, Summa Theologica addressed transubstantiation. To briefly summarize parts of a very long and complex document,

according to Thomas, faith and reason should complement rather than contradict each other, each giving different views of the same truth. Any discrepancy between them stems from a problem either with lack scientific knowledge or scriptural misinterpretation. Faith can reveal a divine mystery that cannot be addressed by scientific observation, but science can suggest instances where fallible human beings misinterpret a scriptural metaphor as a literal statement of fact. He then applied principles of Aristotelean logic to address many theological issues with this understanding. He used Aristotle's distinction between what scholastics called "substance", that is, what a thing is, what we can see, those characteristics or qualities which a thing must have to be what it is and will have as long as it is that thing, (e.g. a human being is a rational mortal animal), as opposed to those they called "accidents", those qualities which may belong to a thing but are not features which define it or must belong to it (e.g. brown skin, gray hair, laughing, things which a human being may have or do, but are not what makes them human). With regard to the Eucharist, Aquinas added a second important concept: sacrifice requires the destruction or physical modification of what is offered (animals are killed, bread is broken), which alter it, making it something different than what it had been before it was sacrificed or broken, and, therefore, useless for its previous purposes. There is much more to his very elaborate discussion of the pros and cons, but his conclusion was that when the bread and wine are consecrated at Mass, that is, when they are broken and specifically affected by the words which explicitly define the change declared in Christ's institution of the Eucharist, they become useless for their original purpose as then by divine power there occurs a transubstantiation, a complete conversion and total change of "substance" (what a thing is), so that the bread and wine become wholly the body and blood of Christ, and are no longer bread and wine, even though they may continue to have the outward appearance of bread and wine the "accidents" (qualities which are not essential to their substance). Therefore, "The complete substance of the bread is converted into the complete substance of Christ's body, and the complete substance of the wine into the complete substance of Christ's blood". This, essentially, is what has come down to us today and was the accepted Christian understanding at the time. And it has fully addressed the issue for Catholics, but what about other Christians? Scholasticism and Aquinas worked for some, but not all Christians. Next week we will see some of the results of that.

CONNECTING CHURCH AND HOME: Today is the Twenty-Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time. The liturgical color is green.

Today's Gospel, (Matthew 21:33-43), is again set in a vineyard. Although vineyards still exist today, vineyards in Jesus' time had multiple meanings. Vineyards were used as metaphors for God's provision and protection of His people. The owner of an actual vineyard would clear the land, fence it in to protect the vineyard from human and animal intruders, build a wine press, and construct a tower in the center to view the surrounding terrain again for protection. In this vineyard parable, Jesus describes a vineyard owner who then entrusts his vineyard to tenants. These tenants would care for and harvest the crops. At the end of the growing season, the vinevard owner would return to receive his portion of the fruits of the tenants' work. In this case, the servants or messengers sent by the landowner were all killed by the tenants, who wanted to keep

everything for themselves. As a last resort, the landowner sends his own son thinking that the tenants would certainly not harm him, but instead, his son is also killed. God sent His Son to serve the very people who rejected Him. Jesus paid the ultimate sacrifice giving His life for us. He serves as a model for us to understand that we must work in God's Kingdom to bring about justice and goodness. Many times, that comes at a substantial price!

This story calls us to accountability for our own actions. St. John Paul II tells us that through our Baptism, we are all branches of Christ, who is the true vine. Baptism grafts us to Christ and from Him we have life, and that life calls us to produce good fruit that

is shared with others. Children are able as is age appropriate to grow in understanding that they can actively bear the good fruit we are called to produce in their everyday circumstances. Like most things we learn, it is a gradual process that can expand over time and with repetition. Starting realistic and small is the key.

This week, older children can learn about the purpose of a resume, which is expected when someone is looking for a job. A resume usually lists a person's work experience, education, skills, special accomplishments, activities, and interests. Ask them to imagine they were seeking to hire workers for God's vineyard. What qualifications would they look for if they were responsible for finding these workers? Who would be a good fit for the job? What skills and talents would they look for? Then ask them to assess their own qualifications. It makes for an interesting discussion. School age children can be introduced to some of the Fruits of the Holy Spirit. Some of the easier ones for younger children are love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, and generosity. Cut out some

paper leaves in Fall colors and ask them to draw or write about how they have or will try to practice some of these fruits. Display the paper leaves proudly during the week. For young children, have them trace their shoes and cut out their footprints. The children can use their creative talents to decorate their footprints while talking about how they can walk in Jesus' footsteps by doing good things. Some easy ideas to suggest to them would be saying a special prayer for a family member or friend who may be sick or sad, or helping with an extra chore in the house. It doesn't have to be fancy! Most young children want to feel they are participating in the activities
