THE CHURCH IS OPEN 6 AM TO 6 PM

Daily Mass can be viewed on staidanparish.org, Facebook and Vimeo. The faithful are required to attend Sunday and Holy Days of Obligation Masses. This obligation does not apply to those who are ill, those who are confined to their home, a hospital, or nursing facility, or those

with serious underlying health conditions. For the safety of all, the church doors will be closed when school children attend services during the week.

PARKING AT ST. AIDAN

The number of parking spaces is limited at St. Aidan. The parking lot at the rear of the Upper School and the one on Dover Street are available on weekends and when school is closed. The Lower School has an area that is designated a children's play area. People with disabilities may park in the three reserved parking spaces in front of the rectory on Willis Ave. This special area is needed for church access by people who use wheelchairs and specially-equipped vehicles. Thank you for being parking considerate.

BAPTISM

To arrange a baptism contact the rectory office. Forms need to be completed giving information on the parents, child's date and place of birth, as well as the names and religious affiliation of the sponsors. At least one sponsor must be a practicing Catholic. Baptisms are held on the 1st Sunday and 3rd Sunday at 1:30 PM. To hold a private baptism you must make arrangements with a priest or deacon to perform the baptism. Private baptisms are held on Saturday or Sunday when the church is available. First time parents are required to attend a Baptism Class. Classes are held in the church on the second Sunday of the month after the 12 PM Mass. Parents are asked to gather at St. Joseph's statue to the right of the altar.

EUCHARISTIC ADORATION

First and Third Fridays of the month 1:00-3:00 PM in the church.

RECEIVING HOLY COMMUNION

Holy Communion unites us more closely to Jesus, and it is also a sign that we are living in communion with His Church, following the teachings that Jesus has handed down to us. If you know of someone homebound who would

like to receive Communion from a Eucharistic Minister, please contact the Rectory.

CONFESSION

Confessions are available in the church, screen only, on Saturday from 12:30 PM to 1:30 PM and 4:00 PM to 5:00 PM. You can also make an appointment with a priest by calling the rectory office.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

Anointing of the sick takes place at 1:00 PM on the 4th Sunday of each month. Please wait for the priest at Our Lady's Shrine.

MARRIAGE

Arrangements are to be made at the Rectory office at least 9 months in advance. Pre-Cana and FOCCUS registrations must be arranged. Pre-Cana at St. Aidan consists of a ONE DAY SATURDAY COURSE. The moderator is Deacon Rudy Martin (917) 952-6521. Email: Dcrudy@Staidanparish.org.

What's Pastor Thinking

It's said that lawyers never ask a question unless they already know the answer. In today's gospel John

the Baptist is attempting to answer the questions of the Levites, priests and Pharisees. 'Are you the Christ? Are you Elijah? Are you the prophet?' (Jn 1:21). None of those questions really allow him to say who he is. No one label can ever describe any of us. We are too complex; we fill too many roles; who any of us is cannot be captured in one sentence, let alone one word! And that is no less true of John the Baptist.

What is clear is that John the Baptist serves as an introduction to the story of Jesus. What is also clear is that we are now in the role of John the Baptist today. We are the ones who are to prepare the way of the Lord. We are the ones who can look around and see that Christ is among us even though others may not recognize Him in our midst. We are the ones to keep Christ alive in a world that continues to reject Him.

As we approach Christmas 2023, that role is even more important to fulfill. It is made difficult by a society that has buried the story of Christmas in the activity of shopping and shoppers and insists on wishing you 'Happy Holidays.'

It is made more difficult in a society that raised a generation without church in secular households free

from religious input. And while we all dread another unending world war in the Middle East, these times of uncertainty can be used by God to make us reflect more on our vulnerability and to search for meaning in our lives. Right now people may be more open than ever to hear the story of Jesus. They may be more willing to listen to our testimony of a God who embraced the vulnerability of human life, and although rejected by the world again and again, has not given up on us. And that's where you come in. It's easy to become cynical at this time of the year. It's easy to point out the ways people around us have missed the point of the story. To be disappointed by family members who are indifferent or who say they are Catholic but don't understand representatives and church leaders who present a dim version of Catholicism. Our role, like that of John the Baptist, is to look at how we might be able to retell the story to our world today - to our friends and neighbors, to our family and strangers. John came to point toward Jesus as the answer to their questions, the one who could offer them eternal life. When we realize that John the Baptist is merely a witness to Christ, it becomes clear that his role is our role. We have a duty and an obligation to bear witness to the same Christ who lives among us.

CHRISTMAS WAFERS (\$1.00) AVAILABLE IN THE RECTORY OFFICE

Christmas wafer is a popular, family-centered Christmas It can also be tradition enjoyed by families from Eastern Europe. The tradition originated in Poland and is traced to the early forgiveness centuries of Christianity. This Christmas custom began with a simple white wafer baked from flour and water. Today, Christmas wafers are very thin with a look and

feel not unlike a communion host. Each wafer is into them, such as the Nativity, the Star of Bethlehem, or the Holy Family. The tradition is observed by families with a Polish, Slovak or Lithuanian background. The word "Bethlehem" means "House of Bread." The breaking of bread has long been a sign of charity, unity, and friendship in many cultures. The Christmas Wafer reminds us of this symbol of communion common to humanity, as well as in a fuller way the Eucharistic meal that Catholics participate in at each Mass. Just as Christians share in the Eucharist as one family in Christ, the Christmas wafer allows for one's family to come together and share the love they have for one another. Just before the Christmas Eve meal the entire family will gather around the table with the Christmas wafer. Generally the eldest member of the family, usually the father or mother, will begin the ritual by breaking off a piece of the wafer and passing it to another family member while giving a blessing. This blessing can simply consist of what you desire for your loved one in the

upcoming
year whether it be
good health,
growth in
God's grace,
or happiness.
It can also be
a request for
forgiveness
and a desire
for



reconciliation. The Christmas wafer is then passed from person to person around the table until all have had a piece and all have been given blessings. Each person then consumes their piece of the wafer in a special display of love and solidarity between the whole family. The purpose of this act is primarily to celebrate the Christmas spirit: peace, love, joy, and goodwill.

ARE YOU SEARCHING?

Are you searching for a faith to follow? Do you know someone who may be interested in learning more about what the Catholic Church believes and teaches? Were you baptized as an infant but not raised in the faith or raised in another Christian faith? Whatever your situation, wherever you are in your faith journey, OCIA (formally RCIA) is here for YOU. OCIA stands for Order of Christian Initiation for Adults. It is a process by which adults can inquire about the Catholic Church. There is never any pressure put on any inquirer to become a Catholic. If an inquirer or seeker decides to move closer toward becoming a Catholic, he/she receives instruction in a small setting guided by a team of dedicated parishioners. The inquirer decides if he/she wants to move forward one step at a time. The whole parish family supports this process through prayer and witness. Those who choose to become Catholic are welcomed into the Church through the reception of the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist. 



- 1. Public school students' written or spoken personal expressions concerning the religious significance of Christmas (e.g., T-shirts with the slogan, "Jesus Is the Reason for the Season") may not be censored by school officials absent evidence that the speech would cause a substantial disruption.
- 2. So long as teachers are generally permitted to wear clothing or jewelry or have personal items expressing their views about the holidays, Christian teachers may not be prohibited from similarly expressing their views by wearing Christmas-related clothing or jewelry or carrying Christmas-related personal items.
- 3. Public schools may teach students about the Christmas holiday, including its religious significance, so long as it is taught objectively for secular purposes such as its historical or cultural importance, and not for the purpose of promoting Christianity.
- 4. Public school teachers may send Christmas cards to the families of their students so long as they do so on their own time, outside of school hours.
- 5. Public schools may include Christmas music. including those with religious themes, in their choral programs if the songs are included for a secular purpose such as their musical quality or cultural value or if the songs are part of an overall performance including other holiday songs relating to Chanukah, Kwanzaa, or other similar holidays.

LITURGY COLUMN

Gregory of Nazianzus (c. 329 – 25 January 390) also known as Gregory Nazianzen, was a 4thcentury Archbishop of Constantinople and theologian. He is widely considered the most accomplished rhetorical writer of the patristic era, the early period of Church history when many of the great tenets of our faith were debated and formalized, and which lasted from the end of the apostolic era to the Council of Nicaea (ca.100 - 451) when many of the beliefs we now learn in early Catechism classes and profess in our prayers were formally agreed upon and set down as doctrine. He in a saint in both the Eastern and Western Churches, and besides being a Doctor of the Western Church, he is revered as one of the Three Holy Hierarchs of the Eastern Church, along with Basil the Great and John Chrysostom.

Gregory's writings had a great impact in the formulation of Trinitarian theology, the now familiar doctrine that God exists as three persons but is one being, having a single divine nature. As he explained, he members of the Trinity are co-equal and co-eternal, one in essence, nature, power, action, and will. The Father is uncreated, the Son is uncreated, and the Holy Spirit is uncreated, and all three are eternal without beginning. The Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit are not names for different parts of God, but one name for God because three persons exist in God as one entity. This was a very much disputed concept during the early days of the Church., particularly by the several sects espousing different views usually grouped together as Arianism. As St. Paul tells us, God is beyond our understanding in this life, and the debates around His nature, and the three Persons, divided both the Church and civil authorities, as we saw with St. Cyril, but which will be even more apparent as we look at St. Gregory and later St. Athanasius.

Gregory was the son of a bishop (yes, they could be married then) and was ordained a presbyter by his father's wish, to assist with caring for local Christians. At the time, Emperor Julian rejected the Christian faith and Gregory composed his Invectives Against Julian between 362 and 363in which he stated that Christianity would overcome imperfect rulers such as Julian through love and patience. This did not sit well with the emperor who, fortunately for Gregory, died fighting the Persians and the new emperor, Jovian, supported the Church. This freed up Gregory to join with St. Basil in combating Arianism, which threatened to divide the Church. In a series of debates in

Constantinople, he stressed that Jesus did not cease to be God when He became a man, nor did He lose any of his divine attributes when he took on human nature. He added that Christ was fully human, including having a fully human soul. He also proclaimed the eternal nature of the Holy Spirit, saying He was co-eternal with God. Together, he and St. Basil successfully defended their position and this established both as leaders of the Church. Soon thereafter, Gregory was ordained Bishop of Sasima in 372 by Basil. But later that year he returned to Nazianzus to assist his dying father with the administration of his diocese. In 379, the Antioch synod asked Gregory to go to Constantinople to win over that city to Nicene doctrinal unity, and he gave five powerful defenses on Nicene doctrine, concerning the nature of the Trinity and the unity of the Godhead, refuting the Eunomion denial of the Holy Spirit's divinity. As he explained the facts, "Christ is born, the Holy Spirit is His Forerunner. Christ is baptized, the Spirit bears witness to this ... Christ works miracles, the Spirit accompanies them. Christ ascends, the Spirit takes His place. What great things are there in the idea of God which are not in His power? What titles appertaining to God do not apply also to Him, except for Unbegotten and Begotten? I tremble when I think of such an abundance of titles, and how many Names they blaspheme, those who revolt against the Spirit!".

Apart from his several theological discourses, Gregory was also one of the most important early Christian men of letters, a very accomplished orator, one of the greatest of his time. Gregory was also a very prolific poet who wrote theological, moral, and biographical poems. But it is his defense of the Christian faith in Constantinople and his defense of the Holy Spirit and the Trinitarian doctrine concerning the nature of God, that constitute Gregory's most significant theological contributions to our faith's understanding of the Trinity, especially the Holy Spirit, which makes him a Doctor of the Church. Gregory was the first to use the concept of procession to describe the relationship between the Spirit and the Godhead: "The Holy Spirit is truly Spirit, coming forth from the Father indeed but not after the manner of the Son, for it is not by generation but by procession, since I must coin a word for the sake of clearness." Although he did not fully develop the concept, the idea of procession would shape most later thought about the Holy Spirit.

Gaudete is the Latin word for Rejoice, Give thanks, Glad tidings! The priests and deacons have the option to wear rose-colored vestments rather than the violet ones ordinarily worn during Advent. The more cheerful rose color reminds us that we are halfway through the Advent season of preparation for Christmas. The rose candle is lit on the Advent wreath in addition to the two previous violet

candles. Gaudete Sunday is all about joy-filled anticipation of the coming of Christ.

Today's Gospel, (John 1:6-8, 19-28),

still focuses our attention on John the

from last week. Rather than emphasizing John's role as the one whose message was completely centered on calling people to a baptism of repentance, John's gospel presents John the Baptist as actively pointing the way to Christ. Throughout this gospel, John the Baptist answers the questions of the learned skeptics who were trying to figure out exactly who he was and who was this person he was speaking about. Over and over, John the Baptist family's religious values clearly says who he is not. He describes himself as not any of the characters they were expecting such as a new Moses, or Elijah the famous prophet, or the promised One the Jews were waiting for. Instead, John humbly positions himself as one who was not worthy to even be the servant of the chosen one, sent by God, who was to follow after him.

Today's view of John the Baptist sets a heightened tone of anticipation in us because he understood what we are learning, which is that we should be reflections of the Light of Christ living in a world that contains much darkness. Our role as followers of Jesus is to do our best to walk in His footsteps and to live our lives pointing to Jesus.

Childhood is a time of growth, development, and learning. Parents work toward the goal of caring for their children throughout these developmental years so that their children will grow into responsible, productive, well-rounded adults who will then provide for the next generation of children. Life is ever

changing, and we all must be flexible and open to the changes that are necessary in our lives. Nothing in this life is static. Slowly we each need to be able to identify who we are. This gospel speaks to our understanding of who we are not only in the nitty gritty of everyday routines, tasks, and challenges, but also the spiritual dimension of our lives. When children grow-up in homes where the are nurtured and valued, they have a better

chance of growing in self-awareness of whom they are and what they are called to do. Like John the Baptist, we need to define who we are and what is God's specific plan for us.

This week, the church prays the O Antiphons, which contain the most beautiful names for the Messiah. These prayers get their name because each one begins with the word, O. Although older children can listen to and pray these prayers, younger children can learn from the description of the titles in each prayer. Some examples are a key, the sun, a crown etc. You can easily download a copy of the O Antiphons and pray one each day from now until Christmas Eve. Call attention to the pink candle in the Advent Wreath and the rose vestments in church. (There is only one other Sunday in the whole church year that rose is worn!)
